FINAL ORDER
AND CONSENT AGREEMENT

NOW ON THIS 6th day of December, 2011, the Kansas State Board of Nursing, represented by Assistant Attorney General, Danielle R. Sanger, and the Respondent, Denise Y. Kline, hereby enter into this agreement and proffer evidence and the hearing officer adopts those recommendations and makes the following findings of fact and orders:

AGREED FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent submitted an endorsement application on 12/21/2010. The Kansas State Board of Nursing (KSBN) has jurisdiction over the Respondent and the subject matter of this action.
2. Respondent's address of record is PO Box 23, Dighton KS 67839.
3. The Respondent understands that pursuant to K.S.A. 77-515, Respondent may be represented, at Respondent's expense, by an attorney during these proceedings.
4. Respondent acknowledges that this agreement is an open record pursuant to the Kansas Open Records Act, K.S.A 45-215 *et seq.*, and may be published or disseminated.
5. The Kansas State Board of Nursing shall examine, license and renew licenses of duly qualified applicants under the authority of K.S.A. 74-1106 *et seq.* Under the authority of K.S.A. 65-1120, the Kansas State Board of Nursing may deny, revoke, limit or suspend a license or authorization to practice nursing or may issue a public or private censure

and levy administrative fines, consistent with K.S.A. 74-1110, if a violation of K.S.A. 65-1120 is established.

6. On or about 12/21/2010, the Board received Applicant's endorsement RN application to practice nursing in the state of Kansas.
7. Review of the Application and other information gathered by the Board revealed the following information upon which this action is based.
8. On or about 8/25/2006, Applicant pled guilty to disorderly conduct, a misdemeanor, and was sentenced to a \$100 fine by the City of Worland Wyoming Municipal Court.
9. In a letter from Applicant, dated 12/17/2010, Applicant stated that in the span of seven months, from 06/2006 to 01/2007, she was terminated by three employers where she had been employed in positions utilizing her nursing license. Two of the three terminations were based on anger issues and conflicts between the Applicant and her co-workers.
10. In the above-referenced letter, Applicant stated that her 8/25/2006 misdemeanor conviction was the result of a disagreement between herself and a co-worker at Worland Healthcare and Rehabilitation Center, Worland Wyoming. This disagreement also resulted in her employment termination.
11. In a letter dated 1/13/2011, the Kansas State Board of Nursing informed Applicant that she was required to complete a mental health evaluation.
12. On or about 1/13/2011, the Kansas Board of Nursing referred Applicant to the Kansas Nurses Assistance Program (KNAP) and requested a mental health evaluation.
13. On or about 7/5/2011, KNAP informed the Board that Applicant failed to enroll in its program.
14. On or about 8/23/2011, a summary order was issued denying Applicant a license to practice nursing in the state of Kansas.
15. On or about 9/12/2011, Applicant appealed the summary order.

16. On or about 9/22/2011, Applicant completed a mental health evaluation.
17. On or about 10/4/2011, the Board received the results of Applicant's mental health evaluation.
- a. Applicant's mental health evaluation recommendations:
- i. "Based on this interview should Ms. Kline return to work in the medical field she would not pose a threat of harm to residents, patients or co-workers. Certain conditions, however, should apply. She would need to continue to take her medication as prescribed to help with mood regulation and stability. She would need to have access to a process of venting her frustration, without repercussions regarding her place of employment (ex: therapist, on site social worker, confidant, etc). Ms. Kline should be given direct expectations and directions regarding her job duties, including both formal and informal duties/expectations/procedures."
18. The above incidents are violations of the Nurse Practice Act. The Respondent agrees that the Board is prepared to prove that Respondent has violated:
- a. K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(6): to be guilty of unprofessional conduct as defined by rules and regulations of the board, by KAR 60-3-110(s), failing to complete the requirements of the impaired provider program of the board.

19. Respondent has the right to a hearing with evidence and witnesses and to seek review of the findings from that hearing in accordance with the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act and the Judicial Review Act. Respondent is waiving those rights and voluntarily entering into this agreement instead of proceeding to such a hearing.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

20. The Kansas State Board of Nursing has the authority under K.S.A. 74-1106 *et seq.* to examine, license and renew licenses for duly qualified applicants and deny, revoke, limit

or suspend a license or authorization to practice nursing, may issue a public or private censure and levy administrative fines consistent with K.S.A. 74-1110, if a violation of K.S.A. 65-1120 is established.

21. Respondent has violated the Kansas Nurse Practice Act as follows:

- a. K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(6): to be guilty of unprofessional conduct as defined by rules and regulations of the board, by KAR 60-3-110(s), failing to complete the requirements of the impaired provider program of the board.

