**PROPOSED DEFAULT ORDER TO DENY APPLICATION FOR LICENSE**

NOW ON THIS 30<sup>th</sup> day of September, 2013, petitioner, the Kansas State Board of Nursing, appears by disciplinary counsel, Michael R. Fitzgibbons, Assistant Attorney General, for a Hearing on the Petition. Respondent does not appear.

Wherefore, the Presiding Officer finds as follows:

1. Respondent is an applicant to licensed to practice nursing in Kansas. The Kansas State Board of Nursing has jurisdiction over the Respondent and the subject matter of this action.
2. Respondent was sent a copy of the petition and notice of this hearing to respondent's last known address and service is proper. Respondent does not appear.
3. Petitioner moves for issuance of a proposed default order denying respondent's license. The petitioner's request is granted by default pursuant to K.S.A. 77-520.
4. The petition is hereby granted and incorporated into this order as if set forth herein. Respondent violated the Nurse Practice Act as alleged in the petition.
5. Per Petitioner's request, Respondent's endorsement application for license to practice nursing is denied. Respondent may not practice nursing in Kansas.
6. Costs of the action of \$70 are assessed to respondent to be paid to the board by cash or money order within 30 days of the effective date of this order.
7. This Proposed Default Order shall become effective seven days after service or ten days after mailing of this order unless the Respondent files a written motion with the Board stating why the Proposed Default Order should be vacated and the order is then vacated.

8 If this Proposed Default Order becomes effective, the Respondent's request for administrative hearing is dismissed pursuant to K.S.A. 77-520(d).

9. Disciplinary counsel shall mail a copy of this proposed default order to respondent's last known address.

**NOTICE**

Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-527, either party may request a review of this order by filing a petition for review with the Kansas State Board of Nursing. The petition for review shall state its basis. A petition for review must be filed within 7 days from the date this order becomes effective. Failure to timely request a review by the Kansas State Board of Nursing may preclude further judicial review. The petition for review shall be mailed or personally delivered to: State Board of Nursing - Legal Division, Landon State Office Building, 900 SW Jackson, Ste 1051, Topeka, KS 66612-1230.

Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-530, if neither party requests a review by the Kansas State Board of Nursing, then this initial order becomes final and binding on both parties on the 30<sup>th</sup> day following its service.

Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-531, if the initial order is served by mail, three days are added to the time limits set out above.

**PETITION**

COMES NOW the petitioner, the Kansas State Board of Nursing, by and through Assistant Attorney General assigned to the Board, Michael R. Fitzgibbons, and for its cause of action states that:

1. Respondent, Amber Renee Chambers, is an applicant to practice nursing in Kansas. The Board has jurisdiction over the respondent and the subject matter of this action.
2. Respondent's address of record is 611 4<sup>th</sup> Street Oswego, Kansas 67356.
3. After an investigation, the Board's investigative committee found reasonable grounds to believe that the respondent violated the Kansas Nurse Practice Act, K.S.A. 65-1120, and referred this matter for further proceedings.
4. The Kansas State Board of Nursing has the authority under K.S.A. 74-1106 et seq. to examine, license and renew license for duly qualified applicants and may limit, deny, suspend or revoke a license or authorization to practice nursing, may issue a public or private censure and levy administrative fines consistent with K.S.A. 74-1110, if a violation of K.S.A. 65-1120(a) is established.

**FACTS COMMON TO ALL COUNTS**

5. The facts below are common to all counts:
  - (a) As a result of applicant's background check, it indicated that you were arrested and charged with driving with license cancelled/suspended/revoked in Craig County Oklahoma.

- (b) In the District Court of Tulsa County, Oklahoma applicant entered a plea to obtaining merchandise by false pretense on the 23<sup>rd</sup> of July, 2001.
- (c) In the District Court of Ottawa County, Oklahoma applicant entered a plea to the charge of aggravated driving a motor vehicle under the influence, open container and failure to carry insurance on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of May, 2010.
- (d) In the District Court of Mayes County, Oklahoma, applicant pled guilty to drunk in a public place on the 11<sup>th</sup> day of January, 2010.
- (e) Oklahoma Driver's License was revoked on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of March, 2010 for chemical test failure.
- (f) Applicant failed to complete recovery program.
- (g) Applicant submitted an Endorsement Application on the 24<sup>th</sup> day of October, 2012.
- (h) Applicant was referred to KNAP for chemical dependency evaluation on the 14<sup>th</sup> day of January, 2013.
- (i) On the 21<sup>st</sup> day of March, 2013, the KNAP case was closed as applicant informed KNAP that she no longer wanted to apply for a Nursing License in Kansas and would not participate in the KNAP program.
- (j) Applicant's Oklahoma nursing license has lapsed.

### VIOLATIONS

6. Respondent has violated the Kansas Nurse Practice Act as follows:

Count 1: K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(7), willfully and repeatedly violation provisions of the Kansas Nurse Practice Act by failing to complete the requirements of impaired provider program KAR 60-3-110(s).


Count 2: K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(4) unable to practice with skill and safety due to current abuse of drugs or alcohol.

WHEREFORE, petitioner requests a finding that the respondent has violated the Nurse Practice Act, that respondent's request for a license to practice nursing in Kansas be denied, and that costs of this action be assessed to the respondent in the amount of \$70.00.
