FINAL ORDER AND CONSENT AGREEMENT

NOW ON THIS 5th day of April, 2012, the Kansas State Board of Nursing, represented by Assistant Attorney General, Alma A. Heckler, and the Respondent, Robert C. Martinez, by and through counsel, Shannon D. Cohorst, hereby enter into this agreement and proffer evidence and the hearing officer adopts those recommendations and makes the following findings of fact and orders:

AGREED FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent is licensed to practice nursing in Kansas through 11/30/2013. The Kansas State Board of Nursing (KSBN) has jurisdiction over the Respondent and the subject matter of this action.
2. Respondent's address of record is 1401 Appleton, Parsons, KS 67357.
3. The Respondent understands that pursuant to K.S.A. 77-515, respondent may be represented at respondent's expense by, an attorney during these proceedings. Respondent acknowledges that this agreement will be an open record pursuant to the Kansas Open Records Act, K.S.A 45-215 et seq., and may be published or disseminated notwithstanding any state or federal law otherwise restricting public access to, or dissemination of, any personal or health care information, or any information or records of substance abuse evaluation and/or treatment contained herein.

4. After an investigation, the Board's investigative committee found reasonable grounds to believe that the respondent violated the Kansas Nurse Practice Act, K.S.A. 65-1120, and referred this matter for further proceedings.

5. The Kansas State Board of Nursing has the authority under K.S.A. 74-1106 et seq. to examine, license and renew license for duly qualified applicants and may limit, deny, suspend or revoke a license or authorization to practice nursing, may issue a public or private censure and levy administrative fines consistent with K.S.A. 74-1110, if a violation of K.S.A. 65-1120 is established.

6. (a) On Respondent's initial application to practice nursing in Kansas he failed to report his driver's license suspensions and his October, 2001 conviction for criminal damage to property. Respondent was warned and instructed to report these violations on any future applications, by letter from the Board. Respondent failed to report the prior driver's license suspensions on his 2009 renewal application.

(b) Respondent failed to report the October, 2001 criminal conviction and prior employment termination at Golden Keys on an employment application on 5/1/2008. Respondent was convicted in 2011 of misdemeanor Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol (DUI).

(c) Respondent's employment was terminated on 6/15/2009 from Deseret Nursing and Rehabilitation, Oswego, Kansas due to documented incidents of patient abuse and failure to follow policy and procedure.

7. The above incidents are violations of the nurse practice act. The Respondent agrees that the board is prepared to prove that respondent has violated:

Count 1: K.S.A.65-1120(a)(1), to be guilty of fraud or deceit in practicing nursing or in procuring or attempting to procure a license to practice nursing.

Count 2: K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(3), Professional Incompetency by K.S.A. 65-1120(e)(1), one or more instances involving failure to adhere to the applicable standard of care to a degree which constitutes gross negligence, as determined by the board.

Count 3: K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(4), to be unable to practice with skill and safety due to current abuse of drugs or alcohol.

Count 4: K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(6), unprofessional conduct by K.A.R. 60-3-110(c), failing to take appropriate action or to follow policies and procedures in the practice situation designed to safeguard each patient.

Count 5: K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(6), unprofessional conduct by K.A.R. 60-3-110(g), verbal abuse, which shall be defined as any word or phrase spoken inappropriately to or in the presence of a patient that results in or might reasonably be expected to result in the patient's unnecessary fear, emotional distress, or mental distress.

Count 6: K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(2) "to have been guilty of a felony or to have been guilty of a misdemeanor involving an illegal drug offense unless the applicant or licensee establishes sufficient rehabilitation to warrant the public trust..."

Count 7: K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(6), unprofessional conduct by K.A.R. 60-3-110(e)(3), physical abuse, which shall be defined as any act or failure to act performed intentionally or carelessly that causes or is likely to cause harm to a patient by any threat, menacing conduct, or other nontherapeutic or inappropriate action that results in or might reasonably be expected to result in a patient's unnecessary fear or emotional or mental distress.

8. Respondent has the right to a hearing with evidence and witnesses and to seek review of the findings from that hearing in accordance with the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act and the Act for Judicial Review and Civil Enforcement of agency actions. Respondent is waiving those rights and voluntarily entering into this agreement instead of proceeding to such a hearing.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

9. The Kansas State Board of Nursing has the authority under K.S.A. 74-1106 et seq. to examine, license and renew license for duly qualified applicants and may limit, deny, suspend or revoke a license or authorization to practice nursing, may issue a public or private censure and levy administrative fines consistent with K.S.A. 74-1110, if a violation of K.S.A. 65-1120 is established.

