CONSENT ORDER

JURISDICTION AND PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The Virginia Board of Nursing ("Board") and Myra Jo Easter, R.N., as evidenced by their signatures hereto, in lieu of proceeding to a formal administrative proceeding, enter into the following Consent Order affecting Ms. Easter's license to practice professional nursing in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. Myra Jo Easter, R.N., was issued License Number 0001-159451 to practice professional nursing on June 25, 1998, which is scheduled to expire on December 31, 2018. Her primary state of residence is Virginia.
- 2. By Order entered October 5, 2016, the Board suspended Ms. Easter's license and stayed the suspension contingent on her entry into and compliance with the Health Practitioners' Monitoring Program ("HPMP").
 - 3. Ms. Easter entered the HPMP on September 26, 2016.
- 4. By Decision and Order entered April 3, 2017, the California Board of Registered Nursing accepted the surrender by Myra Jo Easter, R.N., of her license to practice as a registered nurse in the State of California. This action was based on the action taken by the Virginia Board of Nursing on October 5, 2016. Pursuant to Virginia Code § 54.1-2409, on May 16, 2017, the Virginia Department of Health Professions suspended Ms. Easter's professional nursing license based on the action of the California Board.

- 5. As of April 13, 2017, Ms. Easter is considered to be in partial compliance with her Recovery Monitoring Contract with the HPMP.
- 6. The matter of the reinstatement of Ms. Easter's license to practice professional nursing in the Commonwealth of Virginia is properly before the Board.

CONSENT

Myra Jo Easter, R.N., by affixing her signature to this Consent Order, agrees to the following:

- 1. I have been advised to seek advice of counsel prior to signing this document;
- 2. I am fully aware that without my consent, no legal action can be taken against me or my license except pursuant to the Virginia Administrative Process Act, Virginia Code § 2.2-4000 et seq.;
- 3. I acknowledge that I have the following rights, among others: the right to a formal administrative hearing before the Board; the right to representation by counsel; and the right to cross-examine witnesses against me;
 - I waive my right to a formal hearing;
- 5. I admit to the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law contained herein and waive my right to contest such Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and any sanction imposed hereunder in any future judicial or administrative proceeding in which the Board is a party;
- 6. I consent to the entry of the following Order affecting my licensure to practice professional nursing in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

ORDER

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the Virginia Board of Nursing hereby ORDERS as follows:

1. The license of Myra Jo Easter, R.N., to practice professional nursing in the Commonwealth of Virginia is reinstated.

- 2. The license of Myra Jo Easter, R.N., is INDEFINITELY SUSPENDED.
- The license will be recorded as suspended.
- 4. The suspension is STAYED and shall remain stayed contingent upon Ms. Easter's continued compliance with all terms and conditions of the HPMP for the period specified by the HPMP.
- 5. Upon receipt of evidence of Ms. Easter's participation in and successful completion of the terms specified by the HPMP, the Board, at its discretion, may waive Ms. Easter's appearance before the Board and conduct an administrative review of this matter, at which time she may be issued an unrestricted license.
- 6. This Order is applicable to Ms. Easter's multistate licensure privileges, if any, to practice professional nursing. For the duration of this Order, Ms. Easter shall not work outside of the Commonwealth of Virginia pursuant to a multistate licensure privilege without the written permission of the Virginia Board of Nursing and the Board of Nursing in the party state where she seeks to work. Any requests for out of state employment should be directed, in writing, to the Executive Director of the Board.
- 7. Myra Jo Easter, R.N., shall comply with all laws and regulations governing the practice of nursing in the Commonwealth of Virginia.
- 8. Failure to comply with the terms and conditions of the stay of suspension shall result in the immediate rescission of the stay of suspension of the license of Myra Jo Easter, R.N., and the license shall be recorded as suspended. After any rescission of the stay of suspension, Ms. Easter may, within 33 days of the effective date of the rescission, request a formal administrative hearing before the Board.

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On or about March 22, 2005, the Board issued Registered Nurse License No. 654950 3. to Myra Jo Easter (Respondent). The Registered Nurse License expired on January 31, 2017, and has not been renewed.

