Pursuant to Section 54.1-2409 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, ("Code"), you are hereby given notice that your license to practice as a practical nurse in the Commonwealth of Virginia has been mandatorily suspended by the enclosed Order entered July 18, 2003. You are hereby advised that, pursuant to Section 54.1-2409.1, any person who practices a profession or occupation after having their license or certificate to do so suspended shall be guilty of a felony.

Section 54.1-2409 of the Code further provides that you may apply to the Board of Nursing ("Board") for reinstatement of your license, and shall be entitled to a hearing not later than the next regular meeting of the Board after the expiration of thirty days from the receipt of such reinstatement application. You have the following rights, among others: to be represented by legal counsel, to have witnesses subpoenaed on your behalf, to present documentary evidence and to cross-examine adverse witnesses. The reinstatement of your license shall require the affirmative vote of three-fourths of the members present of the Board of Nursing.

Whereupon the defendant was arraigned on the remaining charge and the Court having been advised by the defendant, her counsel, and the attorney for the Commonwealth that there has been a plea agreement in this case, and such agreement in writing having been presented to the Court, and now filed herein, and the evidence of the attorney for the Commonwealth, the Court accepts said agreement and the plea of guilty of the defendant tendered in person and finds the defendant guilty of the following offense:

Pursuant to the provisions of Code § 19.2-298.01, the Court has considered and reviewed the applicable discretionary sentencing guidelines and the guidelines worksheets. The sentencing guidelines worksheets and the written explanation of any departure from the guidelines are ordered filed as a part of the record in this case.

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Before pronouncing the sentence, the Court inquired if the defendant desired to make a statement and if the defendant desired to advance any reason why judgment should not be pronounced.

The Court hereby SENTENCES the defendant in accordance with the aforementioned plea agreement to:

Incarceration with the Virginia Department of Corrections for the term of: Five (5) years for Welfare Fraud. The total sentence imposed is five (5) years.

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COMMONWEALTH'S EXHIBIT

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This sentence shall run consecutively with all other sentences.

The Court SUSPENDS five (5) years of the five (5) year sentence for **Welfare Fraud**, for a period of **five (5) years**, for a total suspension of five (5) years, upon the following conditions:

Good behavior. The defendant shall be of good behavior for five (5) years from this day.

The defendant is placed on probation to Supervised probation. commence on her release from incarceration, under the supervision of a Probation Officer for an indefinite period, not to exceed five The defendant shall comply with all the rules and requirements set by the Probation Officer. Probation shall include substance abuse counseling and/or testing as prescribed by the Probation Officer.

The defendant shall pay costs of \$405.00, plus any additional costs as required by Section 17.1-275.5 of the Code of Virginia, payable on a schedule to be determined by the office of probation and parole.

Restitution. The defendant shall make restitution as follows: \$6,261.00 to Department of Social Services, payable on a schedule to be determined by the office of probation. This order is not final with respect to restitution.

Barred from Obtaining DSS Assistance. The defendant cannot obtain assistance from the Department of Social Service within the next five (5) years.

DNA Analysis. The defendant shall submit a sample of her blood for DNA Analysis as required by Statute.

Credit for time served. The defendant shall be given credit for time spent in confinement while awaiting trial pursuant to Code § 53.1-187.
