NOTICE OF INFORMAL CONFERENCE BEFORE AN AGENCY SUBORDINATE AND STATEMENT OF ALLEGATIONS

You are hereby notified that an informal conference has been scheduled before an Agency Subordinate of the Board of Nursing ("Board") regarding your license to practice professional nursing in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

TYPE OF PROCEEDING:	This is an informal conference before an Agency Subordinate of the Board.
DATE AND TIME:	December 13, 2016 at 2:00 p.m.
PLACE:	Virginia Department of Health Professions Perimeter Center - 9960 Mayland Drive 2 nd Floor - Virginia Conference Center Henrico, Virginia 23233

LEGAL AUTHORITY AND JURISDICTION:

- 1. This informal conference is being held pursuant to Virginia Code §§ 2.2-4019 and 54.1-2400(10). This proceeding will be convened as a public meeting pursuant to Virginia Code § 2.2-3700.
- 2. After consideration of all information, the Agency Subordinate is authorized to take any of the following actions:
- If the Agency Subordinate finds that there is insufficient evidence to warrant further action or that the charges are without foundation, notify you by mail that your record has been cleared of any charge which might affect your right to practice professional nursing in the Commonwealth;
- Recommend findings of fact, conclusions of law and a sanction, to include a reprimand, placing you on probation with terms, suspension or revocation of your license, or imposing a monetary penalty pursuant to § 54.1-2401 of the Code.

Further, the Agency Subordinate may refer this matter for a formal administrative proceeding pursuant to Virginia Code § 2.2-4020.

Board's Review of Agency Subordinate's Recommended Decision

If you appear in person or by counsel at the informal conference, the recommendation of the Agency Subordinate will be presented to a quorum of the Board. The Board may accept or modify the recommendation, or reject the recommendation and refer the case to a formal hearing. If you do not agree with the decision of the Board, you have the right to a formal administrative hearing before the Board.

If you fail to appear in person or by counsel at the informal conference, the recommendation of the Agency Subordinate will be presented to a quorum of the Board. The Board may accept or modify the recommendation, or reject the recommendation and refer the case to a formal hearing. The Board's decision regarding the agency subordinate's recommendation is a final order that can only be appealed to circuit court as provided by Rule 2A:2 of the Supreme Court of Virginia.

ABSENCE OF RESPONDENT AND RESPONDENT'S COUNSEL:

If you fail to appear at the informal conference, the Agency Subordinate may proceed to hear this matter in your absence and may take any of the actions outlined above.

RESPONDENT'S LEGAL RIGHTS:

You have the right to the information on which the Agency Subordinate will rely in making a decision, to be represented by counsel at this proceeding, to subpoena witnesses and/or documents, and to present relevant evidence on your behalf.

INFORMAL CONFERENCE MATERIALS:

Enclosed is a copy of the documents that will be considered by the Agency Subordinate when discussing any allegations with you and when deliberating on your case. These documents are enclosed only with the notice sent by certified mail, which you may be required to claim at the post office. Please bring these documents with you to the informal conference.

FILING DEADLINES:

- 1. Deadline for filing materials: December 6, 2016. Submit five copies of all documents you want the Board to consider to Brenda Krohn, R.N., M.S., Deputy Executive Director, Board of Nursing, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite 300, Henrico, Virginia 23233. Exhibits may not be sent by facsimile or e-mail.
- 2. Deadline for filing motions, including requests for continuance or objections to materials, in writing, to Brenda Krohn, R.N., M.S., Deputy Executive Director, at the above address: December 6, 2016. NOTE: the failure to object to materials does not deprive you of the right to contest their contents at the proceeding.

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REQUEST FOR A CONTINUANCE

Absent exigent circumstances, such as personal or family illness, a request for a continuance after **December 6, 2016**, will not be considered. If you obtain counsel, you should do so as soon as possible, as a motion for a continuance due to the unavailability of counsel will not be considered unless received by **December 6, 2016**.

STATEMENT OF ALLEGATIONS

The Board alleges that:

- 1. At all times relevant hereto, Nolan Floyd Campbell, R.N., was licensed to practice professional nursing in the Commonwealth of Virginia.
- 2. Mr. Campbell violated Virginia Code § 54.1-3007(6) in that he is unsafe to practice as a professional nurse due to substance abuse and/or mental illness, as evidenced by the following:
- a. On or about December 14, 2015, Mr. Campbell presented to Centra Lynchburg General Hospital, Lynchburg, Virginia, following an attempt to commit suicide by hanging. A drug screen performed upon Mr. Campbell's admission was positive for cocaine and alcohol.
- b. On or about December, 15, 2015, Mr. Campbell was admitted to Centra Health Virginia Baptist Hospital, Lynchburg, Virginia, under a temporary detention order for inpatient psychiatric treatment. He was given a diagnosis of major depressive disorder and alcohol abuse with a history of cocaine and opiate abuse. Mr. Campbell was discharged on or about December 21, 2015, with a recommendation to obtain outpatient psychiatric care with Horizon Behavioral Health, Lynchburg, Virginia ("Horizon").
- c. On or about January 28, 2016, Mr. Campbell was arrested and placed in the Blue Ridge Regional Jail, Lynchburg, Virginia ("BRRJ") on a charge of malicious wounding and strangulation. While at BRRJ, Mr. Campbell attempted to hang himself in his cell. He was placed on suicide watch. While on suicide watch, Mr. Campbell was observed inside his cell running to hit his head against the wall. An evaluation conducted by Horizon noted that Mr. Campbell was focused on dying and that he stated that eventually he would kill himself. Horizon concluded that Mr. Campbell is in need of psychiatric admission in order to stabilize him due to his repeated attempts to kill himself. Mr. Campbell was transferred from BRRJ to Centra Lynchburg General Hospital for treatment.

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Pursuant to Virginia Code § 54.1-2400.2(K), the Board considered whether to disclose or not disclose Mr. Campbell's health records or health services.
