Pursuant to Virginia Code § 54.1-2409, you are hereby given notice that your license to practice professional nursing in the Commonwealth of Virginia has been mandatorily suspended by the enclosed Order entered June 8, 2017. You are hereby advised that you may not practice professional nursing or hold yourself out as a licensed professional nurse unless and until the Board of Nursing has notified you in writing that your license has been reinstated. Please return your license to Jay P. Douglas, Executive Director of the Virginia Board of Nursing ("Board"), at the above address, immediately upon receipt of this letter.

You may apply to the Board for reinstatement of your license, and you shall be entitled to a formal administrative hearing not later than the next regular meeting of the Board after the expiration of 60 days from the Board's receipt of your reinstatement application. The reinstatement of your license shall require the affirmative vote of three-fourths of the members of the Board present at the hearing. The reinstatement application can be found at www.dhp.virginia.gov/Nursing.

ORDER OF MANDATORY SUSPENSION

In accordance with Virginia Code § 54.1-2409, I, David E. Brown, D.C., Director of the Virginia

Department of Health Professions, received and acted upon evidence that the California Board of Registered

Nursing revoked the license of Blossom Alyssa Ignacio, R.N., to practice as a registered nurse in the State of

California. A certified copy of the Default Decision and Order of the California Board of Registered Nursing is

attached hereto as Commonwealth's Exhibit 1.

WHEREUPON, by the authority vested in the Director of the Department of Health Professions pursuant

to Virginia Code § 54.1-2409, it is hereby ORDERED that the license of Blossom Alyssa Ignacio, R.N., to practice

professional nursing in the Commonwealth of Virginia is hereby SUSPENDED.

Upon entry of this Order, the license of Blossom Alyssa Ignacio, R.N., will be recorded as suspended and

no longer current and valid. Should Blossom Alyssa Ignacio, R.N., seek reinstatement of her license pursuant to

Virginia Code § 54.1-2409, she shall be responsible for any fees that may be required for the reinstatement of the

license prior to issuance of the license to resume practice.

This Order shall be applicable to Ms. Ignacio's multistate licensure privilege, if any, to practice

professional nursing in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

DEFAULT DECISION AND ORDER

[Gov. Code, §11520]

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. On or about February 22, 2017, Complainant Joseph L. Morris, PhD, MSN, RN, in his official capacity as the Executive Officer of the Board of Registered Nursing, Department of Consumer Affairs, filed Accusation No. 2017-603 against Blossom Alyssa Rico Ignacio (Respondent) before the Board of Registered Nursing. (Accusation attached as Exhibit A.)
- 2. On or about September 28, 2016, the Board of Registered Nursing (Board) issued Registered Nurse License No. 95107241 to Respondent. The Registered Nurse License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on November 30, 2017, unless renewed.
- On or about February 22, 2017, Respondent was served by Certified and First Class
 Mail copies of the Accusation No. 2017-603, Statement to Respondent, Notice of Defense,

Request for Discovery, and Government Code sections 11507.5, 11507.6, and 11507.7 to Respondent's address of record which, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 136 and Title 16, California Code of Regulation, section 1409.1, is required to be reported and maintained with the Board, was and is:

On or about February 22, 2017, Respondent was also served by Certified and First Class Mail copies of the Accusation No. 2017-603, Statement to Respondent, Notice of Defense, Request for Discovery, and Government Code sections 11507.5, 11507.6, and 11507.7 to Respondent's alternate address retrieved from LexisNexis as follows:

- 4. Service of the Accusation was effective as a matter of law under the provisions of Government Code section 11505, subdivision (c) and/or Business & Professions Code section 124.
- 5. On or about March 10, 2017, the Board of Registered Nursing received the Domestic Return Receipts signed by an individual named Bryann Alexandros on March 1, 2017, acknowledging receipt of the Accusation served by Certified Mail to Respondent's address of record and alternate address.
 - 6. Government Code section 11506 states, in pertinent part:
- (c) The respondent shall be entitled to a hearing on the merits if the respondent files a notice of defense, and the notice shall be deemed a specific denial of all parts of the Accusation not expressly admitted. Failure to file a notice of defense shall constitute a waiver of respondent's right to a hearing, but the agency in its discretion may nevertheless grant a hearing.
- 7. Respondent failed to file a Notice of Defense within 15 days after service of the Accusation upon her, and therefore waived her right to a hearing on the merits of Accusation No. 2017-603.
 - 8. California Government Code section 11520 states, in pertinent part:

- (a) If the respondent either fails to file a notice of defense or to appear at the hearing, the agency may take action based upon the respondent's express admissions or upon other evidence and affidavits may be used as evidence without any notice to respondent.
- 9. Pursuant to its authority under Government Code section 11520, the Board after having reviewed the proofs of service dated February 22, 2017, signed by Tram Hoang, finds Respondent is in default. The Board will take action without further hearing and, based on Accusation No. 2017-603 and the documents contained in Default Decision Investigatory Evidence Packet in this matter which includes:

Exhibit 1: Pleadings offered for jurisdictional purposes; Accusation Case No. 2017-603, Statement to Respondent, Notice of Defense (two blank copies),
Request for Discovery and Discovery Statutes (Government Code sections 11507.5, 11507.6 and 11507.7), proofs of service and mail receipts;

Exhibit 2: License History Certification for Blossom Alyssa Rico Ignacio, Registered
Nurse License No. 95107241;

Exhibit 3: Out of State Discipline (Virginia State Board of Nursing);

Exhibit 4: Proof of alternate address retrieved from LexisNexis.

