ORDER

Now, on this 28th day of May, 1981, the above-captioned matter comes on for hearing. The State of Kansas appears by and through its attorney, Steven Carr, Assistant Attorney General. The respondent appears in person and by her attorney, Stephen G. Mirakian. The State and the respondent each present evidence and rest.

THEREUPON, the Board, having heard the evidence and statements of counsel, and being duly advised in the premises, FINDS as follows:

The respondent has violated the provisions of K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(6), having falsified medical center records and having taken multiple injectible desages of Demerol and injecting multiple desages of Demerol into her body during her working hours, as described in the petition, an act of unprofessional conduct.

IT 18, THEREFORE, BY THE BOARD ORDERED AND DECREED that the respondent's license to practice professional nursing shall be, and the same is hereby, limited, as follows:

The respondent shall be permitted to provide total patient care, except that:

- e. Respondent shall not administer any medications to patients;
- Respondent shall make monthly reports concerning her personal health progress and concerning her work sativity, commencing July, 1981, until Merch, 1988;

- Respondent shall make arrangements to meet with the Board in March, 1982, to present evidence of her personal health progress and rehabilitation and to request removal of said limitations on her license;
- Respondent's employer shall supply a monthly report of her work progress, should she be employed, commencing July, 1981, until March, 1982.
