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CONSENT ORDER

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JURISDICTION AND PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The Virginia Board of Nursing ("Board") and Kara Nicole Wilder, L.P.N., as evidenced by their signatures hereto, in lieu of proceeding to a formal administrative proceeding, enter into the following Consent Order affecting Ms. Wilder's license to practice practical nursing in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Kara Nicole Wilder, L.P.N., was issued License Number 0002-092165 to practice practical nursing on March 19, 2015, which is scheduled to expire on November 30, 2017. Her primary state of residence is Virginia
2. By Order of the Department of Health Professions entered September 8, 2015, the license of Kara Nicole Wilder, L.P.N., to practice practical nursing in Virginia was mandatorily suspended pursuant to Virginia Code § 54.1-2409. This Order was based on Ms. Wilder's conviction of felony mail fraud in the United States District Court for the Western District of Texas.
3. The Board of Nursing reinstated Ms. Wilder's license to practice practical nursing by Order entered February 18, 2016, contingent upon her completing the NCSBN course, *Righting a Wrong: Ethics & Professionalism in Nursing*. On February 25, 2016, Ms. Wilder provided proof of completing the course and her license was reinstated.
4. By Opinion and Order entered March 21, 2017, the Texas Board of Nursing revoked Ms. Wilder's license to practice practical nursing. This action was based on Ms. Wilder's mail fraud

conviction in the United States District Court for the Western District of Texas and on the suspension of her practical nursing license in Virginia.

5. Pursuant to Virginia Code § 54.1-2409, by Order of the Virginia Department of Health Professions entered on May 16, 2017, Ms. Wilder's license to practice practical nursing in Virginia was suspended based on the revocation of her license in the State of Texas.

6. The matter of the reinstatement of Ms. Wilder's license to practice practical nursing in Virginia is properly before the Board.

### CONSENT

Kara Nicole Wilder, L.P.N., by affixing her signature to this Consent Order, agrees to the following:


1. I have been advised to seek advice of counsel prior to signing this document;

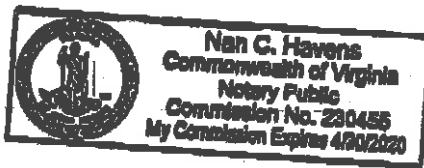

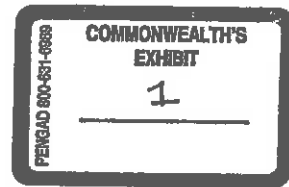

At the regularly scheduled public meeting of the Eligibility and Disciplinary Committee of the Texas Board of Nursing (Committee) on March 21, 2017, the Committee, pursuant to 22 Tex. Admin. Code §213.23, considered the following items: (1) Order No. 1, *Conditional Order of Default Dismissal and Remand*, issued by the ALJ in the above cited matter; (2) Staff's recommendation to the Committee that the Respondent's vocational nursing license be revoked by default; and (3) Respondent's recommendation to the Committee regarding the above cited matter, if any.

On January 17, 2017, the ALJ convened a hearing on the merits in this matter. Staff of the Board was present for the hearing. However, the Respondent was not present at the hearing, and no one appeared on her behalf. During the hearing on January 17, 2017, Staff introduced evidence into the record demonstrating that Respondent had been sent a Notice of Hearing by first class certified mail return-receipt requested to her last known address of record maintained by the Board in accordance with 22 Tex. Admin. Code §213.10(a). The ALJ found that Staff's notice was adequate and issued Order No. 1, *Conditional Order of Default Dismissal and Remand*, granting Staff's Motion for Default and dismissing the case from the docket of SOAH and remanding it to the Board for informal disposition on a default basis in accordance with the Government Code §2001.056 and §2001.058(d-1).

