NOW ON THIS 304 day of July, 2011, petitioner, the Kansas State Board of Nursing, appears by disciplinary counsel, Alma A. Heckler, for a Hearing on the Amended Petition.

Respondent does not appear.

Wherefore, the Presiding Officer finds as follows:

- Respondent is licensed to practice nursing in Kansas through 6/30/2012. The Kansas State Board of Nursing has jurisdiction over the Respondent and the subject matter of this action.
- 2. Respondent was sent a copy of the amended petition and notice of this hearing to respondent's last known address and service is proper. Respondent does not appear.
- 3. Petitioner moves for issuance of a proposed default order revoking respondent's license. The petitioner's request is granted by default pursuant to K.S.A. 77-520.
- 4. The petition is hereby granted and incorporated into this order as if set forth herein.

 Respondent violated the Nurse Practice Act as alleged in the petition.
- 5. Per petitioner's request, Respondent's license to practice nursing is revoked.
- 6. Costs of the action of \$70 are assessed to respondent to be paid to the board by cash or money order within 30 days of the effective date of this order.
- 7. Respondent shall immediately forward her original Kansas licensed practical nurse license to the Kansas State Board of Nursing.

- 8. This Proposed Default Order shall become effective seven days after service or ten days after mailing of this order unless the Respondent files a written motion with the Board stating why the Proposed Default Order should be vacated and the order is then vacated.
- 9. If this Proposed Default Order becomes effective, the Respondent's request for administrative hearing is dismissed pursuant to K.S.A. 77-520(d).
- 10. Disciplinary counsel shall mail a copy of this proposed default order to respondent's last known address.

AMENDED PETITION

COMES NOW the petitioner, the Kansas State Board of Nursing, by and through
Assistant Attorney General assigned to the Board, Alma A. Heckler, and for its cause of action
states that:

- Respondent, Jeannie M. Layton, is licensed to practice nursing in Kansas through
 6/30/2012. The Board has jurisdiction over the respondent and the subject matter of this action.
- 2. Respondent's address of record is 301 S. Mechanic, Emporia, KS 66801.
- 3. After an investigation, the Board's investigative committee found reasonable grounds to believe that the respondent violated the Kansas Nurse Practice Act, K.S.A. 65-1120, and referred this matter for further proceedings.
- 4. The Kansas State Board of Nursing has the authority under K.S.A. 74-1106 et seq. to examine, license and renew license for duly qualified applicants and may limit, deny, suspend or revoke a license or authorization to practice nursing, may issue a public or private censure and levy administrative fines consistent with K.S.A. 74-1110, if a violation of K.S.A. 65-1120(a) is established.

FACTS COMMON TO ALL COUNTS

- 5. The facts below are common to all counts:
- (a) Respondent entered a Consent Agreement and Final Order on or about February
 22, 2009 with the Kansas State Board of Nursing to resolve case numbers 96-318-9 and 08 707-8. The Consent Agreement and Final Order remain in effect until such time as the

Respondent completes all conditions and requirements of the Consent Agreement and Final Order.

- (b) On or about September 13, 2010, Respondent was found to be non-compliant with the February 22, 2009 Consent Agreement and Final Order after a hearing. An Initial Order filed on September 13, 2010 stated the Respondent acknowledged violations of the Kansas Nurse Practice Act and the February 22, 2009 Consent Agreement. Per the order, the stay was lifted on the suspension of Respondent's license for six months. The stay was reimposed on the suspension of Respondent's license on March 21, 2011.
- (e) Conditions of the February 22, 2009 Consent Agreement and Final Order include a condition that the Respondent participate in and complete the recommendations and requirements of the Kansas Nursing Assistance Program (KNAP). Respondent has committed two separate violations of the Consent Agreement.
- (g) Respondent became noncompliant by receiving a positive urine drug screen for marijuana on or about April 28, 2011.

Respondent wrote KNAP a letter dated May

10, 2011, stated that she did not want to participate in KNAP, in spite of the fact that her participation in KNAP was a condition of the February 22, 2009 Consent Agreement and Final Order and is the third violation of her Consent Agreement.

VIOLATIONS

- 6. Respondent has violated the Kansas Nurse Practice Act as follows:
- Count 1: K.S.A. 65–1120(a)(6), unprofessional conduct by K.A.R. 60-3-110(r), failing to comply with any disciplinary order of the board.
- Count 2: K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(6), unprofessional conduct, by failing to complete the requirements of the impaired provider program of the board; K.A.R. 30-3-110(s).

Count 3: K.S.A. 65 1120(a)(4) to be unable to practice with skill and safety due to current abuse of drugs or alcohol.

WHEREFORE, petitioner requests the respondent's nursing license be revoked due to her failure to meet the requirements of the February 22, 2009 Consent Agreement and Final Order and costs of this action should be assessed to the respondent in the amount of \$70.00.
