CONSENT ORDER

JURISDICTION AND PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The Virginia Board of Nursing ("Board") and Virginia Lynette May, as evidenced by their signatures hereto, in lieu of proceeding to an informal conference, enter into the following Consent Order affecting Ms. May's application for registration by examination to practice as a medication aide in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. Virginia Lynette May submitted an application for registration by examination to practice as a medication aide in the Commonwealth of Virginia on September 28, 2016.
- 2. Ms. May violated Virginia Code § 54.1-3007(4) in that on February 24, 2016, in the General District Court of Rockingham County, Virginia, she was convicted of petit larceny, a misdemeanor crime of moral turpitude. She was sentenced to 30 days incarceration.
 - 4. Ms. May otherwise meets the requirements of Virginia Code § 54.1-3042.

CONSENT

Virginia Lynette May, by affixing her signature to this Consent Order, agrees to the following:

- 1. I have been advised to seek advice of counsel prior to signing this document;
- 2. I am fully aware that without my consent, no legal action can be taken against me except pursuant to the Virginia Administrative Process Act, Virginia Code § 2.2-4000 et seq.;

- 3. I acknowledge that I have the following rights, among others: the right to an informal fact-finding conference before the Board; and the right to representation by counsel;
 - 4. I waive my right to an informal conference;
- 5. I admit to the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law contained herein and waive my right to contest such Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and any sanction imposed hereunder in any future judicial or administrative proceeding in which the Board is a party;
- 6. I consent to the entry of the following Order affecting my application for registration to practice as a medication aide in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

ORDER

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the Virginia Board of Nursing hereby ORDERS as follows:

- 1. The application of Virginia Lynette May for registration to practice as a medication aide in the Commonwealth of Virginia is APPROVED. Upon successful completion of the Medication Aide examination, Ms. May shall be issued an unrestricted registration.
 - Virginia Lynette May is REPRIMANDED.
- 3. Ms. May shall comply with all laws and regulations governing the practice of medication aides in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

Pursuant to Virginia Code §§ 2.2-4023 and 54.1-2400.2, the signed original of this Order shall remain in the custody of the Department of Health Professions as a public record, and shall be made available for public inspection and copying upon request.
