
PROPOSED DEFAULT ORDER
REVOKING LICENSE

NOW ON THIS 12th day of November, 2003, petitioner appears by disciplinary counsel, Betty Wright, for a pre-hearing conference on the petition. Respondent does not appear.

Wherefore, the hearing officer finds as follows:

1. Respondent was licensed as a R.N. through 6/30/2003. The board has jurisdiction over this matter.
2. Petitioner sent a copy of the petition and notice of this hearing to respondent's last known address and service is proper.
3. Petitioner moves for issuance of a proposed default order revoking the respondent's license.
4. The petition is hereby granted and incorporated into this order as if set forth herein.
Respondent violated the Nurse Practice Act as alleged in the petition.
5. Per petitioner's request, respondent's license to practice nursing is revoked. Respondent may not practice nursing in Kansas.
6. Respondent shall pay the costs of the action of \$70.
7. Disciplinary counsel shall mail a copy of this order to respondent's last known address.





PETITION

COMES NOW the petitioner, the Board of Nursing, by and through disciplinary counsel, Alma A. Heckler, and for its cause of action states that:

1. Respondent is licensed to practice nursing in Kansas as a Registered Nurse through 6/30/2003.
2. The Kansas State Board of Nursing has the authority under K.S.A. 74-1106 *et seq.* to examine, license and renew licenses for duly qualified applicants and may limit, deny, suspend or revoke a license or authorization to practice nursing or may issue a public or private censure if a violation of K.S.A. 65-1120(a) is established.
3. After an investigation, the Board found reasonable grounds for believing that respondent violated K.S.A. 65-1120(a) and referred the matter for further proceedings.

FACTS COMMON TO ALL COUNTS

The respondent while employed by a hospital in Wichita, Kansas, allowed Susan Olson another nurse, to write prescriptions for controlled substances in respondent's name. Susan Olson did not have authority to prescribe drugs for or to write prescriptions for the respondent. The prescriptions were written on a doctor's prescription pad, and that doctor did not have the respondent as a patient. The prescriptions were also written without the authority of yet another doctor, who when interviewed, indicated that he had never prescribed Lortabs or Somas for the respondent. The respondent stated to investigators that she had met Susan Olson and Ms. Olson helped her buy a car and used that transaction to blackmail the respondent into cooperating with the theft and diversion of the drugs.

The respondent was referred to the Kansas Nurses Assistance program (KNAP) by the Board and she agreed in a letter of July 31, 2002, that she would enroll in KNAP. The respondent failed to enroll and the Board was notified in September of 2002 that KNAP had closed her case.

COUNTS

(a) Respondent has violated the Kansas Nurse Practice Act, K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(4) to be unable to practice with skill and safety due current abuse of drugs or alcohol;

(b) Respondent has violated K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(3) to have committed an act of professional incompetence by engaging in a pattern of practice or other behavior which demonstrates a manifest incapacity or incompetence to practice nursing;

(c) Respondent has violated K.A.R. 60-3-110(n) diverting drugs, supplies, or property of any patient or agency;

(d) Respondent has violated K.A.R. 60-3-110(s) failing to complete the requirements of the impaired provider program of the Board.


(e) Respondent has violated K.A.R. 60-3-110(r) failing to comply with any disciplinary order of the Board.

WHEREFORE, petitioner requests disciplinary action against and/or revocation of the respondent's license and for \$70.00 costs to be assessed to respondent.
