ORDER OF SUMMARY SUSPENSION

Pursuant to § 54.1-110 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended (“Code”), a quorum of the Board of Nursing (“Board”) met on March 23, 2016. The purpose of the meeting was to receive and act upon certain information indicating that Meghan L. McCormack, R.N., may have violated certain laws and regulations relating to the practice of professional nursing in the Commonwealth of Virginia, as more fully set forth in the attached “NOTICE OF HEARING and STATEMENT OF PARTICULARS,” which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein.

WHEREUPON, pursuant to its authority under § 54.1-2408.1(A) of the Code, the Board concludes that a substantial danger to public health or safety warrants this action and ORDERS that the license of Meghan L. McCormack, R.N., License No. 0001-199050, to practice professional nursing in the Commonwealth of Virginia is hereby SUSPENDED. It is further ORDERED that a hearing be convened forthwith to receive and act upon evidence in this case and that the Executive Director of the Board shall be authorized to execute this Order and all other documents, notices and orders on behalf of the Board necessary to bring this matter to a hearing.


Upon entry of this Order, the license of Meghan L. McCormack, R.N., will be recorded as suspended and no longer current.

This Order shall be applicable to Ms. McCormack’s multistate licensure privilege, if any, to practice professional.

Pursuant to § 54.1-2400.2 of the Code, the signed original of this Order shall remain in the custody of the Department of Health Professions as a public record and shall be made available for public inspection or copying on request.

NOTICE OF HEARING

Pursuant to §§ 2.2-4020, 2.2-4024(F), and 54.1-2400(11) of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended (“Code”), Meghan L. McCormack, R.N., who, prior to its summary suspension by the Board of Nursing on April 1, 2016, held License No. 0001-199050 to practice professional nursing in Virginia, is hereby given notice that a formal administrative hearing will be held in the presence of a panel of the Board of Nursing. The hearing will be held on May 18, 2016, at 10:00 a.m., at the offices of the Department of Health Professions, Board of Nursing, Perimeter Center, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite 201, Henrico, Virginia 23233, at which time Ms. McCormack will be afforded the opportunity to be heard in person or by counsel.


At the hearing, Ms. McCormack has the following rights, among others: the right to representation by counsel; the right to have witnesses subpoenaed and to present witnesses on her behalf; the right to present documentary evidence; and the right to cross-examine adverse witnesses. If Ms. McCormack desires any witnesses to appear on her behalf, she must notify the Director of Administrative Proceedings, Department of Health Professions, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite 300, Henrico, Virginia 23233, in accordance with the Instructions for Requesting Subpoenas.

The purpose of the hearing is to inquire into evidence that Ms. McCormack may have violated certain laws governing professional nursing practice in Virginia, as more fully set forth in the Statement of Particulars below.

STATEMENT OF PARTICULARS

The Board alleges that Meghan L. McCormack, R.N., may have violated § 54.1-3007(5) and (6) of the Code in that she may be unable to safely practice nursing due to substance abuse and/or mental and/or physical illness, as evidenced by the following: During the course of her employment with Bon Secours Maryview Medical Center, Portsmouth, Virginia, on or about December 9, 2015, she reported for work while impaired, as evidenced by her slurred speech, inability to focus, disheveled appearance, trembling, and a for-cause employment drug screen that was positive for codeine (C-II), hydromorphone (C-II), and morphine (C-II), medications for which she did not have prescriptions.
