Dear Ms. Lucas:

Pursuant to Section 54.1-2409 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, ("Code"), you are hereby given notice that your certification to practice as a certified nurse aide in the Commonwealth of Virginia has been mandatorily suspended by the enclosed Order entered May 12, 2016. You are hereby advised that, pursuant to Section 54.1-2409.1 of the Code, any person who practices a profession or occupation after having their license or certificate to do so suspended shall be guilty of a felony. Please return your certificate to Jay P. Douglas, Executive Director of the Virginia Board of Nursing, at the above address, immediately upon receipt of this letter.

Section 54.1-2409 of the Code further provides that you may apply to the Board of Nursing ("Board") for reinstatement of your certificate, and shall be entitled to a hearing not later than the next regular meeting of the Board after the expiration of sixty days from the receipt of such reinstatement application. You have the following rights, among others: to be represented by legal counsel, to have witnesses subpoenaed on your behalf, to present documentary evidence and to cross-examine adverse witnesses. The reinstatement of your certificate shall require the affirmative vote of three-fourths of the members present of the Board of Nursing.

Hahn, M.P.A., Chief Deputy Director of the Virginia Department of Health Professions, received and acted upon evidence that Lavonna Shirrie Lucas, C.N.A., was found guilty of one (1) felony charge in the Circuit Court of the City of Fredericksburg, Virginia, to wit: One (1) Count of Felony Shoplifting. CONVICTION ORDER

On April 2, 2001, came the Attorney for the Commonwealth, Phillip U. Fines, and Lavonna Shirrie Lucas, who stands indicted for a felony, to-wit: That on or about July 12, 2000, in the City of Fredericksburg, LAVONNA SHIRRIE LUCAS unlawfully and feloniously, without authority, and

with the intention of converting goods or merchandise to her own use without having paid the full purchase price thereof, did willfully conceal or take possession of goods or merchandise having a value of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) or more, belonging to Shoppers Food Warehouse located in the City of Fredericksburg, against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth and in violation of Section 18.2-103 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, appeared according to the terms of her recognizance; and came also her attorney, Kristie L. Kane, heretofore appointed. In compliance with Section 19.2-165 of the Code of Virginia as amended in 1975, the Court Reporter was sworn.

The Defendant having been heretofore arraigned and having pleaded not guilty and waived trial by jury, the Court proceed to hear the evidence in the case.

Whereupon the evidence of the Commonwealth was presented and, at the conclusion thereof, the Defendant, by counsel, moved to strike the evidence of the Commonwealth for the reasons stated to the record,

which motion was denied by the Court. Thereupon the evidence of the Defendant was presented.

After hearing all the evidence and the arguments of counsel, it is the judgment of the Court that the Defendant is guilty of felony shoplifting, as charged in the Indictment.

The Court, before fixing punishment or imposing sentence, and upon the motion of counsel for the Defendant, directs the Probation Officer of this Court to investigate thoroughly and report to the Court as provided by law. Said report shall be delivered to this Court by June 8, 2001. Sentencing is set for June 14, 2001, at 9:00 a.m., to which time this case is continued.


The Court certifies that at all times during these proceedings, the Defendant was personally present and her attorney was likewise personally present and capably represented the Defendant.

On June 14, 2001, came the Attorney for the Commonwealth, Phillip U. Fines, and Lavonna Shirrie Lucas, who stands convicted, on her plea of not guilty, of a felony, to-wit: That on or about July 12, 2000, in the City of Fredericksburg, LAVONNA SHIRRIE LUCAS unlawfully and feloniously, without authority, and with the intention of converting goods or

merchandise to her own use without having paid the full purchase price thereof, did willfully conceal or take possession of goods or merchandise having a value of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) or more, belonging to Shopper's Food Warehouse located in the City of Fredericksburg, against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth and in violation of Section 18.2-103 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, as charged in the Indictment; and came also Kristie Kane, her attorney heretofore appointed. In compliance with Section 19.2-165 of the Code of Virginia as amended in 1975, the Court Reporter was sworn.

The Probation Officer of this Court, to whom this case has been previously referred for investigation, filed the pre-sentence report with the Court and both counsel prior to today's hearing, in accordance with §19.2-299 of the Code of Virginia. The report of the Probation Officer is hereby filed as part of the record in this case and both parties waived appearance of the probation officer.

Pursuant to the provisions of Code Section 19.2-298.01, the Court has considered and reviewed the applicable discretionary sentencing guidelines and the guidelines worksheets. The sentencing guidelines worksheets and

the written explanation of any departure from the guidelines are ordered filed as a part of the record in this case.

Whereupon the Court taking into consideration all the evidence in the case, the report of the Probation Officer, and such additional facts as were presented by the Defendant, and it being demanded of the Defendant if anything she had or knew to say why judgment should not be pronounced against her according to law, and nothing being offered or alleged in delay of judgment, it is therefore the judgment of this Court that the Defendant is guilty of felony shoplifting, as charged in the Indictment, and she is hereby sentenced to confinement in the Virginia Department of Corrections penal system for a period of two (2) years.

The execution of one (1) year and nine (9) months is hereby suspended, conditioned upon the following:

Good behavior. The Defendant shall be of good behavior for a period of five (5) years.

Supervised probation. Upon her release from confinement, the Defendant is ordered placed on active, supervised probation under the supervision of a Probation Officer for an indefinite period of time. The Defendant shall comply with all the rules and requirements set by the Probation Officer.

It is further ORDERED that the Defendant is barred from Shoppers Food Warehouse until given written permission.

Post-release supervision. NA

Costs. The Defendant shall pay costs of \$666.00. The court costs are due and payable this date unless an application for a payment schedule is transmitted to the Clerk within thirty (30) days. The maximum attorney's fee was allowed, no time sheet having been submitted in a timely fashion.

Restitution. NA

Credit for time served. The Defendant shall be given credit for time spent in confinement while awaiting trial on this charge pursuant to Code Section 53.1-187.

The Court certifies that at all times during the trial of this case, the Defendant was personally present and her attorney was likewise personally present and capably represented the Defendant, and is allowed

an attorney's fee of \$318.00. Said fee shall not be paid until a time sheet has been submitted.


The Defendant shall provide a blood sample for DNA analysis pursuant to Virginia Code Section 19.2-310.2 et seq. at or under the auspices of the Rappahannock Regional Jail within a reasonable time after incarceration in the manner prescribed by law.

The Defendant is remanded to the custody of the Sheriff.
