**SUMMARY ORDER**

NOW ON THIS 10<sup>th</sup> day of July, 2014, THE ABOVE MATTER COMES BEFORE THE Kansas State Board of Nursing (Board) pursuant to authority granted to the Board by K.S.A. 65-1120. The Board hereby proposed to find facts and take disciplinary action against the licensee's license by way of Summary Order as provided by K.S.A. 77-537.

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

1. This Licensee is licensed to practice nursing in the state of Kansas. The Board has jurisdiction over the Licensee and the subject matter of this action.
2. Licensee's address of record is 617 Shanandoah Drive, Edgerton, Kansas 66021.
3. After an investigation, the Board's investigative committee found reasonable grounds to believe that the Respondent violated the Kansas Nurse Practice Act, K.S.A. 65-1120, and referred this matter for further proceedings.
4. Review of the information gathered by the Board revealed the following upon which this action is based.
  - (a) According to a report, it is alleged that while licensee was employed by Life Care Center in Osawatomie, Kansas, this licensee diverted Lortab for her personal use.
  - (b) This incident occurred on or about the 31<sup>st</sup> day of March, 2014.
  - (c) Licensee admitted to the theft and was terminated from employment on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of April, 2014.
  - (d) Licensee is currently charged with theft of medication.

- (e) According to a report, it is alleged that while licensee was employed by Nottingham Health and Rehab, Olathe Kansas, licensee again diverted Oxycodone from her employer.
- (f) Licensee was terminated for diversion of drugs on the 28<sup>th</sup> day of April, 2014.
- (g) Licensee admitted to her addiction to controlled substances to control her emotional pain.
- (h) Licensee self referred to KNAP and signed a three year agreement on the 16<sup>th</sup> day of May, 2014.

5. This Licensee violate the Nurse Practice Act by unprofessional conduct by diversion of narcotics and licensee admitted that she committed this theft with both employers.

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- a K.S.A. 65 1120(a)(1) unprofessional conduct by fraud or deceit in practicing nursing.
- b. K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(6), unprofessional conduct, by inaccurately recording, falsifying or altering documents.
- c. K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(6), unprofessional conduct, by drug diversion K.A.R. 60-3-110(n) in past conduct;
- d. K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(4) unable to practice with skill and safety due to current abuse of drugs or alcohol.

6. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1120(a), the Kansas State Board of Nursing may deny, revoke, limit or suspend any license, certificate of qualification or authorization to practice nursing as a registered professional nurse , as a licensed practical nurse, as an advanced registered nurse practitioner or as a registered nurse anesthetist that is issued by the board or applied for under authorization, if the Licensee, Licensee or holder of a certificate of qualifications or authorization is found to have violated the Nurse Practice Act.

7. The above fact findings established evidence that the Licensee violated the following provisions of the Nurse Practice Act:

Count 1: K.S.A. 65 1120(a)(1) unprofessional conduct by fraud or deceit in practicing nursing.

Count 2: K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(6), unprofessional conduct, by inaccurately recording, falsifying or altering documents.

Count 3: K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(6), unprofessional conduct, by drug diversion K.A.R. 60-3-110(n) in past conduct;

Count 4: K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(4) unable to practice with skill and safety due to current abuse of drugs or alcohol.

K.S.A. 77-511(a)(2)(A) of the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act authorized by use of the summary proceedings do not violated any provision of law and the protection of the public interest does not require the state agency to give notice and opportunity to participate to persons other than the parties.

8. The role of the Kansas State Board of Nursing is to protect citizens of Kansas.

#### POLICY STATEMENT


1. Diversion of narcotics as a Registered Nurse puts patients and the public at risk in violation of the Kansas Nurse Practice Act.
2. Fraudulent behavior as a nurse is a violation of the public's trust.

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED BY THE KANSAS STATE BOARD OF NURSING THAT**

1. **Licensee's license to practice nursing in the state of Kansas is Suspended for the first year of the three (3) year KNAP agreement.**
2. **Licensee shall pay \$70.00 costs of this action to the Board within thirty (30) days of the effective day of this Order.**

Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537, the decision, which is called a Summary Order, is subject to your request for hearing. If you desire a hearing, you must submit or direct a **written** request for hearing to: Kansas State Board of Nursing, Legal Division, 900 SW Jackson, Suite 1051, Topeka, Kansas 66612-1230, (785) 296-4325. THIS REQUEST MUST BE SUBMITTED WITHIN FIFTEEN (15) DAYS FROM THE DATE OF THIS ORDER. If a hearing is not requested in the time and manner stated, this Summary Order becomes effective as a final order, without further notice, upon the expiration of the time for requesting a hearing.

Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-531, if the Summary Order is served by mail, three days are added to the time limits set out above.