The Board finds that the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 2017-603 are separately and severally true and correct by clear and convincing evidence.

DETERMINATION OF ISSUES

- 1. Based on the foregoing findings of fact, Respondent Blossom Alyssa Rico Ignacio has subjected her following license(s) to discipline:
 - Registered Nurse License No. 95107241
 - 2. The agency has jurisdiction to adjudicate this case by default.
- 3. The Board of Registered Nursing is authorized to revoke Respondent's license(s) based upon the following violations alleged in the Accusation, which are supported by the evidence contained in the Default Decision Investigatory Evidence Packet in this case.
 - Violation of Business and Professions Code section 2761(a)(4) Disciplinary
 action by another State Board of Nursing.

ORDER IT IS SO ORDERED that Registered Nurse License No. 95107241, heretofore issued to Respondent Blossom Alyssa Rico Ignacio, is revoked. Pursuant to Government Code section 11520, subdivision (c), Respondent may serve a written motion requesting that the Decision be vacated and stating the grounds relied on within seven (7) days after service of the Decision on Respondent. The agency in its discretion may vacate the Decision and grant a hearing on a showing of good cause, as defined in the statute. Morris, PhD, MSN, RN (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in 21 his official capacity as the Executive Officer of the Board of Registered Nursing (Board), 22 Department of Consumer Affairs. 23 2. On September 28, 2016, the Board issued Registered Nurse License Number 24 95107241 to Blossom Alyssa Rico Ignacio (Respondent). (BLOSSOM ALYSSA RICO IGNACIO) ACCUSATION

 This Accusation is brought before the Board under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code (Code) unless otherwise indicated.

- 4. Code section 2750 provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may discipline any licensee, including a licensee holding a temporary or an inactive license, for any reason provided in Article 3 (commencing with section 2750) of the Nursing Practice Act.
- 5. Code section 2764 provides, in pertinent part, that the expiration of a license shall not deprive the Board of jurisdiction to proceed with a disciplinary proceeding against the licensee or to render a decision imposing discipline on the license.

STATUTORY PROVISIONS

6. Code section 2761 states:

The board may take disciplinary action against a certified or licensed nurse or deny an application for a certificate or license for any of the following:

- (a) Unprofessional conduct, which includes, but is not limited to, the following:
- (4) Denial of licensure, revocation, suspension, restriction, or any other disciplinary action against a health care professional license or certificate by another state or territory of the United States, by any other government agency, or by another California health care professional licensing board. A certified copy of the decision or judgment shall be conclusive evidence of that action.

COST RECOVERY

7. Code section 125.3 provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case, with failure of the licentiate to comply subjecting the license to not being renewed or reinstated. If a case settles, recovery of investigation and enforcement costs may be included in a stipulated settlement.

CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Virginia - Out of State Discipline)

- 8. Respondent has subjected her Registered Nurse License to disciplinary action under Code section 2761, subdivision (a)(4), in that her license to practice as a professional nurse in Virginia was disciplined by the Commonwealth of Virginia, Department of Health Professions, Board of Nursing (Virginia Board). The circumstances are as follows:
- 9. On November 10, 2016, in Case Numbers: 170641 and 174137, entitled, In Re: Blossom Alyssa Ignacio, R.N., License Number: 0001-231769, the Virginia Board entered an Amended Consent Order reprimanding Respondent. Respondent was ordered to comply with all the terms and conditions of her Participation Contract with the Virginia Health Practitioners' Monitoring Program (HPMP) for the period specified in the contract. Respondent's reprimand encumbered her license to practice professional nursing in the Commonwealth of Virginia and her multistate privilege to practice professional nursing.
- The facts that led to the discipline are that while employed practicing professional nursing at Sentara Princess Anne Hospital in Virginia Beach, Virginia, on October 12, 16, and 18, 2015, and four times on October 26, 2015, Respondent failed to administer narcotic medications as ordered, diverted the medications for her personal and unauthorized use, and falsely documented administration of the medications, in violation of Code of Virginia (CV) section 54.1-3007, subdivisions (2), (5), (6), and (8), and title 18 of the Virginia Administrative Code (VAC) section 90-20-300 (A)(2), subdivisions (c) and (e).
- 11. From April 30, 2015, to October 28, 2015, Respondent received 13 prescriptions for hydromorphone and oxycodone from seven different prescribers at three practices. On June 8, 2015, Respondent obtained two prescriptions for oxycodone from prescribers at two different practices and had them filled at two different pharmacies. On October 30, 2015, Respondent's primary care provider ceased prescribing hydromorphone due to concerns of abuse.

 Respondent's conduct constituted violation of CV section 54.1-3007, subdivision (2), and title 18 of the VAC section 90-20-300, subdivision (A)(2)(e). On November 2, 2015, Respondent's employment at Sentara Princess Anne Hospital was terminated.
