ORDER

NOW on this 3rd day of March, 1983, the above-captioned case comes on for hearing. Petitioner appears by and through its attorney, Julia L. Young, Assistant Attorney General. The respondent appears in person. The petitioner and respondent present evidence and rest.

THEREUPON, the Board having heard the evidence and statements of counsel, the witnesses, and the respondent, and being duly advised in the premises FINDS as follows:

The respondent has violated the provisions of K.S.A. 1982 Supp. 65-1110(a)(6), in that, while employed at Sedgwick Nursing Home, Sedgwick, Kansas, between July, 1982, and September 29, 1982, she obtained narcotics from the Sedgwick Nursing Home and diverted them from the nursing home for her own use. Respondent diverted the following drugs from the Sedgwick Nursing Home: Morphine, Demerol, Percodan, and Tylenol #3.

The Board unanimously FINDS the above acts constitute unprofessional conduct, as provided by K.S.A. 1982 Supp. 65-1110(a)(6).

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED BY THE BOARD that respondent's license to practice professional nursing shall be revoked. Respondent is hereby ordered to surrender her license to the Board by mailing it, certified mail to: Bonnie Howard, Kansas State Board of Nursing, 503 Kansas Avenue, Suite 330, Topeka, Kansas 66601.
