The Respondent appeared in person by telephone. The Kansas State Board of Nursing appeared by and through Assistant Attorney General Rex G. Beasley, Disciplinary Counsel for the Board.

THEREUPON Respondent announced that instead of proceeding to hearing she desired to withdraw her application to practice nursing and consented to the entry of an order denying the reinstatement application.

The Respondent acknowledged that the Board was prepared to prove the allegations of the petition and that although this case will be closed the disciplinary action against Respondent will remain pending. In the event Respondent ever seeks reinstatement again the pending disciplinary action will be reactivated.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the Respondent's reinstatement application should be, and is hereby, denied. This case will be closed but the underlying disciplinary action against Respondent will remain pending. In the event Respondent ever seeks reinstatement again the pending disciplinary action will be reactivated. Costs of the action in the sum of thirty-five (\$35.00) dollars are hereby taxed to Respondent and shall be paid to the Board by cash, or money order within 30 days of the date of this Order.

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PETITION

COMES NOW the Petitioner, the Kansas State Board of Nursing by and through its Disciplinary Counsel, Assistant Attorney General Rex G. Beasley, and initiates these proceedings under the provisions of K.S.A. 65-1120, and for its cause of action, alleges and states:

- Respondent's mailing address last known to the Board is 1119 S. Emporia Wichita,
 Kansas 67221.
- 2. Respondent was formerly licensed to practice as a licensed practical nurse (L.P.N.) in the State of Kansas, having been issued license no. 24-018487-052. Respondent allowed her license to lapse on May 31, 1990
- 3. The Kansas State Board of Nursing, hereinafter referred to as the "Board," has received information, conducted an investigation, and determined there are reasonable grounds to

believe Respondent has committed acts in violation of the Kansas Nurse Practice Act, K.S.A. 65-1113 et seq.

- 4. The Board has requested the office of the Attorney General to prosecute this action. Carla J. Stovall is the duly elected and acting Attorney General for the State of Kansas.
- 5. Since the original issuance of the license, Respondent committed numerous acts in violation of K.S.A. 65-1113 et. seq.
- 6. Even though she had no license, Respondent, contrary to K.S.A. 65-1120 (a)(1), fraudulently and deceptively held herself out as being licensed and through that fraud and deception sought, obtained, or retained employment, contrary to K.S.A. 65-1114, as an L.P.N. at Bethany Medical Center 51 North 12th Street Kansas City, Kansas until October 7, 1991.
- 7. While working as an unlicensed L.P.N. at Bethany Medical Center, Respondent allegedly committed several acts (in addition to practicing without a license) in violation of the Kansas Nurse Practice act including, performing tasks for which she was not qualified and which were a violation of the Medical Center policies and procedures and by not disclosing to her coworkers that she was not a registered nurse. Said conduct is contrary to K.S.A. 65-1120.
- 8. Knowing that she was subject to termination and that her conduct would be reported to the Board, Respondent chose to resign effective October 7, 1991.
- 9. The Board took no disciplinary action against Respondent at that time because before the Board was notified of her violations of the Kansas Nurse Practice Act, she allowed her license to lapse, and had apparently stopped nursing in Kansas.
- 11. On November 20, 1997 Respondent submitted an application for reinstatement of a license as and L.P.N. On December 2, 1997 Respondent paid the application fee in full.

- 12. Even though she had no license, Respondent, contrary to K.S.A. 65-1120 (a)(1), fraudulently and deceptively held herself out as being licensed and through that fraud and deception sought, obtained, or retained employment, contrary to K.S.A. 65-1114, as an L.P.N. at the Wichita Children's Home 810 North Holyoke Wichita, Kansas from November 24, 1997 through January 12, 1998. A letter from the Children's Home is attached hereto as exhibit A.
- 13. When asked about the status of her license in December 1997, Respondent told the Children's Home that her application had been returned to her because it was "\$3.00 short in fees." Respondent's representation was false and constitutes a violation of K.S.A. 65-1120.
- 14. Respondent was notified by the Board on January 5, 1998, and again on January 12, 1998, that she was unlicensed and should not represent herself or obtain employment in Kansas as an L.P.N. Copies of the notices to Respondent on January 5, 1998 and January 12, 1998 are attached hereto as exhibits B and C.
- 15. On January 13, 1998 Respondent was asked by the Board's investigator about her unauthorized practice of nursing, contrary to K.S.A. 65-114. Respondent did not deny she has practiced without a license; she stated "personally conscience wise I did not feel I was doing anything wrong."

WHEREFORE, Petitioner prays the Board serve the Respondent with a copy of this Petition and a copy of a Notice of Hearing as required by law. Petitioner further prays that upon evidence presented at the hearing, the Board make findings and conclusions that Respondent has committed acts in violation of the Kansas Nurse Practice Act, and that the Board take and impose such disciplinary action as it shall deem just and proper.
