Pursuant to Section 54.1-2409 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, ("Code"), you are hereby given notice that your license to practice nursing in the Commonwealth of Virginia has been mandatorily suspended by the enclosed Order entered October 27, 2011. You are hereby advised that, pursuant to Section 54.1-2409.1 of the Code, any person who practices a profession or occupation after having their license or certificate to do so suspended shall be guilty of a felony. Please return your license to Jay P. Douglas, Executive Director of the Board of Nursing at the above address, immediately upon receipt of this letter.

Section 54.1-2409 of the Code further provides that you may apply to the Board of Nursing ("Board") for reinstatement of your license, and shall be entitled to a hearing not later than the next regular meeting of the Board after the expiration of sixty days from the receipt of such reinstatement application. You have the following rights, among others: to be represented by legal counsel, to have witnesses subpoenaed on your behalf, to present documentary evidence and to cross-examine adverse witnesses. The reinstatement of your license shall require the affirmative vote of three-fourths of the members present of the Board of Nursing.

Bailey, M.Ed., RN, in her official 12 capacity as the Executive Officer of the Board of Registered Nursing, Department of Consumer 13 Affairs, filed Accusation No. 2011-974 against Michael Scott Addair (Respondent) before the 14 Board of Registered Nursing. (Accusation attached as Exhibit A.) 15 On or about April 13, 2005, the Board of Registered Nursing (Board) issued 16 Registered Nurse License No. 656199 to Respondent. The Registered Nurse License expired on 17 January 31, 2011 and has not been renewed. 18 3. On or about June 13, 2011, the Respondent was served by Certified and First Class 19 Mail copies of the Accusation No. 2011-974, Statement to Respondent, Notice of Defense, 20 Request for Discovery, and Government Code sections 11507.5, 11507.6, and 11507.7 to 21 Respondent's address of record which, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 136 22 and Title 16 California Code of Regulations section 1409.1, is required to be reported and 23 maintained with the Board, which was and is: 24 RT 1 BOX 235A 25 26 Honaker, VA 24260 27 11 COMMONWEALTH'S

4. Service of the Accusation was effective as a matter of law under the provisions of Government Code section 11505, subdivision (c) and/or Business & Professions Code section 124.

- 5. The United States Postal Service reflects a delivery date of June 21. 2011.
- 6. Business and Professions Code section 2764 states:

The lapsing or suspension of a license by operation of law or by order or decision of the board or a court of law, or the voluntary surrender of a license by a licentiate shall not deprive the board of jurisdiction to proceed with an investigation of or action or disciplinary proceeding against such license, or to render a decision suspending or revoking such license.

- 7. Government Code section 11506 states, in pertinent part:
- (c) The respondent shall be entitled to a hearing on the merits if the respondent files a notice of defense, and the notice shall be deemed a specific denial of all parts of the accusation not expressly admitted. Failure to file a notice of defense shall constitute a waiver of respondent's right to a hearing, but the agency in its discretion may nevertheless grant a hearing.
- 8. Respondent failed to file a Notice of Defense within 15 days after service upon him of the Accusation, and therefore waived his right to a hearing on the merits of Accusation No. 2011-974.
 - 9. California Government Code section 11520 states, in pertinent part:
- (a) If the respondent either fails to file a notice of defense or to appear at the hearing, the agency may take action based upon the respondent's express admissions or upon other evidence and affidavits may be used as evidence without any notice to respondent.
- 10. Pursuant to its authority under Government Code section 11520, the Board after having reviewed the proof of service dated, June 13, 2011, finds Respondent is in default. The Board will take action without further hearing and, based on Accusation No. 2011-974 and the documents contained in the Default Decision Investigatory Evidence Packet which includes: Exhibit 1 Pleadings offered for jurisdictional purposes; Exhibit 2 License History Certification for Michael Scott Addair, Registered Nurse License No. 656199; Exhibit 3 Kentucky Board of Nursing, Agreed Order, Case # 2007-1044, *In Re: Michael S. Addair, RN*

License# 1099525, ARNP 2999-A; Exhibit 4 - Commenwealth of Virginia, Before the Board of Nursing, Michael S. Addair, R.N., Order; Exhibit 5 - California Renewal Application for Registered Nursing; Exhibit 6 - Affidavit of Shannon Silberling; Exhibit 7 - Declaration of costs by Office of the Attorney General for Prosecution of Case No. 2011-974, and finds that the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 2011-974 are separately and severally true and correct by clear and convincing evidence.

