NOTICE OF HEARING

Pursuant to §§ 2.2-4020, 2.2-4024(F), and 54.1-2400(11) of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended (“Code”), Kyong Osorio, C.M.T., who holds Certificate No. 0019-004042 to practice massage therapy in Virginia, which is set to expire on November 30, 2015, is hereby given notice that a formal administrative hearing will be held in the presence of a panel of the Board of Nursing. The hearing will be held on November 18, 2015, at 11:00 a.m., at the offices of the Department of Health Professions, Board of Nursing, Perimeter Center, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite 201, Henrico, Virginia 23233, at which time Ms. Osorio will be afforded the opportunity to be heard in person or by counsel.

At the hearing, Ms. Osorio has the following rights, among others: the right to representation by counsel; the right to have witnesses subpoenaed and to present witnesses on her behalf; the right to present documentary evidence; and the right to cross-examine adverse witnesses. If Ms. Osorio desires any witnesses to appear on her behalf, she must notify the Director of Administrative Proceedings, Department of Health Professions, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite 300, Henrico, Virginia 23233, in accordance with the Instructions for Requesting Subpoenas.


The purpose of the hearing is to inquire into evidence that Kyong Osorio, C.M.T., may have violated certain laws and regulations governing massage therapy practice in Virginia, as more fully set forth in the Statement of Particulars below.

STATEMENT OF PARTICULARS

The Board alleges that Kyong Osorio, C.M.T., may have violated § 54.1-3007(2) and (5) of the Code and 18 VAC 90-50-90(2)(g) and (i) of the Regulations Governing the Certification of Massage Therapists, as further defined by Section VII of the National Certification Board for Therapeutic Massage and Bodywork (NCBTMB) Code of Ethics in that:

1. On or about November 30, 2011, in the General District Court of Fairfax County, Virginia, Ms. Osorio was convicted of disorderly conduct after being arrested for allowing an unlicensed individual to perform a massage.
2. On or about April 8, 2013, in the General District Court of Fairfax County, Virginia, Ms. Osorio was convicted of allowing an unlicensed individual to perform a massage.