POLICY STATEMENT

22. The role of the Kansas State Board of Nursing is to protect the citizens of Kansas.

DISPOSITION

23. By entering into this Consent Agreement and consenting to the entry of the Final Order, both parties waive their right to full administrative proceedings pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1120 and K.S.A. 77-501 *et seq.* and to judicial review.

24. Based upon this agreement, and pursuant to the disciplinary remedies available in K.S.A. 65-1120, the parties agree that this Final Order and Consent Agreement will continue through any renewal periods of Respondent's nursing license until Respondent completes each of the conditions and requirements of this agreement. Further, the parties agree that in the event of a lapse of Respondent's nursing license, reinstatement of Respondent's nursing license shall be contingent upon this Final Order and Consent Agreement remaining in effect until Respondent completes each of the conditions and requirements of this agreement.

25. Based upon this agreement, and pursuant to the disciplinary remedies available in K.S.A. 65-1120, the parties agree that the Respondent's RN application will be approved upon the Board receiving notification from KNAP that Respondent has entered into a contract with KNAP. Once Respondent's application is approved, her RN license in Kansas is immediately suspended with a stay and limited.

26. The Kansas State Board of Nursing will not take additional disciplinary action against Respondent's nursing license for the violations stated above as long as Respondent completes each of the following conditions and requirements:

- a. Respondent's license is suspended with a stay and limited.
- b. Respondent shall not act in the capacity of charge nurse or in a supervisory capacity/position for one year once she is employed in a position that utilizes her nursing license.
- c. Respondent shall participate in and complete the reasonable recommendations and requirements of the Kansas Nurses Assistance Program (KNAP). Respondent shall sign releases of information necessary for KNAP to evaluate and monitor Respondent and for KNAP to report information to the Board, Attorney General's office, and Office of Administrative Hearings. Respondent will be deemed to have completed the KNAP program when KNAP issues written notification that Respondent has completed the program. If Respondent is not already enrolled, Respondent must enroll in the KNAP program within thirty (30) days of entering this agreement. Noncompliance with KNAP is a violation of this agreement.
- d. Respondent shall participate in mental health counseling at least once a month. Respondent shall cause the submission of quarterly reports from her mental health counselor to the Board. These reports are due by the 10th day of every third month beginning the next month after signing this Final Order and Consent Agreement. The reports are due until Respondent has caused the submission of four (4) separate counseling reports.

- i. The reports shall be sent to: Legal Division, Kansas State Board of Nursing, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Suite 1051, Topeka, Kansas 66612-1230.
- e. Respondent shall meet with her primary physician quarterly. Respondent shall cause the submission of quarterly reports from her primary physician to the Board, indicating the Respondent's current prescriptions and dosage amounts. These reports are due by the 10th day of every third month beginning the next month after signing this Final Order and Consent Agreement. The reports are due until Respondent has caused the submission of four (4) separate physician reports
 - i. The reports shall be sent to: Legal Division, Kansas State Board of Nursing, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Suite 1051, Topeka, Kansas 66612-1230.
- f. Respondent shall submit to random drug screens as determined or selected by the Board or by KNAP in order to determine if she is continuing to take her medications as prescribed. The costs of the drug screens will be paid by the Respondent.
- g. Respondent shall submit reports from the Respondent's employer to the attention of the Legal Division, Kansas State Board of Nursing, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Suite 1051, Topeka, Kansas 66612-1230 on the following schedule:
 - i. Prior to Respondent securing employment that utilizes his or her nursing license, Respondent is to mail to the Kansas State Board of Nursing a statement indicating that Respondent has not yet secured employment which utilizes Respondent's nursing license. This

statement is due by the 10th day of each month beginning the next month after signing this Final Order and Consent Agreement.

- ii. Once Respondent is employed in a position that utilizes his or her nursing license, or if Respondent is currently employed in a position that utilizes his or her nursing license, a nursing performance report is due by the 10th day of every third Month until Respondent has caused the submission of four (4) separate nursing performance reports. These reports are due by the 10th day of every third month beginning the next month after signing this Final Order and Consent Agreement.
- iii. The report shall be prepared and signed by Respondent's immediate supervisor or by an R.N. who evaluates Respondent's performance on a regular basis and be based on the following guidelines:
 1. Incorporation of information on facility letterhead stationary is required.
 2. Letter format is acceptable, with the date of the report identified.
 3. Evaluator's name, telephone number, address, license number and nursing credentials.
 4. Respondent's name, address, telephone number, license number.
 5. A statement by the evaluator that Respondent is not acting as a charge nurse or in a supervisory position
 6. A short explanation of the Respondent's work performance in the following areas:

