ORDER

NOW, on this 19th day of April, 1985, the above-captioned matter comes on for hearing. Petitioner appears by and through Nancy L. Ulrich, Assistant Attorney General. Respondent appears in person and by and through her counsel, Stephan V. Sickel.

THEREUPON, the Board, having heard statements of counsel and witness testimony, and examined the evidence, and being duly advised in the premises, finds as follows:

1. Respondent is guilty of K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(6), as defined by K.A.R. 60-3-110(9), in that on or about September 24, 1984, respondent diverted two 3 mg. Dilaudid suppositories from Regency Health Care Center, Olathe, Kansas.


2. Respondent is guilty of K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(3) in that on or about September 25, 1984, respondent worked her morning nursing shift in a drugged and/or intoxicated condition, seriously impairing her ability to perform her duties as a registered nurse at Regency Health Care Center, Olathe, Kansas.

The Board further finds unanimously that the above act constitutes unprofessional conduct as provided by K.S.A. 65-1120.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED AND DECREED BY THE BOARD that respondent's license to practice nursing be revoked.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
