BEFORE THE BOARD OF NURSING

IN RE: SHEILA D. HOLLIMAN, R.N. REINSTATEMENT APPLICANT

ORDER

Pursuant to §§ 2.2-4019, 2.2-4021, and 54.1-2400(10) of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended (“Code”), a Special Conference Committee (“Committee”) of the Virginia Board of Nursing (“Board”) met on February 2, 2011, in Henrico County, Virginia, to receive and act upon Sheila D. Holliman’s application for reinstatement of her license to practice professional nursing in Virginia and to inquire into evidence that Ms. Holliman may have violated certain laws and regulations governing professional nursing practice. Ms. Holliman was present and was not represented by counsel. Upon consideration of the evidence, the Committee adopts the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Sheila D. Holliman was issued License No. 0001-057190 to practice professional nursing in the Commonwealth of Virginia on November 27, 1974. Said license was suspended by Order of the Board entered on March 31, 2006. Ms. Holliman’s primary state of residence is Virginia.

2. By letter dated January 13, 2011, the Board of Nursing sent a Notice of Informal Conference (“Notice”) to Ms. Holliman notifying her that an informal conference would be held on February 2, 2011. The Notice was sent by certified and first class mail to 3136 Cofer Road, Richmond, Virginia, 23224, the address of record on file with the Board of Nursing.

3. Ms. Holliman submitted an application for reinstatement of her license to practice professional nursing which was received by the Board on July 23, 2010.

4. Ms. Holliman stated that her date of sobriety is November 5, 2005. She stated she moved to Richmond, Virginia from Blacksburg in April 2010 to be closer to her family. Ms. Holliman stated that she

attends one to two Alcoholics Anonymous meetings a week in Richmond and remains in frequent contact with her sponsor in Blacksburg. She continues to work on Alcoholics Anonymous' 12-step program. Ms. Holliman completed 13.5 units of continuing education between January 28, 2010, and July 13, 2010. Ms. Holliman stated she continues to read nursing journals and other literature in the health-care field. Ms. Holliman identified her family, including her sister, mother, daughter, and her church as her primary support system.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Based on the above Findings of Fact, the Committee concludes that Ms. Holliman is a candidate for the Health Practitioners' Monitoring Program ("HPMP").
2. The Committee concludes that Ms. Holliman has demonstrated satisfactory evidence that she is prepared to resume practice in a safe and competent manner.

ORDER

On the basis of the foregoing, the Committee hereby ORDERS as follows:

1. The license of Sheila D. Holliman shall be REINSTATED upon verification of entry into the Health Practitioners' Monitoring Program within 30 days of the date of entry of this Order and shall be contingent on Ms. Holliman's remaining in compliance with the terms of a recovery monitoring contract.
2. This order shall be applicable to Ms. Holliman's multistate licensure privilege, if any, to practice professional nursing in the Commonwealth of Virginia. For the duration of this Order, Ms. Holliman shall not work outside the Commonwealth of Virginia pursuant to a multistate licensure privilege without the written permission of the Virginia Board of Nursing and the Board of Nursing in the party state where Ms. Holliman wishes to work. Any request for out of state employment shall be directed, in writing, to the Executive Director of the Board.

3. Any violation of the terms and conditions stated in this Order shall be reason for revoking the license of Ms. Holliman, and an administrative proceeding shall be held to decide whether her license should be revoked. Ms. Holliman shall be noticed to appear before the Board at such time as the Board is notified that:

a. Ms. Holliman is not in compliance with the terms and conditions of the HPMP, or has been terminated from participation in the HPMP;


b. There is a pending investigation or unresolved allegation against Ms. Holliman involving a violation of law or regulation or any term or condition of this Order; or

c. Ms. Holliman has successfully completed the above-referenced period of participation in the HPMP. However, upon receipt of Ms. Holliman's participation in and compliance with the HPMP, the Board, at its discretion, may waive Ms. Holliman's appearance before the Board and conduct an administrative review of this matter.

4. Ms. Holliman shall maintain a course of conduct in her capacity as a professional nurse commensurate with the requirements of § 54.1-3000 *et seq.* of the Code and the Board of Nursing Regulations.

Pursuant to §§ 2.2-4023 and 54.1-2400.2 of the Code, the signed original of this Order shall remain in the custody of the Department of Health Professions as public record and shall be made available for public inspection or copying on request.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO FORMAL HEARING

If you do not consent to the Committee’s decision and desire a hearing before the Board or a panel thereof, you shall notify, in writing, the Executive Director of the Board of Nursing, Perimeter Center, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite 300, Henrico, Virginia 23233, within 33 days of the date of entry of this Order. This Order shall become final upon expiration of the 33-day period unless a request for a formal hearing is received within such time. Upon receiving a timely request for a hearing, this Order shall be vacated and the Board or a panel thereof shall proceed with a hearing as provided in § 2.2-4020 *et seq.* of the Code.