10. Respondent has violated the Kansas Nurse Practice Act as follows:

Count 1: K.S.A.65-1120(a)(1), to be guilty of fraud or deceit in practicing nursing or in procuring or attempting to procure a license to practice nursing.

Count 2: K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(3), Professional Incompetency by K.S.A. 65-1120(e)(1), one or more instances involving failure to adhere to the applicable standard of care to a degree which constitutes gross negligence, as determined by the board.

Count 3: K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(4), to be unable to practice with skill and safety due to current abuse of drugs or alcohol.

Count 4: K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(6), unprofessional conduct by K.A.R. 60-3-110(c), failing to take appropriate action or to follow policies and procedures in the practice situation designed to safeguard each patient.

Count 5: K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(6), unprofessional conduct by K.A.R. 60-3-110(g), verbal abuse, which shall be defined as any word or phrase spoken inappropriately to or in the presence of a patient that results in or might reasonably be expected to result in the patient's unnecessary fear, emotional distress, or mental distress.

Count 6: K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(2) "to have been guilty of a felony or to have been guilty of a misdemeanor involving an illegal drug offense unless the applicant or licensee establishes sufficient rehabilitation to warrant the public trust..."

Count 7: K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(6), unprofessional conduct by K.A.R. 60-3-110(e)(3), physical abuse, which shall be defined as any act or failure to act performed intentionally or

carelessly that causes or is likely to cause harm to a patient by any threat, menacing conduct, or other nontherapeutic or inappropriate action that results in or might reasonably be expected to result in a patient's unnecessary fear or emotional or mental distress.

POLICY STATEMENT

11. The role of the Kansas State Board of Nursing is to protect citizens of Kansas.

DISPOSITION

12. By entering into this Final Order and Consent Agreement and consenting to the entry of the Final Order, both parties waive their right to full administrative proceedings pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1120 and K.S.A.77-501 et seq. and to judicial review.

13. Based upon this agreement, and pursuant to the disciplinary remedies available in K.S.A. 65-1120, the parties agree that this Final Order and Consent Agreement will continue through any renewal periods of respondent's nursing license until respondent completes each of the conditions and requirements of this agreement. Further, the parties agree that in the event of a lapse of Respondent's nursing license, reinstatement of Respondent's nursing license shall be contingent upon this Final Order and Consent Agreement remaining in effect until Respondent completes each of the conditions and requirements of this agreement.

14. Based upon this agreement, and pursuant to the disciplinary remedies available in K.S.A. 65-1120, the parties agree that the Respondent's license to practice nursing in Kansas is immediately suspended. The suspension will be stayed as long as the requirements and conditions of this agreement are met.

15. Based upon this agreement, and pursuant to the disciplinary remedies available in K.S.A. 65-1120, the parties agree that the Respondent's license to practice nursing in Kansas is immediately limited. The limitations placed on the license and described below will remain in place until the requirements and conditions of this agreement are met or until the requirements and conditions of this agreement call for the modification of the limitations.

16. The Kansas State Board of Nursing will not take additional disciplinary action against respondent's nursing license for the violations stated above as long as respondent completes each of the following conditions and requirements:

(a) Respondent shall return any license cards in his possession to the Board with this Final Order and Consent Agreement. Respondent shall receive a license that the Board's verification system will show is suspended with a Stay. The license will have limitations on the practice.

(b) Respondent will participate in and complete the reasonable recommendations and requirements of the Kansas Nurses Assistance Program (KNAP); sign releases of information necessary for KNAP to evaluate and monitor respondent and for KNAP to report information to the board. Respondent will be deemed to have completed the KNAP program when KNAP issues written notification that respondent has completed the program. Noncompliance with KNAP is a violation of this agreement.

(c) Respondent must submit to random drug screens as determined or selected by the Board or by KNAP. The costs of the drug screens will be paid by the respondent. Respondent agrees that a Positive Drug Screen is a violation of this agreement.

