ORDER OF SUMMARY SUSPENSION

Pursuant to § 54.1-2408.1 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended (“Code”), a quorum of the Board of Nursing (“Board”) met by telephone conference call on July 7, 2014, after a good faith effort to convene a regular meeting of the Board had failed. The purpose of the meeting was to receive and act upon certain information indicating that Kristin Boley, R.N., may have violated certain laws relating to the practice of professional nursing in the Commonwealth of Virginia, as more fully set forth in the attached “NOTICE OF HEARING and STATEMENT OF PARTICULARS,” which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein.


WHEREUPON, pursuant to its authority under § 54.1-2408.1(A) of the Code, the Board concludes that a substantial danger to public health or safety warrants this action and ORDERS that the license of Kristin Boley, R.N., License No. 0001-192349, to practice professional nursing in the Commonwealth of Virginia is hereby SUSPENDED. It is further ORDERED that a hearing be convened forthwith to receive and act upon evidence in this case and that the Executive Director of the Board shall be authorized to execute this Order and all other documents, notices and orders on behalf of the Board necessary to bring this matter to a hearing.

Upon entry of this Order, the license of Kristin Boley, R.N., will be recorded as suspended and no longer current.

This Order shall be applicable to Ms. Boley’s multistate licensure privilege, if any, to practice professional nursing.

Pursuant to § 54.1-2400.2 of the Code, the signed original of this Order shall remain in the custody of the Department of Health Professions as a public record and shall be made available for public inspection or copying on request.

NOTICE OF HEARING

Pursuant to §§ 2.2-4020, 2.2-4024(F), and 54.1-2400(11) of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended (“Code”), Kristin Boley, R.N., who, prior to its summary suspension, held License No. 0001-192349 to practice professional nursing in Virginia, is hereby given notice that a formal administrative hearing will be held in the presence of a panel of the Board of Nursing. The hearing will be held on September 18, 2014, at 10:00 a.m., at the offices of the Department of Health Professions, Board of Nursing, Perimeter Center, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite 201, Henrico, Virginia 23233, at which time Ms. Boley will be afforded the opportunity to be heard in person or by counsel.

At the hearing, Ms. Boley has the following rights, among others: the right to representation by counsel; the right to have witnesses subpoenaed and to present witnesses on her behalf; the right to present documentary evidence; and the right to cross-examine adverse witnesses. If Ms. Boley desires any witnesses to appear on her behalf, she must notify the Director of Administrative Proceedings, Department of Health Professions, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite 300, Henrico, Virginia 23233, in accordance with the Instructions for Requesting Subpoenas.


The purpose of the hearing is to inquire into evidence that Ms. Boley may have violated certain laws governing professional nursing practice in Virginia, as more fully set forth in the Statement of Particulars below.

STATEMENT OF PARTICULARS

The Board alleges that Kristin Boley, R.N., may have violated § 54.1-3007(6) of the Code in that she may be unsafe to practice professional nursing due to mental illness as evidenced by the following:

1. On or about January 31, 2014, Ms. Boley was admitted to Winchester Medical Center, Winchester, Virginia, under an emergency custody order and was found to meet the criteria for temporary detention. On or about February 5, 2014, she was discharged with a diagnosis of post traumatic stress disorder and psychotic disorder.
2. On or about March 18, 2014, Ms. Boley was diagnosed with post traumatic stress disorder and unspecified psychosis. On a subsequent examination on or about March 28, 2014, Ms. Boley was diagnosed with Bipolar I disorder, severe with psychotic features.
3. On or about May 13, 2014, in an interview with an investigator for the Department of Health Professions, Ms. Boley's treating psychiatrist stated that in his professional opinion, Ms. Boley was not ready to return to work and that her paranoia and conspiracy thinking are concerning.
