THEREUPON, the Board, having heard the evidence and arguments of counsel, and being duly advised in the premises, Finds as follows:

The respondent has violated K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(6) as defined by K.A.R. 60-3-110(a)(9) in that he had diverted Valium, Demerol, and Sublimase from the Stormont-Vail Regional Medical Center, Topeka, Kansas between 1981 through 1983 inclusive.

The Board Finds that the above acts constitute unprofessional conduct as provided by K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(6).

IT IS THEREFORE, ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED by the Board that respondent's Registered Nursing License be revoked.