The Committee, after review and due consideration of Order No. 1, issued by the ALJ in the above cited matter, finds that notice of the facts or conduct alleged to warrant disciplinary action has been provided to Respondent in accordance with the Government Code §2001.054(c) and Respondent has been given an opportunity to show compliance with all the requirements of the Occupations Code Chapter 301 (Nursing Practice Act) for retention of Respondent's license to practice vocational nursing in the State of Texas. The Committee further finds that the Formal Charges were properly initiated and filed in accordance with the Occupations Code §301.458. The Committee further finds that proper and timely notice regarding the violations alleged in the Formal Charges was given to Respondent in accordance with the requirements of the Government Code §2001.051 and

§2001.052 and 1 Tex. Admin. Code §155.501. The Committee further finds that the Respondent failed to appear in accordance with 22 Tex. Admin. Code Chapter 213 and 1 Tex. Admin. Code §155.501. As a result of the Respondent's failure to appear, the Committee has determined that the factual allegations listed in the Formal Charges are to be deemed admitted by default and the Committee is authorized to enter a default order against the Respondent pursuant to the Government Code §2001.056 and §2001.058(d-1) and 22 Tex. Admin. Code §213.22. Further, the Committee has determined that it is entitled to revoke the Respondent's vocational nursing license pursuant to 22 Tex. Admin. Code §213.23 and §213.33(m).

Therefore, the Committee hereby adopts the factual allegations, which have been deemed admitted, and the conclusions of law contained in the Formal Charges, which are attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference for all purposes, and Staff's recommended sanction of revocation by default. This Order will be properly served on all parties and all parties will be given an opportunity to file a motion for rehearing in accordance with the Government Code Chapter 2001 and 22 Tex. Admin. Code §213.23(l), as applicable. All parties have a right to judicial review of this Order. All proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law filed by any party not specifically adopted herein are hereby denied.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED THAT Permanent Certificate Number 318642, previously issued to KARA NICOLE WILDER, to practice nursing in the State of Texas be, and the same is hereby, REVOKED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Order SHALL be applicable to Respondent's multi-state privileges, if any, to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

FURTHER, pursuant to the Occupations Code §301.467, RESPONDENT is not eligible to petition for reinstatement of licensure until at least one (1) year has elapsed from the date of this Order. Further, upon petitioning for reinstatement, RESPONDENT must satisfy all then existing requirements for relicensure.

### FORMAL CHARGES

This is a disciplinary proceeding under Section 301.452(b), Texas Occupations Code. Respondent, KARA NICOLE WILDER, is a Vocational Nurse holding License Number 318642, which is in invalid status at the time of this pleading.

Written notice of the facts and conduct alleged to warrant adverse licensure action was sent to Respondent at Respondent's address of record and Respondent was given opportunity to show compliance with all requirements of the law for retention of the license prior to commencement of this proceeding.

#### CHARGE I.

On or about May 13, 2015, Respondent entered a plea of Guilty to MAIL FRAUD, a felony offense ending on or about February 28, 2014, in the United States District Court Western District of Texas San Antonio Division, San Antonio, Texas, under Cause No. SA-15-CR-343(1)-OLG. On or about August 11, 2015, and as a result of the plea, Respondent was placed on probation for a period of two (2) years and ordered to pay restitution in the amount of sixteen thousand nine hundred two dollars and fifty-two cents (\$16,902.52), along with an assessment of one hundred dollars (\$100).

The above action constitutes grounds for disciplinary action in accordance with Section 301.452(b)(3)&(10), Texas Occupations Code, and is a violation of 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(13).

#### CHARGE II.

On or about September 8, 2015, Respondent's license to practice practical nursing in the Commonwealth of Virginia was suspended by the Department of Health Professions for the State of Virginia. A copy of the Order is attached and incorporated, by reference, as part of these Formal Charges.

The above action constitutes grounds for disciplinary action in accordance with Section 301.452(b)(8), Texas Occupations Code.

