Pursuant to Virginia Code § 54.1-2409, you are hereby given notice that your license to practice professional nursing in the Commonwealth of Virginia has been mandatorily suspended by the enclosed Order entered December 15, 2016. You are hereby advised that you may not practice professional nursing or hold yourself out as a licensed professional nurse unless and until the Board of Nursing has notified you in writing that your license has been reinstated. Please return your license to Jay P. Douglas, Executive Director of the Virginia Board of Nursing ("Board"), at the above address, immediately upon receipt of this letter.

You may apply to the Board for reinstatement of your license, and you shall be entitled to a formal administrative hearing not later than the next regular meeting of the Board after the expiration of 60 days from the Board's receipt of your reinstatement application. The reinstatement of your license shall require the affirmative vote of three-fourths of the members of the Board present at the hearing. ORDER OF MANDATORY SUSPENSION

In accordance with Virginia Code § 54.1-2409, I, David E. Brown, D.C., Director of the Virginia

Department of Health Professions, received and acted upon evidence that the multistate licensure privilege of

Jilaine Ellen Thompson, R.N., to practice professional nursing in the State of Arizona was suspended by the

Arizona State Board of Nursing. A certified copy of the Findings of Public Emergency and Order of Summary

WHEREUPON, by the authority vested in the Director of the Department of Health Professions

pursuant to Virginia Code § 54.1-2409, it is hereby ORDERED that the license of Jilaine Ellen Thompson,

Upon entry of this Order, the license of Jilaine Ellen Thompson, R.N., will be recorded as suspended

FINDINGS OF PUBLIC

CASE NO. 1607080

EMERGENCY AND ORDER OF SUMMARY SUSPENSION

On November 17, 2016, the Arizona State Board of Nursing ("Board") met at 4747 North 7th Street, Ste. 200, Phoenix, Arizona 85014-3655, to consider a complaint filed against Jilaine Thompson ("Respondent"), Virginia compact registered nurse and the privilege to practice nursing in the State of Arizona. Information was presented to the Board and, as a result, the Board made the following Preliminary Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order,

PRELIMINARY FINDINGS OF FACT

1. On the night of July 9-10, 2016, Respondent was working as a registered nurse at Kingman Regional Medical Center in Kingman, Arizona. At approximately 4:00 a.m. on July 10, 2016, Respondent was observed showing signs of impairment, including: slurred speech, swaying, staggering, unsteady walk, drowsy, slow to respond, and unable to answer questions appropriately. Respondent admitted to the Nursing Supervisor that she was impaired.

Respondent was taken for a 'for cause' urine drug test. Respondent had used and unused syringes, carpuject vials with encasing tubes, needles, coband, and blood-soaked paper towels in her pockets. Respondent was bleeding from the right side of her groin. The preliminary fast urine screen was positive for opiates and amphetamines.

confirmation test could not be run because the urine temperature did not show on the test strip.

Respondent subsequently refused to submit to a hair test.

On the morning of July 10, 2016, hospital personnel found Morphine (opiate narcotic) and Hydromorphone (opiate narcotic) syringes, which were kept prefilled and sealed in the Pyxis (automated medication dispensing machine), with broken seals, pierced tops, and missing liquid. Respondent had accessed both the Morphine and the Hydromorphone drawers of the Pyxis during her shift on July 9-10, 2016. On the morning of July 10, 2016, Respondent also failed to account for a 1 mg/ml syringe of Hydromorphone. Respondent told hospital personnel that she had attempted to waste used syringes by placing them back in the drawer with the filled syringes for patient use. It is below the standard of care and extremely dangerous for a nurse to place a partially used prefilled syringe back in a medication drawer with filled syringes ready for patient use. This practice places the patient at risk of receiving contaminated medications and or unknown medications.

PRELIMINARY CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Board has the authority to regulate and control the practice of nursing in the State of Arizona, pursuant to A.R.S. §§ 32-1606, 32-1663, 32-1664, and 41-1092.11(B). The Board also has the authority, pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-1663 and A.R.S. § 32-1664, to impose disciplinary sanctions against the holders of nursing licenses/certified nursing assistants for violations of the Nurse Practice Act, A.R.S. §§ 32-1601 through 1669, and A.A.C. R4-19-101 to R-19-815.
- 2. The conduct and circumstances described in the Preliminary Findings of Fact constitutes unprofessional conduct and grounds to take disciplinary action pursuant to A.R.S. 32-1663 and 32-1664, and violates the following statutes and rules:

A.R.S. § 32-1663 (D) as defined in A.R.S. § 32-1601 (22) (effective August 2, 2012)

- 22. "Unprofessional conduct" includes the following whether occurring in this state or elsewhere:
- (d) Any conduct or practice that is or might be harmful or dangerous to the health of a patient or the public.
- (e) Being mentally incompetent or physically unsafe to a degree that is or might be harmful or dangerous to the health of a patient or the public.
- (g) Willfully or repeatedly violating a provision of this chapter or a rule adopted pursuant to this chapter.
- (h) Committing an act that deceives, defrauds or harms the public.
- (j) Violating this chapter or a rule that is adopted by the board pursuant to this chapter.

A.A.C. § R4-19-403 (adopted effective September 8, 2014)

For purposes of A.R.S. § 32-1601(22)(d), any conduct or practice that is or might be harmful or dangerous to the health of a patient or the public includes one or more of the following:

- 1. A pattern of failure to maintain minimum standards of acceptable and prevailing nursing practice;
- 9. Failing to take appropriate action to safeguard a patient's welfare or follow policies and procedures of the nurse's employer designed to safeguard the patient;
- 16. Removing, without authorization, a narcotic, drug, controlled substance, supply, equipment, or medical record from any health care facility, school, institution, or other work place location;

- A pattern of using or being under the influence of alcohol, drugs, or a similar substance to 17. the extent that judgment may be impaired and nursing practice detrimentally affected, or while on duty in any health care facility, school, institution, or other work location;
- Obtaining, possessing, administering, or using any narcotic, controlled substance, or 18. illegal drug in violation of any federal or state criminal law, or in violation of the policy of any health care facility, school, institution, or other work location at which the nurse practices;
- Practicing in any other manner that gives the Board reasonable cause to believe the health 31. of a patient or the public may be harmed.

FINDING OF PUBLIC EMERGENCY AND ORDER

Based upon the facts and circumstances set forth in the Preliminary Findings of Fact and Preliminary Conclusions of Law, the Board finds that the public health safety and welfare imperatively requires emergency action.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, pursuant to A.R.S. § 41-1092.11(B) and effective immediately, that Jilaine Thompson ("Respondent"), Virginia Compact Registered Nurse, the privilege to practice nursing in the State of Arizona is SUMMARILY SUSPENDED pending proceedings for revocation and other action by the Board. A hearing in this matter shall be promptly instituted and determined.