(d) Respondent may have a narcotic key restriction on respondent's license for the first six (6) months after respondent enrolls in KNAP. The narcotic key restriction prohibits the respondent from possessing, transferring, or having access to narcotics. The narcotic key restriction also prohibits the respondent from supervising nurses or others that have access to narcotics. After respondent completes six (6) months of employment that requires a nursing license, without violating any terms of this agreement, respondent may request that the narcotic key restriction be removed from respondent's license. Respondent's request shall include written verification from respondent's employer, to the Kansas State Board of Nursing, as to whether the respondent has been employed in a position that requires a nursing license; as to whether the respondent has held that position for at least six (6) months;

as to whether the respondent has passed, wasted, had access to, or supervised others that had access to narcotics. With a showing that the narcotic key restriction term of this agreement has been met by the respondent, and the respondent is compliant with all other terms of this agreement, the narcotic key restriction will be removed from respondent's license.

(e) Respondent shall immediately notify the Legal Division of any use of alcohol, if prohibited by KNAP, or controlled substances, or any violation of this Final Order and Consent Agreement and Final Order.

(f) The respondent shall immediately inform all employers and prospective employers of this Final Order and Consent Agreement.

(g) Licensee shall not practice without onsite supervision by a qualified nurse (RN), for a period of one year from the date of nursing employment. The parties agree that this provision prohibits the Licensee from practicing nursing unless the supervising nurse is present within the same facility as the Licensee and the supervising nurse is available for periodic inspection of Licensee's nursing tasks.

(h) Respondent shall not seek or accept employment with a nursing registry, a temporary nursing service or agency, a home health care service or agency, as a private duty nurse, nursing or care home, or rehabilitation center without prior written consent of the Board. Respondent is allowed to work at Elmhaven East and Elmhaven West in Parsons, Kansas where he works in a medical records position, primarily, that does not involve patient care and if he provides any patient care, he will be supervised by an RN at all times. Respondent is also allowed to work at the Medical Lodge in Pittsburg, Kansas as long as an RN supervisor is present to supervise the Respondent at all times. His position at Medical Lodge involves patient care and Respondent agrees to submit eight (8) quarterly reports from the facility as outlined in item 16(i) below. If the Respondent leaves employment with any of these employers, he must immediately contact the Board with the reasons for doing so. Respondent cannot accept new or additional employment from a nursing registry, a temporary nursing service or agency, a

home health care service or agency, as a private duty nurse, nursing or care home, or rehabilitation center without prior written consent of the Board.

(i) Respondent will submit Reports from the respondent's employer to the attention of the Legal Division, Kansas State Board of Nursing, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Suite 1051, Topeka, Kansas 66612-1230 on the following schedule:

Prior to respondent securing employment that utilizes his or her nursing license, respondent is to mail to the Kansas State Board of Nursing a statement indicating that respondent has not yet secured employment which utilizes respondent's nursing license. This statement is due by the 10th day of each month beginning the next month after signing this consent agreement.

Once respondent is employed in a position that utilizes his or her nursing license, or if respondent is currently employed in a position that utilizes his or her nursing license, a nursing performance report is due by the 10th day of every third Month until respondent has caused the submission of eight (8) separate nursing performance reports.

The report shall be prepared and signed by respondent's immediate supervisor or by an R.N. who evaluates respondent's performance on a regular basis and be based on the following guidelines:

- (1) Incorporation of information on facility letterhead stationary is preferred.
- (2) Letter format is acceptable, with the date of the report identified.
- (3) Evaluator's name, telephone number, address, license number and nursing credentials.
- (4) Respondent's name, address, telephone number, license number.
- (5) A short explanation of the respondent's work performance in the following areas:
 - (a) Standards met regarding facility policies and procedures.
 - (b) Compliance with the Kansas Nurse Practice Act.
 - (c) Supervisor evaluations.

(d) Overall appropriateness.

(e) Interactions with patients.

(f) Interactions with staff and administration.

(j) Respondent shall send a money order for \$70 to the Board upon entering into this agreement to pay the cost of this action.

(k) Respondent shall not violate the Kansas Nurse Practice Act during the duration of this agreement.

(l) Respondent shall not violate the laws of the United States, of State, or of any political subdivision of any State during the term of this agreement. Traffic infractions shall not be considered violations of the law.

(m) The respondent will complete ten (10) hours of Continuing Nurses Education (CNE) on the topic of Patient Rights and ten (10) hours of CNE on Patient Abuse. Respondent is to submit the original certificates for proof of the completion of the hours within 30 days of this agreement. Respondent may not use these hours to meet the CNE requirements of any renewal period.