- a. **Standards met regarding facility policies and procedures.**
 - b. **Compliance with the Kansas Nurse Practice Act.**
 - c. **Supervisor evaluations.**
 - d. **Overall appropriateness.**
 - e. **Interactions with patients.**
 - f. **Interactions with staff and administration.**
- h. **Respondent shall send a money order for \$70 to the Board upon entering into this agreement to pay the cost of this action.**
- i. **Respondent shall not violate the Kansas Nurse Practice Act during the duration of this agreement.**
- j. **Respondent shall not violate the laws of the United States, of any State, or of any political subdivision of any State during the term of this agreement. Traffic infractions shall not be considered violations of the law.**
- k. **Respondent agrees to notify the Legal Division of any changes in address and phone number as well as all employment terminations or employer changes or additions.**
- i. **All such notifications shall be made in writing within fourteen (14) days of such a change.**
- l. **Respondent acknowledges and agrees that Respondent is responsible for the costs related to satisfying the conditions and requirements of this Final Order and Consent Agreement. Respondent further acknowledges and agrees that to provide the Board with false information regarding compliance with this Final Order and Consent Agreement is a violation of this Final Order and Consent Agreement.**

27. If Respondent does not meet these conditions and requirements, the Kansas State Board of Nursing may request additional sanctions against Respondent's license or application for a license. Respondent would be sent notice of such action and would be entitled to a hearing as to whether Respondent had complied with this Final Order and Consent Agreement, but Respondent could not contest the violations listed in this agreement.
28. All parties understand that if an action based on failure to meet the conditions and requirements of this Final Order and Consent Agreement is filed, K.S.A. 77-531 requires the Notice of Hearing to be served upon the Respondent and the Respondent's attorney of record, if any.
29. Respondent acknowledges and agrees that if any notice based on failure to meet the conditions and requirements of this Final Order and Consent Agreement is filed during the term of this Final Order and Consent Agreement, or within 30 days after the expiration date, the conditions of this Final Order and Consent Agreement shall continue in effect until the Board takes final action in the proceeding.
30. Respondent acknowledges and agrees that upon a first finding of Respondent not complying with any of the conditions or requirements of this Final Order and Consent Agreement, the Stay of Suspension of Respondent's license to practice nursing in the State of Kansas shall be lifted for a period of six months from the date of said finding. Respondent will not be allowed to practice nursing in the state of Kansas during the period of suspension. Respondent acknowledges and agrees that all conditions and requirements of this Final Order and Consent Agreement remain in effect during the period of suspension.
31. Respondent acknowledges and agrees that upon a second or subsequent finding of Respondent not complying with any of the conditions or requirements of this Final Order and Consent Agreement the Stay of Suspension of Respondent's license to practice

nursing in the State of Kansas shall be lifted for a period of one year from the date of said finding. Respondent will not be allowed to practice nursing in the state of Kansas during the period of suspension. Respondent acknowledges and agrees that all conditions and requirements of this Final Order and Consent Agreement remain in effect during the period of suspension.

32. Respondent acknowledges and agrees that upon the Stay of Suspension being lifted due to a finding of non-compliance with any of the conditions or requirements of this Final Order and Consent Agreement, the Suspension will not again be Stayed until the Respondent has, following the prescribed time period of suspension, provided written verification to the Board that Respondent is in compliance and has remained in compliance during the period of suspension, with all conditions and requirements of this Final Order and Consent Agreement. Upon the Respondent providing said written verification, the suspension will again be stayed.
33. This agreement does not prohibit the agency from taking disciplinary action against Respondent's license for any additional or cumulative violation of the Kansas Nurse Practice Act committed by the Respondent before or after this agreement is entered into.
34. This agreement is a discipline and must be reported on any future renewal or reinstatement applications. This agreement is a contract entered into by the parties to resolve an investigative case. The original of this agreement shall be placed in the Agency Record. This Agreement is a public record and will be reported to national disciplinary data banks.
35. After successful completion of all of the conditions and requirements of this Final Order and Consent Agreement by the Respondent, the Final Order and Consent Agreement will be satisfied and the case will be inactivated.
36. By signing this Final Order and Consent Agreement, Respondent acknowledges that Respondent has read and understands the entire document and agrees to be bound by

its terms. This Final Order and Consent Agreement constitute the entire agreement of the parties and may not be modified except in writing and approved by all parties. The effective date of this Final Order and Consent Agreement is the date shown on the certificate of service.

37. The hearing/presiding officer whose signature appears below has been designated pursuant to K.S.A. 77-514 and K.S.A. 77-526 to act on behalf of the Board/agency head and to hear discipline cases on behalf of the Board/agency head and to render either initial orders or final orders, if by agreement of both parties, in those discipline cases.

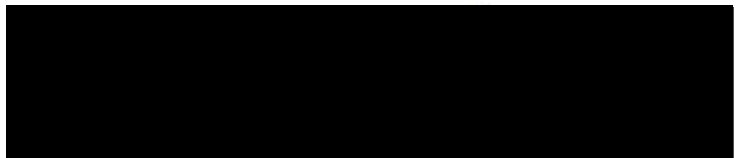
