**NOTICE OF FORMAL ADMINISTRATIVE HEARING
AND STATEMENT OF ALLEGATIONS**

You are hereby notified that a Formal Hearing has been scheduled before the Board of Nursing (“Board”) regarding your license to practice professional nursing in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

TYPE OF PROCEEDING:	This is a formal administrative hearing before a panel of the Board.
DATE AND TIME:	November 15, 2017 1:00 P.M.
PLACE:	Virginia Department of Health Professions Perimeter Center - 9960 Mayland Drive 2 nd Floor - Virginia Conference Center Henrico, Virginia 23233

LEGAL AUTHORITY AND JURISDICTION:

1. This formal hearing is being held pursuant to Virginia Code §§ 2.2-4020, 2.2-4024(F), and 54.1-2400(11). This proceeding will be convened as a public meeting pursuant to Virginia Code § 2.2-3700.

2. At the conclusion of the proceeding, the Board is authorized to take any of the following actions:
 - Exonerate you;
 - Reprimand you;
 - Require you to pay a monetary penalty;
 - Place you on probation and/or under terms and conditions;
 - Suspend your license;
 - Revoke your license.

ABSENCE OF RESPONDENT AND RESPONDENT'S COUNSEL:

If you fail to appear at the formal hearing, the Board may proceed to hear this matter in your absence and may take any of the actions outlined above.

RESPONDENT'S LEGAL RIGHTS:

You have the right to the information on which the Board will rely in making its decision, to be represented by counsel at this proceeding, to subpoena witnesses and/or documents, and to present relevant evidence on your behalf.

COMMONWEALTH'S EXHIBITS:

Enclosed is a copy of the documents that will be distributed to the members of the Board and will be considered by the Board when discussing any allegations with you and when deliberating on your case. **These documents are enclosed only with the notice sent by certified mail, which you may be required to claim at the post office. Please bring these documents with you to the formal hearing.**

FILING DEADLINES:

1. Deadline for filing exhibits: **November 3, 2017**. Submit 15 copies of all documents you want the Board to consider to Darlene Graham, Board of Nursing, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite 300, Henrico, Virginia 23233. Exhibits may not be sent by facsimile or e-mail. Please note that any documentation or evidence that you previously submitted for an informal conference that is not already part of the Commonwealth's evidence must be resubmitted as an exhibit if you want the Board to consider it at the hearing.

The Commonwealth must file any objections to your submissions in writing, addressed to Darlene Graham at the Board office, no later than **November 7, 2017**. If no objections have been received by **November 7, 2017**, the evidence will be distributed to the Board members for their review, and will be considered by the Board as evidence when it deliberates upon your case. If the Commonwealth raises objections, you have until **November 9, 2017**, to file your response to the objections, in writing and addressed to Darlene Graham at the Board office. The Chair of the proceeding will rule on the motion.

2. Deadline for filing motions: **November 3, 2017**, addressed to Darlene Graham at the above address.

3. Deadline for filing any objections to the Commonwealth's exhibits, in writing, to Darlene Graham at the above address: **November 3, 2017**. If you do not file objections by this date, the exhibits will be distributed to the Board members for their review prior to your hearing, and will be considered by the Board as evidence when it deliberates on your case. If you do file objections, the Commonwealth has until **November 7, 2017** to file a response to the objections, in writing, and addressed to Darlene Graham at the Board office. The Chair of the proceeding will rule on the motion. NOTE: failure to object to the distribution of the Commonwealth's exhibits prior to the proceeding will not affect your right to contest any information contained in those exhibits at the proceeding.

REQUEST FOR A CONTINUANCE:

Absent exigent circumstances, such as personal or family illness, a request for a continuance after **November 3, 2017** will not be considered. If you obtain counsel, you should do so as soon as possible, as a motion for a continuance due to the unavailability of counsel will not be considered unless received by **November 3, 2017**.

STATEMENT OF ALLEGATIONS

The Board alleges that:

1. At all times relevant hereto, Jody Lynn Martin Hall, R.N., was licensed to practice professional nursing in the Commonwealth of Virginia.


2. Jody Lynn Martin Hall, R.N., violated Virginia Code § 54.1-3007(2) and (5) and 18 VAC 90-20-300(A)(2)(c) of the Regulations Governing the Practice of Nursing (currently found at 18 VAC 90-19-230(A)(2)(c) effective February 24, 2017) in that, during the course of her employment at Evergreen Health and Rehabilitation, Winchester, Virginia (“Evergreen”), on or about April 1, 2016, she diverted controlled substances for her own personal and unauthorized use. Specifically, a coworker witnessed Ms. Hall remove ten tablets of hydrocodone-acetaminophen, 5mg-325mg (C-II), a controlled substance, from the medication card of a discharged resident, place two of the tablets into a sharps container for wastage and place the remainder of the tablets in her pocket.

3. Ms. Hall violated Virginia Code § 54.1-3007(7) in that, on or about October 26, 2010, she entered into a Consent Order with the Maryland Board of Nursing (“Maryland Board”) which placed her on probation for a minimum of five years, subject to certain terms and conditions. The action taken against Ms. Hall’s licensure was based, in part, upon the following findings:

a. In about June 2000, the Maryland Board received a complaint that during a two-week period, Ms. Hall withdrew 139 doses of Percocet (hydrocodone-acetaminophen, C-II) for patients that had no physician orders for the medication.

b. On or about June 8, 2000, Ms. Hall submitted to a drug screen which was positive for oxycodone.

c. On or about November 20, 2000, Ms. Hall entered into a participation agreement with the Maryland Board's Rehabilitation Committee. On or about November 21, 2003, Ms. Hall was expelled from the Rehabilitation Program due to noncompliance with her agreement, in part, because her employment was terminated due to suspicions that she diverted Flexeril from a patient's home, she failed to submit required reports and she failed to submit to required drug screens.