- 11. Taking official notice of the Declaration of costs by the Office of the Attorney

 General contained in the Default Decision Investigitory Evidence Packet, pursuant to Business
 and Professions Code section 125.3, it is hereby determined that the reasonable costs for

 Investigation and Enforcement in connection with the Accusation are \$765.00, as of July 1, 2011.

 DETERMINATION OF ISSUES
- 1. Based on the foregoing findings of fact, Respondent Michael Scott Addair has subjected his following licenses to discipline:
 - a. Registered Nurse License No. 656199
 - 2. The agency has jurisdiction to adjudicate this case by default.
- 3. The Board of Registered Nursing is authorized to revoke Respondent's Registered Nurse License based upon the following violations alleged in the Accusation, which are supported by the evidence contained in the Default Decision Investigatory Evidence Packet in this case.
 - a. Violation of Business and Professions Code section 2761(a)(4) Disciplinary action by another State Board of Nursing.
 - Violation of Business and Professions Code section 2761(a)(4) False
 Statement or Information in Application

<u>ORDER</u>

IT IS SO ORDERED that Registered Nurse License No. 656199, heretofore issued to Respondent Michael Scott Addair, is revoked.

Pursuant to Government Code section 11520, subdivision (c), Respondent may serve a written motion requesting that the Decision be vacated and stating the grounds relied on within seven (7) days after service of the Decision on Respondent. The agency in its discretion may vacate the Decision and grant a hearing on a showing of good cause, as defined in the statute.

This Decision shall become effective on October 19, 2011.

18	<u>PARTIES</u>
19	1. Louise R. Bailey, M.Ed., RN (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in her
20	official capacity as the Executive Officer of the Board of Registered Nursing, Department of
21	Consumer Affairs.
22	2. On or about April 13, 2005, the Board of Registered Nursing issued Registered Nurse
23	License Number 656199 to Michael Scott Addair (Respondent). The Registered Nurse License
24	expired on January 31, 2011, and has not been renewed.
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JURISDICTION

- 3. This Accusation is brought before the Board of Registered Nursing (Board), Department of Consumer Affairs, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.
- 4. Section 2750 of the Business and Professions Code (Code) provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may discipline any licensee, including a licensee holding a temporary or an inactive license, for any reason provided in Article 3 (commencing with section 2750) of the Nursing Practice Act.
- 5. Section 2764 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the expiration of a license shall not deprive the Board of jurisdiction to proceed with a disciplinary proceeding against the licensee or to render a decision imposing discipline on the license. Under Code section 2811, subdivision (b), the Board may renew an expired license at any time within eight years after the expiration.
- 6. Section 118, subdivision (b), of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the expiration of a license shall not deprive the Board of jurisdiction to proceed with a disciplinary action during the period within which the license may be renewed, restored, reissued or reinstated.

STATUTORY PROVISIONS

7. Section 2761 of the Code states:

"The board may take disciplinary action against a certified or licensed nurse or deny an application for a certificate or license for any of the following:

- "(a) Unprofessional conduct, which includes, but is not limited to, the following:
- "(4) Denial of licensure, revocation, suspension, restriction, or any other disciplinary action against a health care professional license or certificate by another state or territory of the United States, by any other government agency, or by another California health care professional

licensing board. A certified copy of the decision or judgment shall be conclusive evidence of that action."

(e) Making or giving any false statement or information in connection with the application for certificate or license."

COST RECOVERY

8. Section 125.3 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unprofessional Conduct – Out of State Discipline) (Bus. & Prof. Code § 2761, subd. (a)(4))

9. Respondent has subjected his registered nurse license to disciplinary action under Code section 2761, subdivision (a)(4), in that on or about February 20, 2008, in a disciplinary action before the Kentucky Board of Nursing (Kentucky Board), Case No. 2007-1044, the Kentucky Board entered an Agreed Order accepting Respondent's voluntary surrender of his Kentucky registered nurse license and advanced registered nurse practitioner registration for at least one year. The Agreed Order stated that the Kentucky Board had probable cause to believe that Respondent had violated Kentucky law.

SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unprofessional Conduct – Out of State Discipline) (Bus. & Prof. Code § 2761, subd. (a)(4))

- 10. Complainant realleges the allegations contained in paragraph 9 above, and incorporates them by reference as if fully set forth.
- 11. Respondent has subjected his registered nurse license to disciplinary action under Code section 2761, subdivision (a)(4), in that on or about February 13, 2009, in a disciplinary action before the Virginia Board of Nursing (Virginia Board), the Virginia Board entered an Order placing Respondent's Virginia registered nurse license on probation for 24 months. The

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Order required Respondent to: (1) complete 24 months of active employment as a registered nurse; (2) inform the Board in writing within 10 days of the date he begins nursing practice, changes employment, or experiences any interruption in nursing practice; (3) provide the name and address of each employer to the Board; (4) inform his current nursing employer and each future nursing employer that the Virginia Board has placed him on probation and provide each employer with a complete copy of the Order and if employed with a staffing agency, inform his supervisor in each facility where assigned that he is on probation; (5) undergo an evaluation by a chemical dependency specialist satisfactory to the Board and have a written report of the evaluation, including diagnosis, a recommended course of therapy, and a prognosis sent to the Board within 45 days from the entry of the Order; (6) comply with any recommendations of the specialist and if therapy is recommended, submit quarterly written progress reports from the therapist to the Board until Respondent is released from therapy; (7) abstain from alcohol or any other mood altering chemical, except as prescribed by a health care practitioner with whom Respondent has a bona fide practitioner/patient relationship for accepted medicinal or therapeutic purposes; (8) have one supervised and unannounced random drug screen per month by a Boardapproved testing entity, which includes testing for alcohol, Fentanyl, and opiates; (9) provide all current and future treating practitioners with a complete copy of the Order and execute an "Authorization for Disclosure of Information" form allowing unrestricted communication between the Board and any court-appointed probation or parole officers and any consultants designated by the Board; (10) submit quarterly self-reports to the Board which include a current address, telephone number, verification of all current employment, and employment status; (11) return all copies of his license to the Board so that a new license can be issued that reflects the probationary status of his license; and (12) conduct himself as a professional nurse.

12. The underlying conduct supporting the Virginia Board's disciplinary action is that on or about November 10, 2008, the Virginia Board sent Respondent a Notice of Informal Conference notifying him that an informal conference would be held before the Virginia Board on or about December 9, 2008. According the Virginia Board's Order, Respondent's voluntary surrender of his Kentucky license and registration as stated in paragraph 9 above, was based upon

his admitted diversion of drugs for his own personal and unauthorized use between February 2007, and April 2007, while employed as a contract anesthetist with Whitesburg Appalachian Regional Hospital in Whitesburg, Kentucky. Furthermore, on or about April 30, 2008, Respondent pled guilty to 36 misdemeanor counts of "theft of a controlled substance, second degree," in Letcher County Circuit Court of the Court of Justice for the Commonwealth of Kentucky. Respondent was sentenced to 12 months of imprisonment, with judgment withheld pending his successful completion of two years of unsupervised probation.

THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unprofessional Conduct – False Statement or Information in Application) (Bus. & Prof. Code § 2761, subd. (e))

- 13. Complainant realleges the allegations contained in paragraphs 9 through 12 above, and incorporates them by reference as if fully set forth.
- 14. Respondent has subjected his registered nurse license to disciplinary action under Code section 2761, subdivision (e), in that he made or gave false statements and information to the California Board in connection with his application for renewal of his California registered nurse license. The circumstances are as follows:
- Registered Nurse" to the California Board of Registered Nursing. In his renewal application, Respondent denied having been convicted of or pleading nolo contendre to any violation of the law in California or any other U.S. state or foreign country since he last renewed his license. Prior to December 2008, Respondent last renewed his license on or about December 1, 2006. Respondent's denial of having been convicted of any violation of the law since he last renewed his license constitutes a misrepresentation because on or about April 30, 2008, he pled guilty to and was convicted of 36 counts of "theft of a controlled substance, second degree," in Letcher County Circuit Court of the Court of Justice for the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters alleged in this Accusation, and that following the hearing, the Board of Registered Nursing issue a decision:

- 1. Revoking or suspending Registered Nurse License Number 656199, issued to Michael Scott Addair;
- 2. Ordering Michael Scott Addair to pay the Board of Registered Nursing the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3;
 - 3. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
