NOTICE OF FORMAL ADMINISTRATIVE HEARING AND STATEMENT OF ALLEGATIONS

You are hereby notified that a Formal Hearing has been scheduled before the Board of Nursing ("Board") regarding your license to practice professional nursing in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

LEGAL AUTHORITY AND JURISDICTION:

- 1. This formal hearing is being held pursuant to Virginia Code §§ 2.2-4020, 2.2-4024(F), and 54.1-2400(11). This proceeding will be convened as a public meeting pursuant to Virginia Code § 2.2-3700.
- 2. At the conclusion of the proceeding, the Board is authorized to take any of the following actions:
 - Exonerate you;
 - Reprimand you;
 - Require you to pay a monetary penalty;
 - Place you on probation and/or under terms and conditions;
 - Suspend your license;
 - Revoke your license.

ABSENCE OF RESPONDENT AND RESPONDENT'S COUNSEL:

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If you fail to appear at the formal hearing, the Board may proceed to hear this matter in your absence and may take any of the actions outlined above.

RESPONDENT'S LEGAL RIGHTS:

You have the right to the information on which the Board will rely in making its decision, to be represented by counsel at this proceeding, to subpoena witnesses and/or documents, and to present relevant evidence on your behalf.

COMMONWEALTH'S EXHIBITS:

Enclosed is a copy of the documents that will be distributed to the members of the Board and will be considered by the Board when discussing any allegations with you and when deliberating on your case. These documents are enclosed <u>only</u> with the notice sent by certified mail, which you may be required to claim at the post office. Please bring these documents with you to the formal hearing.

FILING DEADLINES:

1. Deadline for filing exhibits: March 10, 2017. Submit 15 copies of all documents you want the Board to consider to Darlene Graham, Board of Nursing, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite 300, Henrico, Virginia 23233. Exhibits may not be sent by facsimile or e-mail. Please note that any documentation or evidence that you previously submitted for an informal conference that is not already part of the Commonwealth's evidence must be resubmitted as an exhibit if you want the Board to consider it at the hearing.

The Commonwealth must file any objections to your submissions in writing, addressed to Darlene Graham at the Board office, no later than March 14, 2017. If no objections have been received by March 14, 2017, the evidence will be distributed to the Board members for their review, and will be considered by the Board as evidence when it deliberates upon your case. If the Commonwealth raises objections, you have until March 16, 2017, to file your response to the objections, in writing and addressed to Darlene Graham at the Board office. The Chair of the proceeding will rule on the motion.

- 2. Deadline for filing motions: March 10, 2017, addressed to Darlene Graham at the above address.
- 3. Deadline for filing any objections to the Commonwealth's exhibits, in writing, to Darlene Graham at the above address: March 10, 2017. If you do not file objections by this date, the exhibits will be distributed to the Board members for their review prior to your hearing, and will be considered by the Board as evidence when it deliberates on your case. If you do file objections, the Commonwealth has until March 10, 2017 to file a response to the objections, in writing, and addressed to Darlene Graham at the Board office. The Chair of the proceeding will rule on the motion. NOTE: failure to object to the distribution of the Commonwealth's exhibits prior to the proceeding will not affect your right to contest any information contained in those exhibits at the proceeding.

REQUEST FOR A CONTINUANCE:

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Absent exigent circumstances, such as personal or family illness, a request for a continuance after March 10, 2017 will not be considered. If you obtain counsel, you should do so as soon as possible, as a motion for a continuance due to the unavailability of counsel will not be considered unless received by March 10, 2017.

STATEMENT OF ALLEGATIONS

The Board alleges that:

- 1. At all times relevant hereto, Kristin L. Smith, R.N., was licensed to practice professional nursing in the Commonwealth of Virginia.
 - 2. During the course of her employment with Ministering Angels, Winchester, Virginia:
- a. Ms. Smith violated Virginia Code § 54.1-3007(2), (5), and (8) and 18 VAC 90-20-300(A)(2)(f) (currently found at 18 VAC 90-19-230(A)(2)(f) effective February 24, 2017) of the Regulations Governing the Practice of Nursing ("Regulations") in that:
- i. On or about February 12, 2016, Ms. Smith delayed changing Client A's incontinence briefs for approximately 19 hours without a legitimate therapeutic reason.
- ii. On or about February 12, 2016, Ms. Smith drove Client B in the client's vehicle without a valid driver's license.
- b. Ms. Smith violated Virginia Code § 54.1-3007(2), (5), (6), and (8) and 18 VAC 90-20-300(A)(2)(f) (currently found at 18 VAC 90-19-230(A)(2)(f) effective February 24, 2017) of the Regulations in that on or about February 5, 2016, Ms. Smith arrived late for a home-health appointment with Client C, appearing disoriented and exhibiting slurred speech and unsteadiness.
- c. Ms. Smith violated Virginia Code § 54.1-3007(2), (5), and (8) and 18 VAC 90-20-300(A)(2)(e) and (f) (currently found at 18 VAC 90-19-230(A)(2)(e) and (f) effective February 24, 2017) of the Regulations in that on or about January 22, 2016, Ms. Smith left Client A's residence three hours before the end of her eight-hour shift without authorization or securing replacement coverage. Further, she fraudulently submitted a time sheet for the day attesting that she had worked the full shift.

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Ms. Smith violated Virginia Code § 54.1-3007(5) in that from about October 2015 d. through November 2015, Ms. Smith allowed non-employees to accompany her on visits to clients' homes and to assist in their care.
