**ORDER**

The Virginia Board of Nursing (“Board”) hereby enters following Order affecting the license of Marjorie Bellamy, L.P.N., to practice practical nursing in Virginia.

The Board adopts the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law.

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

1.       Marjorie Bellamy, L.P.N., was issued License No. 0002-074851 to practice practical nursing by the Virginia Board of Nursing on November 8, 2006. Said license was suspended by Order of the Board entered February 15, 2013. This action was the result of Ms. Bellamy’s privilege to practice practical nursing in Kentucky being suspended by the Kentucky Board of Nursing due to her poor documentation of controlled medications. By Order entered September 5, 2013, the Virginia Board vacated the Order entered February 15, 2013, and Ms. Bellamy’s Virginia license to practice professional nursing was reinstated. The Virginia Board of Nursing placed Ms. Bellamy on probation for a period of one year of active nursing practice subject to certain terms and conditions. Ms. Bellamy’s license is set to expire on April 30, 2016. Her primary state of residence is Virginia.

2.       On May 28, 2013, the Kentucky Board reinstated Ms. Bellamy’s privilege to practice practical nursing, subject to certain terms and conditions. The terms and conditions required Ms. Bellamy to have random drug and alcohol testing, remain free of mood-altering substances, provide written verification of any prescription medication within five days if requested by the Kentucky Board staff, payment of a monetary penalty of \$1,000.00, and completion of 30 contact hours on substance abuse.

3. On December 5, 2014, Ms. Bellamy requested release from probation as she demonstrated compliance with terms of probation in Virginia.

4. By letter dated May 20, 2015, the Kentucky Board notified Ms. Bellamy that she had met and satisfied all the terms of her Board Order entered May 28, 2013.

5. On September 21, 2015, the director of nursing for Heritage Hall – Wise, Wise, Virginia, where Ms. Bellamy is employed, was interviewed. The director of nursing stated that she was aware of Ms. Bellamy’s past. There have been no complaints about Ms. Bellamy’s practice.

**CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**


Ms. Bellamy has satisfied the terms of her probation.

**ORDER**

WHEREFORE, on the basis of the foregoing, the Virginia Board of Nursing, effective upon entry of this Order, hereby Orders as follows:

- 1. Marjorie Bellamy, L.P.N. is hereby released from probation. Ms. Bellamy shall be issued an unrestricted license to practice practical nursing in Virginia.
- 2. Ms. Bellamy shall maintain a course of conduct in her capacity as a licensed practical nurse commensurate with the requirements of § 54.1-3000 *et seq.* of the Code and the Board of Nursing Regulations.

Pursuant to §§ 2.2-4023 and 54.1-2400.2 of the Code, the signed original of this Order shall remain in the custody of the Department of Health Professions as public record and shall be made available for public inspection or copying upon request.
