NOTICE OF HEARING

Pursuant to §§ 2.2-4020, 2.2-4024(F), and 54.1-2400(11) of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended ("Code"), Elizabeth M. Robertson, who, prior to its suspension by the Department of Health Professions on December 10, 2008, held Certificate No. 1401-123528 to practice as a nurse aide in Virginia, is hereby given notice that a formal administrative hearing will be held in the presence of a panel of the Board of Nursing. The hearing will be held on January 23, 2012, at 2:00 p.m., at the offices of the Department of Health Professions, Board of Nursing, Perimeter Center, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite 201, Henrico, Virginia 23233, at which time Ms. Robertson will be afforded the opportunity to be heard in person or by counsel.

At the hearing, Ms. Robertson has the following rights, among others: the right to representation by counsel; the right to have witnesses subpoenaed and to present witnesses on her behalf; the right to present documentary evidence; and the right to cross-examine adverse witnesses. If Ms. Robertson desires any witnesses to appear on her behalf, she must notify the Director of Administrative Proceedings, Department of Health Professions, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite 300, Henrico, Virginia 23233, in accordance with the Instructions for Requesting Subpoenas.

The purpose of the hearing is to receive and act upon Ms. Robertson's application for reinstatement of her certificate to practice as a nurse aide in Virginia, which was suspended by the Department of Health Professions on December 10, 2008, and to inquire into evidence that Ms. Robertson may have violated

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certain laws and regulations governing nurse aide practice in Virginia, as more fully set forth in the Statement of Particulars below.

The burden rests upon Ms. Robertson, as the applicant, to demonstrate that she is capable of resuming safe and competent practice as a nurse aide in Virginia.

Pursuant to § 54.1-2409 of the Code, reinstatement of Ms. Robertson's certificate requires the affirmative vote of three-fourths of the members of the Board in attendance at the hearing.

STATEMENT OF PARTICULARS

The Board alleges that Elizabeth M. Robertson may have violated § 54.1-3007(4) of the Code in that on or about November 12, 2008, in the Circuit Court of Shenandoah County, Virginia, Ms. Robertson was convicted of two counts of credit card theft, a felony. Said conviction formed the basis of the mandatory suspension of Ms. Robertson's certificate to practice as a nurse aide in Virginia.
