Pursuant to Section 54.1-2409 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, ("Code"), you are hereby given notice that your certification to practice as a certified nurse aide in the Commonwealth of Virginia has been mandatorily suspended by the enclosed Order entered January 20, 2015. You are hereby advised that, pursuant to Section 54.1-2409.1 of the Code, any person who practices a profession or occupation after having their license or certificate to do so suspended shall be guilty of a felony. Please return your certificate to Jay P. Douglas, Executive Director of the Virginia Board of Nursing, at the above address, immediately upon receipt of this letter.

Section 54.1-2409 of the Code further provides that you may apply to the Board of Nursing ("Board") for reinstatement of your certificate, and shall be entitled to a hearing not later than the next regular meeting of the Board after the expiration of sixty days from the receipt of such reinstatement application. You have the following rights, among others: to be represented by legal counsel, to have witnesses subpoenaed on your behalf, to present documentary evidence and to cross-examine adverse witnesses. The reinstatement of your certificate shall require the affirmative vote of three-fourths of the members present of the Board of Nursing.

This case came before the Court for sentencing of the defendant, who appeared in person with her attorney Lawrence D. Gott, the Public Defender. The Commonwealth was represented by James J. Reynolds.

On **September 26, 2002** the defendant was found guilty of the following offense:

The presentence report was considered and is ordered filed as a part of the record in this case in accordance with the provisions of Code 19.2-299.

Pursuant to the provisions of Code 19.2-298.01, the Court has considered and reviewed the applicable discretionary sentencing guidelines and the guidelines worksheets. The sentencing guidelines worksheets and the written explanation of any departure from the guidelines are ordered filed as a part of the record in this case.

Before pronouncing the sentence, the Court inquired if the defendant desired to make a statement and if the defendant desired to advance any reason why judgment should not be pronounced.

The Court sentences the defendant to:

COMMONWEALTH'S EXHIBIT

Incarceration with the Virginia Department of Corrections for the term of: four (4) years for Eleventh Offense Larceny. The total sentence imposed is four (4) years.

The Court SUSPENDS three (3) years for Eleventh Offense Larceny upon the following condition(s):

Serve. The defendant shall serve one (1) year for Eleventh Offense Largeny in the Penitentiary.

The Court recommends that the defendant receive long-term institutional care while in the custody of the Department of Corrections and that she be housed at the Fluvanna Women's Correctional Center during her period of incarceration.

Good Behavior. The defendant shall be of good behavior for two (2) years from the defendant's release from probation.

Intensive Probation Supervision. The defendant shall be placed on Intensive Probation Supervision in accordance with the terms and conditions of the program and subject to approval of the screening committee of the local Probation and Parole Office for a period of twelve (12) months. Probation shall include Mental Health Counseling as prescribed by the Probation Officer and the defendant shall continue to take medication as prescribed.

Costs. The defendant shall pay costs of \$537.00.

Right to Appeal. The Court advised the defendant and the defendant's attorney of the defendant's right to appeal this conviction to the Court of Appeals of Virginia.

Credit for time served. The defendant shall be given credit for time spent in confinement while awaiting trial pursuant to Code 53.1-187.
