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CONSENT AGREEMENT AND FINAL ORDER

NOW ON THIS 27th day of December, 2006, the Kansas State Board of

Nursing, represented by Assistant Attorney General, Mark A. Knight, and the Respondent, Robert R. Jespersen, hereby enter into this agreement and proffer evidence and the hearing officer adopts those recommendations and makes the following findings of fact and orders:

AGREED FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Licensee is licensed to practice nursing in Kansas through 12/31/2006 as a Registered Nurse, Advanced Registered Nurse Practitioner, and Registered Nurse Anesthetist. The Kansas State Board of Nursing (Board) has jurisdiction over the Licensee and the subject matter of this action.
  2. Licensee's address of record is 15319 W. 93rd St., Shawnee Mission, KS 66219.
  3. The Licensee understands that pursuant to K.S.A. 77-515, Licensee may be represented at Licensee's expense by, an attorney during these proceedings.
  4. After an investigation, the Board's investigative committee found reasonable grounds to believe that the Licensee violated the Kansas Nurse Practice Act, K.S.A. 65-1120, and referred this matter for further proceedings.
  5. The Kansas State Board of Nursing has the authority under K.S.A. 74-1106 et seq. to examine, license and renew license for duly qualified Licensees and may limit, deny, suspend or revoke a license or authorization to practice nursing, may issue a public or private censure and levy administrative fines consistent with K.S.A. 74-1110, if a violation of K.S.A. 65-1120 is established.
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6. On or about 5/18/2005 licensee entered a Stipulation, Settlement and Order with the Oklahoma Board of Nursing to surrender his Oklahoma nursing license. As part of the Oklahoma surrender the licensee stipulated to improperly documenting wastage of seven vials of sublimaze on or about 11/10/2004, while working at Grady Memorial Hospital, Chickasha, OK. Licensee further stipulated that on or about 4/27/2005, while working at Pushmataha Hospital, Antlers, OK, he diverted Fentanyl from the operating room.

7. The above incidents are violations of the nurse practice act. The Licensee agrees that the board is prepared to prove that Licensee has violated: K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(8), to have a license to practice nursing as a registered nurse or as a practical nurse denied, revoked, limited or suspended, or to be publicly or privately censured, by a licensing authority of another state, agency, or territory; K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(6), unprofessional conduct by K.A.R. 60-3-110 (n), diverting drugs, supplies, or property of any patient or agency.

8. Licensee has the right to a hearing with evidence and witnesses and to seek review of the findings from that hearing in accordance with the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act and the Act for Judicial Review and Civil Enforcement of agency actions. Licensee is waiving those rights and voluntarily entering into this agreement instead of proceeding to such a hearing.

#### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

9. The Kansas State Board of Nursing has the authority under K.S.A. 74-1106 et seq. to examine, license and renew license for duly qualified Licensees and may limit, deny, suspend or revoke a license or authorization to practice nursing, may issue a public or private censure and levy administrative fines consistent with K.S.A. 74-1110, if a violation of K.S.A. 65-1120 is established.

10. Licensee has violated the Kansas Nurse Practice Act as follows:

Count 1: K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(8), to have a license to practice nursing as a registered nurse or as a practical nurse denied, revoked, limited or suspended, or to be publicly or privately censured, by a licensing authority of another state, agency, or territory.

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Count 2: K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(6), unprofessional conduct by K.A.R. 60-3-110 (p)  
diverting drugs, supplies, or property of any patient or agency.

**POLICY STATEMENT**

11. The role of the Kansas State Board of Nursing is to protect citizens of Kansas.

**DISPOSITION**

12. By entering into this Consent Agreement and consenting to the entry of the Final Order, both parties waive their right to full administrative proceedings pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1120 and K.S.A.77-501 et seq. and to judicial review.

13. Upon the parties entering into this Consent Agreement and with the Licensee having met all statutory requirements for renewal of Licensee's Kansas Registered Nurse license, the Licensee's application for renewal of Licensee's Kansas Registered Nurse license will be approved. Licensee has not made application for renewal of his Kansas Advanced Registered Nurse Practitioner license and renewal is not approved. Licensee has not made application for renewal of his Kansas Registered Nurse Anesthetist license and renewal is not approved.

14. Based upon this agreement, and pursuant to the disciplinary remedies available in K.S.A. 65-1120, the parties agree that this Consent Agreement will continue through any renewal periods of Licensee's Registered Nurse license until Licensee completes each of the conditions and requirements of this agreement.

15. Based upon this agreement, and pursuant to the disciplinary remedies available in K.S.A. 65-1120, the parties agree that the Licensee's license to practice nursing as a Registered Nurse in Kansas is immediately suspended. The suspension will be stayed as long as the requirements and conditions of this agreement are met.

16. The Kansas State Board of Nursing will not take additional disciplinary action against Licensee's nursing license for the violations stated above as long as Licensee completes each of the following conditions and requirements:

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(a) Licensee shall return his current Kansas Registered Nurse license card to the Board with this Consent Agreement. Licensee shall receive a Kansas Registered Nurse license card which shall be issued with an "S" placed in the status code portion of the license card to indicate that the license is suspended with a Stay.

(b) Licensee shall return his current Kansas Advanced Registered Nurse Practitioner license card to the Board with this Consent Agreement.

(c) Licensee shall return his current Kansas Registered Nurse Anesthetist license card to the Board with this Consent Agreement.

