ORDER

JURISDICTION AND PROCEDURAL HISTORY

Pursuant to Virginia Code §§ 2.2-4020, 2.2-4024(F), and 54.1-2400(11), a panel of the Virginia Board of Nursing (“Board”) and a member of the Massage Therapy Advisory Board held a formal administrative hearing on January 25, 2017, in Henrico County, Virginia, to inquire into evidence that Juan Carlos Villanueva, L.M.T., may have violated certain laws and regulations governing the practice of massage therapy in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

Juan Carlos Villanueva , L.M.T., did not appear at this proceeding and was not represented by legal counsel.

NOTICE

By letter dated December 29, 2016, the Board sent a Notice of Formal Hearing (“Notice”) to Mr. Villanueva notifying him that a formal administrative hearing would be held on January 25, 2017. The Notice was sent by certified and first class mail to the legal address of record on file with the Board. Accordingly, the panel Chair concluded that adequate notice was provided to Mr. Villanueva and the formal hearing proceeded in his absence.

Upon consideration of the evidence, the Board adopts the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and issues the Order contained herein.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. On October 8, 2004, the Board issued Certificate Number 0019-004930 to Juan Carlos Villanueva to practice as a massage therapist in the Commonwealth of Virginia. As of January 1, 2017, licensure for massage therapists became effective. Said license is scheduled to expire on July 31, 2018. At all times relevant hereto, said certificate/license was in full force and effect.

2. By Order of the Board entered on February 28, 2013, Mr. Villanueva was reprimanded due to a finding that while performing a massage on a client, he unintentionally touched her vaginal area with his fingers, due to poor technique.

3. During the course of his employment with City Massage and Bodywork, McLean, Virginia:

a. On March 30, 2016, Mr. Villanueva picked up a female client's breast and inappropriately massaged it.

b. In August 2015, Mr. Villanueva exposed a second female client's breast during the massage. Also, while massaging her back, he reached underneath to a point that his fingers touched her breasts; and he nearly touched her vaginal area while massaging her upper thighs.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Finding of Fact No. 3 constitutes a violation of Virginia Code § 54.1-3007(2), (5) and (8) and 18 VAC 90-50-90(2)(d) and (i) of the Regulations Governing the Certification of Massage Therapists, as further defined by Section XIV of the National Certification Board for Therapeutic Massage and Bodywork (NCBTMB) Code of Ethics.


ORDER

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the Virginia Board of Nursing hereby ORDERS as follows:

1. The license of Juan Carlos Villanueva to practice as a massage therapist in the Commonwealth of Virginia is REVOKED.
2. The license of Juan Carlos Villanueva will be recorded as REVOKED.
3. Pursuant to Virginia Code § 54.1-2408.2, should Juan Carlos Villanueva seek reinstatement of a license to practice massage therapy after three years, the reinstatement of Mr. Villanueva's license shall require the affirmative vote of three-fourths of the members at a formal administrative proceeding convened by the Board. At such time, the burden shall be on Mr. Villanueva to demonstrate that he is safe and competent to return to practice as a massage therapist. Mr. Villanueva shall be responsible for any fees that may be required for the reinstatement and/or renewal of the license prior to issuance of the license to resume practice.

Pursuant to Virginia Code §§ 2.2-4023 and 54.1-2400.2, the signed original of this Order shall remain in the custody of the Department of Health Professions as a public record, and shall be made available for public inspection and copying upon request.
