ORDER

JURISDICTION AND PROCEDURAL HISTORY

Pursuant to Virginia Code §§ 2.2-4020, 2.2-4024(F), and 54.1-2400(11), a panel of the Virginia Board of Nursing ("Board") held a formal administrative hearing on May 17, 2017, in Henrico County, Virginia, to receive and act upon Tammy Ann Harris' application for reinstatement of her license to practice practical nursing in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

Tammy Ann Harris, L.P.N. Reinstatement Applicant, appeared at this proceeding and was not represented by legal counsel.

NOTICE

By letter dated May 2, 2017, the Board sent a Notice of Formal Hearing ("Notice") to Ms. Harris notifying her that a formal administrative hearing would be held on May 17, 2017. The Notice was sent by certified and first class mail to the legal address of record on file with the Board.

Upon consideration of the evidence, the Board adopts the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and issues the Order contained herein.

FINDINGS OF FACT

On July 17, 1996, the Board issued License Number 0002-053181 to Tammy Ann
Harris, L.P.N. Reinstatement Applicant to practice practical nursing in the Commonwealth of Virginia.
Said license was mandatorily suspended by Department of Health Professions ("DHP") on January 24,

- 2017. Her primary state of residence is Virginia. Ms. Harris also holds licenses to practice practical nursing in Minnesota (79407) and North Dakota (L14752).
- 2. On December 30, 2016, the Minnesota Board of Nursing suspended Ms. Harris' license to practice in that state, after making a finding that Ms. Harris owed the state \$500.00 or more in delinquent taxes, penalties, or had not filed tax returns.
- 3. On February 17, 2017, the Minnesota Board of Nursing issued an Order of Unconditional License for Ms. Harris, which reinstated her license to practice practical nursing in that state, after finding that she had complied with and fulfilled all the conditions of the December order suspending her license.
- 4. Ms. Harris is currently employed at Autumn Care of Altavista as an assistant to the social worker. She had been working as a nurse at that facility until her mandatory suspension and intends to return to nursing once her license is reinstated.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. Finding of Fact No. 2 constitutes a violation of Virginia Code § 54.1-3007(7).
- 2. Tammy Ann Harris, L.P.N. Reinstatement Applicant otherwise meets the requirements of Virginia Code § 54.1-3020.

ORDER

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the Virginia Board of Nursing hereby ORDERS as follows:

1. WHEREFORE, the Virginia Board of Nursing, by affirmative vote of at least three-fourths of the members of the Board at the proceeding, effective upon entry of this Order, ORDERS that the license issued to Tammy Ann Harris, L.P.N. Reinstatement Applicant, to practice practical nursing in the Commonwealth of Virginia is REINSTATED without restriction.

2. Ms. Harris shall comply with all laws and regulations governing the practice of practical nursing in the Commonwealth of Virginia.