JURISDICTION

Under Business and Professions Code section 2751, the Board, in its discretion, may 4. accept the surrender of a license through a stipulated settlement in the absence of a pleading when the ability of a registered nurse to safely practice nursing is impaired due to mental illness.

ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS

- Respondent has carefully read and understands the effects of this Stipulated Surrender 5. of License and Order.
- Respondent is fully aware of her legal rights in this matter, including the right to a hearing; the right to be represented by counsel, at her own expense; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against her: the right to present evidence and to testify on her own behalf: the right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration and court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.
- Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and 7. every right set forth above.

CULPABILITY

Respondent's ability to practice as a Registered Nurse is currently impaired due to a 8. physical or mental filmess. On or about October 5, 2016, in a matter entitled In re Myra Jo Easter, R.N., License No. 0001-159451, Case Nos. 170839 and 170423, the Virginia Board of Nursing (Virginia Board) entered an Order accepting and adopting the Recommended Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law of the Agency Subordinate that the license of Myra Jo Easter to practice professional nursing in the Commonwealth of Virginia and her multistate privilege to practice professional nursing be indefinitely suspended because she was unable to practice safely due to physical or mental impairment. The Order permitted a stay of the suspension upon proof

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 of Respondent's entry into a contract with the Virginia Health Practitioner Monitoring Program (HPMP). The Order became final on November 7, 2016.

- Respondent admits that she is physically and/or mentally unable to safely perform the duties of and function as a registered nurse.
- 10. Respondent understands that by signing this stipulation she enables the Board to issue an order accepting the surrender of her Registered Nurse License without further process.

CONTINGENCY

- and agrees that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Board may communicate directly with the Board regarding this stipulation and surrender, without notice to or participation by Respondent. By signing the stipulation, Respondent understands and agrees that she may not withdraw her agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the Board considers and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this stipulation as its Decision and Order, the Stipulated Surrender and Disciplinary Order shall be of no force or effect and, except for this paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, and the Board shall not be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter.
- 12. The parties understand and agree that Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile copies of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, including Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile signatures thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals.
- 13. This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order is intended by the parties to be an integrated writing representing the complete, final, and exclusive embodiment of their agreement. It supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements, understandings, discussions, negotiations, and commitments (written or oral). This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order may not be altered, amended, modified, supplemented, or otherwise changed except by a writing executed by an authorized representative of each of the parties.
 - 14. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that

the Board may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following Order:

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Registered Nurse License No. 654950, issued to Respondent Myra Jo Easter, is surrendered and accepted by the Board of Registered Nursing.

- 1. The surrender of Respondent's Registered Nurse License and the acceptance of the surrendered license by the Board shall constitute the imposition of discipline against Respondent. This stipulation constitutes a record of the discipline and shall become a part of Respondent's license history with the Board of Registered Nursing.
- Respondent shall lose all rights and privileges as a nurse in California as of the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.
- 3. Respondent shall cause to be delivered to the Board her pocket license and, if one was issued, her wall certificate on or before the effective date of the Decision and Order.
- 4. If Respondent ever files an application for licensure or a petition for reinstatement in the State of California, the Board shall treat it as a petition for reinstatement. Any reinstatement proceeding shall be conducted pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 2760.1. Respondent must comply with all the laws, regulations and procedures for reinstatement of a surrendered license in effect at the time the petition is filed, and all of the charges and allegations contained in this Stipulation shall be deemed to be true, correct, and admitted by Respondent when the Board determines whether to grant or deny the petition. Upon seeking reinstatement, it is the responsibility of the former licensee to submit competent evidence of the ability to safely and competently practice as a registered nurse.
- 5. If and when Respondent's license is reinstated, she shall pay to the Board costs associated with its investigation and enforcement pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3 in the amount of \$1,540.00. Respondent shall be permitted to pay these costs in a payment plan approved by the Board. Nothing in this provision shall be construed to prohibit the Board from reducing the amount of cost recovery upon reinstatement of the license.
- 6. Respondent may petition the Board for reinstatement after a period of not less than one (1) year from the effective date of the Board of Registered Nursing's Decision and Order.