(d) Licensee agrees that six (6) months after entering into this Consent Agreement, Licensee may make application to the Board to reinstate his Kansas Advanced Registered Nurse Practitioner license and his Kansas Registered Nurse Anesthetist license.

(e) Licensee will participate in and complete the reasonable recommendations and requirements of the Kansas Nurses Assistance Program (KNAP); sign releases of information necessary for KNAP to evaluate and monitor Licensee and for KNAP to report information to the board. Licensee will be deemed to have completed the KNAP program when KNAP issues written notification that Licensee has completed the program. Noncompliance with KNAP is a violation of this agreement.

(f) Licensee must submit to random drug screens as determined or selected by the Board or by KNAP. The costs of the drug screens will be paid by the Licensee. Licensee agrees that a Positive Drug Screen is a violation of this agreement.

(g) Licensee shall immediately notify the Legal Division of any use of alcohol, if prohibited by KNAP, or controlled substances, or any violation of this Consent Agreement and Final Order.

(h) The Licensee shall immediately inform all employers and prospective employers of this Consent Agreement and the Final Order.

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- (i) Licensee shall send a money order for \$70 to the Board upon entering into this agreement to pay the cost of this action.
- (j) Licensee shall not violate the Kansas Nurse Practice Act during the duration of this agreement.
- (k) Licensee shall not violate the laws of the United States, of State, or of any political subdivision of any State during the term of this agreement. Traffic infractions shall not be considered violations of the law.
- (l) Licensee will Submit Reports from the Licensee's employer to the attention of the Legal Division, Kansas State Board of Nursing, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Suite 1051, Topeka, Kansas 66612-1230 on the following schedule: Prior to Licensee securing employment that utilizes his or her nursing license, Licensee is to mail to the Kansas State Board of Nursing a statement indicating that Licensee has not yet secured employment which utilizes Licensee's nursing license. This statement is due by the 10th day of each month beginning the next month after signing this consent agreement. Once Licensee is employed in a position that utilizes his or her nursing license, or if Licensee is currently employed in a position that utilizes his or her nursing license, a nursing performance report is due by the 10th day of every third Month until Licensee has caused the submission of four (4) separate nursing performance reports. The report shall be prepared and signed by Licensee's immediate supervisor or by an R.N. who evaluates Licensee's performance on a regular basis and be based on the following guidelines: (1) Incorporation of information on facility letterhead stationary is preferred. (2) Letter format is acceptable, with the date of the report identified. (3) Evaluator's name, telephone number, address, license number and nursing credentials. (4) Licensee's name, address, telephone number, license number. (5) A short explanation of the Licensee's work performance in the following areas: (a) Standards met regarding facility policies and procedures. (b) Compliance with the Kansas Nurse Practice Act. (c) Supervisor

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evaluations. (d) Overall appropriateness. (e) Interactions with patients. (f) Interactions with staff and administration.

(m) **Licensee agrees to notify the Legal Division of any changes in address and phone number as well as all employment terminations or employer changes or additions. All such notifications shall be made in writing within fourteen (14) days of such a change.**

17. Licensee is responsible for the costs related to satisfying these conditions and requirements.

18. If Licensee does not meet these conditions and requirements, the Kansas State Board of Nursing may request additional sanctions against Licensee's license or application for a license. Licensee would be sent notice of such action and would be entitled to a hearing as to whether Licensee had complied with this Consent Agreement, but Licensee could not contest the violations listed in this agreement.

19. All parties understand that if an action based on failure to meet the conditions and requirements of this Consent Agreement is filed, K.S.A. 77-531 requires the Notice of Hearing to be served upon the Licensee and the Licensee's attorney of record, if any. All parties agree that only serving the Notice of Hearing upon the Licensee will be proper service and it is the Licensee's responsibility to contact his or her attorney, if any, in reference to the action.

20. Licensee acknowledges and agrees that upon a finding of Licensee not complying with the conditions or requirements of this Consent Agreement, the Stay of Suspension of Licensee's license to practice nursing in the State of Kansas, shall be lifted. Licensee will not be allowed to practice nursing in the state of Kansas during the period the Stay is lifted.

21. The Board will inactivate this case file once Licensee satisfies this agreement. This agreement does not prohibit the agency from taking disciplinary action against Licensee's license for any additional or cumulative violation of the Kansas Nurse Practice Act committed by the Licensee before or after this agreement is entered into.

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- 22. This agreement is a discipline and must be reported on any future renewal applications. This agreement is a contract entered into by the parties to resolve an investigative case. The original of this agreement shall be placed in the Agency Record and is a public record.
- 23. By signing this Consent Agreement and Final Order, Licensee acknowledges that Licensee has read and understands the entire document, and agrees to be bound by its terms. This Consent Agreement and Final Order constitute the entire agreement of the parties and may not be modified except in writing and approved by all parties.
- 24. After successful completion of all of the conditions and requirements of this Consent Agreement by the Licensee, the Consent Agreement will be satisfied and the case will be inactivated.
- 25. The hearing/presiding officer whose signature appears below has been designated pursuant to K.S.A. 77-514 and K.S.A. 77-526 to act on behalf of the Board/agency head and to hear discipline cases on behalf of the Board/agency head and to render either initial orders or final orders, if by agreement of both parties, in those discipline cases.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto execute this CONSENT AGREEMENT AND FINAL ORDER.

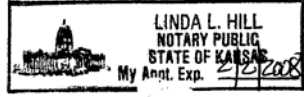