NOTICE IS GIVEN that staff will present evidence in support of the recommended disposition of up to, and including, revocation of Respondent's license/s to practice nursing in the State of Texas pursuant to the Nursing Practice Act, Chapter 301, Texas Occupations Code and the Board's rules, 22 Tex. Admin. Code §§ 213.27 - 213.33 and TEX. OCC. CODE Ch. 53. Additionally, staff will seek to impose on Respondent the administrative costs of the proceeding pursuant to Section 301.461, Texas Occupations Code. The cost of proceedings shall include, but is not limited to, the cost paid

by the Board to the State Office of Administrative Hearings and the Office of the Attorney General or other Board counsel for legal and investigative services, the cost of a court reporter and witnesses, reproduction of records, Board staff time, travel, and expenses. These shall be in an amount of at least one thousand two hundred dollars (\$1200.00).





**PROBATION**

The defendant is hereby placed on probation for a term of two (2) years.

While on probation, the defendant shall comply with the mandatory and standard and if applicable, the special conditions that have been adopted by this Court, and shall comply with the following additional conditions:

- The defendant shall be allowed to report to the Probation Office in Virginia.
- The defendant will not be required to submit to drug testing.

CONDITIONS OF PROBATION

Mandatory Conditions:

- 1) The defendant shall not commit another federal, state, or local crime during the term of supervision.
- 2) The defendant shall not unlawfully possess a controlled substance.
- 3) The defendant shall refrain from any unlawful use of a controlled substance. The defendant shall submit to one drug test within 15 days of release on probation or supervised release and at least two periodic drug tests thereafter (as determined by the court) for use of a controlled substance, but the condition stated in this paragraph may be ameliorated or suspended by the court if the defendant's presentence report or other reliable sentencing information indicates low risk of future substance abuse by the defendant.
- 4) In supervised release cases only, the defendant must report to the probation office in the district to which the defendant is released within 72 hours of release from custody of the Bureau of Prisons.
- 5) If convicted of a felony, the defendant shall not possess a firearm, ammunition, destructive device, or any other dangerous weapon.
- 6) The defendant shall cooperate in the collection of DNA as directed by the probation officer, if the collection of such a sample is authorized pursuant to section 3 of the DNA Analysis Backlog Elimination Act of 2000 (42 U.S.C. § 14135a).
- 7) If convicted of a sexual offense and required to register under the Sex Offender and Registration Act, that the defendant comply with the requirements of the Act.
- 8) If convicted of a domestic violence crime as defined in 18 U.S.C. § 3561(b), the defendant shall participate in an approved program for domestic violence.
- 9) If the judgment imposes a fine or restitution, it is a condition of supervision that the defendant pay in accordance with the Schedule of Payments sheet of the judgment.

Standard Conditions:

- 1) The defendant shall not leave the judicial district without permission of the court or probation officer.
- 2) The defendant shall report to the probation officer in a manner and frequency directed by the court or probation officer.
- 3) The defendant shall answer truthfully all inquiries by the probation officer and follow the instructions of the probation officer.
- 4) The defendant shall support his or her dependents and meet other family obligations, and shall comply with the terms of any court order or order of an administrative process requiring payments by the defendant for the support and maintenance of a child or of a child and the parent with whom the child is living.
- 5) The defendant shall work regularly at a lawful occupation, unless excused by the probation officer for schooling, training, or other acceptable reasons.
- 6) The defendant shall notify the probation officer at least ten days prior to any change in residence or employment.
- 7) The defendant shall refrain from excessive use of alcohol and shall not purchase, possess, use, distribute, or administer any controlled substance or any paraphernalia related to any controlled substances, except as prescribed by a physician.
- 8) The defendant shall not frequent places where controlled substances are illegally sold, used, distributed, or administered.
- 9) The defendant shall not associate with any persons engaged in criminal activity and shall not associate with any person convicted of a felony, unless granted permission to do so by the probation officer.
- 10) The defendant shall permit a probation officer to visit him or her at any time, at home or elsewhere, and shall permit confiscation of any contraband observed in plain view of the probation officer.
- 11) The defendant shall notify the probation officer within seventy-two hours of being arrested or questioned by a law enforcement officer.