(n) Respondent agrees to notify the Legal Division of any changes in address and phone number as well as all employment terminations or employer changes or additions. All such notifications shall be made in writing within fourteen (14) days of such a change.

17. Respondent acknowledges and agrees that Respondent is responsible for the costs related to satisfying the conditions and requirements of this Final Order and Consent Agreement. Respondent further acknowledges and agrees that to provide the Board with false information regarding compliance with this Final Order and Consent Agreement is a violation of this Final Order and Consent Agreement.

18. If Respondent does not meet these conditions and requirements, the Kansas State Board of Nursing may request additional sanctions against Respondent's license or application for a license. Respondent would be sent notice of such action and would be entitled to a

hearing as to whether Respondent had complied with this Final Order and Consent Agreement, but Respondent could not contest the violations listed in this agreement.

19. All parties understand that if an action based on failure to meet the conditions and requirements of this Consent Agreement is filed, K.S.A. 77-531 requires the Notice of Hearing to be served upon the Respondent and the Respondent's attorney of record, if any. All parties agree that only serving the Notice of Hearing upon the Respondent will be proper service and it is the Respondent's responsibility to contact his or her attorney, if any, in reference to the action.

20. Respondent acknowledges and agrees that if any action based on failure to meet the conditions and requirements of this Final Order and Consent Agreement is filed during the term of this Final Order and Consent Agreement, or within 30 days after the expiration date, the conditions of this Final Order and Consent Agreement shall continue in effect until the Board or a hearing/presiding officer designated pursuant to K.S.A. 77-514 and K.S.A. 77-526, rules on the action.

21. Respondent acknowledges and agrees that upon a first finding of Respondent not complying with any of the conditions or requirements of this Final Order and Consent Agreement, the Stay of Suspension of Respondent's license to practice nursing in the State of Kansas, shall be lifted for a period of six months from the date of said finding. Respondent will not be allowed to practice nursing in the state of Kansas during the period of suspension. Respondent acknowledges and agrees that all conditions and requirements of this Final Order and Consent Agreement remain in effect during the period of suspension.

22. Respondent acknowledges and agrees that upon a second or subsequent finding of Respondent not complying with any of the conditions or requirements of this Final Order and Consent Agreement the Stay of Suspension of Respondent's license to practice nursing in the State of Kansas, shall be lifted for a period of one year from the date of said finding. Respondent will not be allowed to practice nursing in the state of Kansas during the period of

suspension. Respondent acknowledges and agrees that all conditions and requirements of this Final Order and Consent Agreement remain in effect during the period of suspension.

23. Respondent acknowledges and agrees that upon the Stay of Suspension being lifted due to a finding of non-compliance with any of the conditions or requirements of this Final Order and Consent Agreement, the Suspension will not again be Stayed until the Respondent has, following the prescribed time period of suspension, provided written verification to the Board that Respondent is in compliance and has remained in compliance during the period of suspension, with all conditions and requirements of this Final Order and Consent Agreement. Upon the Respondent providing said written verification the suspension will again be stayed.

24. The Board will inactivate this case file once respondent satisfies this agreement. This agreement does not prohibit the agency from taking disciplinary action against Respondent's license for any additional or cumulative violation of the Kansas Nurse Practice Act committed by the Respondent before or after this agreement is entered into.

25. This Agreement is a discipline and must be reported on any future renewal or reinstatement applications. This agreement is a contract entered into by the parties to resolve an investigative case. The original of this agreement shall be placed in the Agency Record. This Agreement is a public record and will be reported to national disciplinary data banks.

26. After successful completion of all of the conditions and requirements of this Final Order and Consent Agreement by the respondent, the Final Order and Consent Agreement will be satisfied and the case will be inactivated.

27. By signing this Final Order and Consent Agreement, Respondent acknowledges that Respondent has read and understands the entire document, and agrees to be bound by its terms. This Final Order and Consent Agreement constitute the entire agreement of the parties and may not be modified except in writing and approved by all parties. The effective date of this Final Order and Consent Agreement is the date shown on the certificate of service.

28. The hearing/presiding officer whose signature appears below has been designated pursuant to K.S.A. 77-514 and K.S.A. 77-526 to act on behalf of the Board/agency head and to hear discipline cases on behalf of the Board/agency head and to render either initial orders or final orders, if by agreement of both parties, in those discipline cases.

Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-531, if the final order is served by mail, three days are added to the time limits set out above.