- 12) The defendant shall not enter into any agreement to act as an informer or a special agent of a law enforcement agency without the permission of the court.
- 13) As directed by the probation officer, the defendant shall notify third parties of risks that may be occasioned by the defendant's criminal record or personal history or characteristics, and shall permit the probation officer to make such notifications, and to confirm the defendant's compliance with such notification requirement.
- 14) If convicted of a sex offense as described in the Sex Offender Registration and Notification Act or has a prior conviction of a State or local offense that would have been an offense as described in the Sex Offender Registration and Notification Act if a circumstance giving rise to federal jurisdiction had existed, the defendant shall participate in a sex offender treatment program approved by the probation officer. The defendant shall abide by all program rules, requirements and conditions of the sex offender treatment program, including submission to polygraph testing, to determine if the defendant is in compliance with the conditions of release. The defendant may be required to contribute to the cost of the services rendered (copayment) in an amount to be determined by the probation officer, based on the defendant's ability to pay.
- 15) The defendant shall submit to an evaluation for substance abuse or dependency treatment as directed by the probation officer, and if deemed necessary by the probation officer, the defendant shall participate in a program approved by the probation officer for treatment of narcotic addiction or drug or alcohol dependency which may include testing and examination to determine if the defendant has reverted to the use of drugs or alcohol. During treatment, the defendant shall abstain from the use of alcohol and any and all intoxicants. The defendant may be required to contribute to the cost of the services rendered (copayment) in an amount to be determined by the probation officer, based upon the defendant's ability to pay.
- 16) The defendant shall submit to an evaluation for mental health counseling as directed by the probation officer, and if deemed necessary by the probation officer, the defendant shall participate in a mental health program approved by the probation officer. The defendant may be required to contribute to the cost of the services rendered (copayment) in an amount to be determined by the probation officer, based upon the defendant's ability to pay.
- 17) The defendant shall participate in a cognitive behavioral treatment program as directed by the probation officer, and if deemed necessary by the probation officer. Such program may include group sessions led by a counselor or participation in a program administered by the probation office. The defendant may be required to contribute to the cost of the services rendered (copayment) in an amount to be determined by the probation officer, based upon the defendant's ability to pay.
- 18) The defendant shall participate in workforce development programs and services as directed by the probation officer, and if deemed necessary by the probation officer, which include occupational/career development, including but not limited to assessment and testing, education, instruction, training classes, career guidance, job search and retention services until successfully discharged from the program. The defendant may be required to contribute to the cost of the services rendered (copayment) in an amount to be determined by the probation officer, based upon the defendant's ability to pay.
- 19) If the defendant is excluded, deported, or removed upon release on probation or supervised release, the term of supervision shall be a non-reporting term of probation or supervised release. The defendant shall not illegally reenter the United States. If the defendant lawfully reenters the United States during the term of probation or supervised release, the defendant shall immediately report in person to the nearest U.S. Probation Office.
- 20) If the judgment imposes other criminal monetary penalties, it is a condition of supervision that the defendant pay such penalties in accordance with the Schedule of Payments sheet of the judgment.
- 21) If the judgment imposes a fine, special assessment, restitution, or other criminal monetary penalties, it is a condition of supervision that the defendant shall provide the probation officer access to any requested financial information.
- 22) If the judgment imposes a fine, special assessment, restitution, or other criminal monetary penalties, it is a condition of supervision that the defendant shall not incur any new credit charges or open additional lines of credit without the approval of the probation officer, unless the defendant is in compliance with the payment schedule.

If the defendant makes a partial payment, each payee shall receive an approximately proportioned payment, unless specified otherwise in the priority order or percentage payment column above.
