NOTICE OF HEARING

Pursuant to §§ 2.2-4020, 2.2-4024(F), and 54.1-2400(11) of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended (“Code”), Kimberly L. Harden-Luck, who holds License No. 0002-065138 to practice practical nursing in Virginia, which expires on September 30, 2016, is hereby given notice that a formal administrative hearing will be held in the presence of a panel of the Board of Nursing. The hearing will be held on March 26, 2015, at 2:00 p.m., at the offices of the Department of Health Professions, Board of Nursing, Perimeter Center, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite 201, Henrico, Virginia 23233, at which time Ms. Harden-Luck will be afforded the opportunity to be heard in person or by counsel.

At the hearing, Ms. Harden-Luck has the following rights, among others: the right to representation by counsel; the right to have witnesses subpoenaed and to present witnesses on her behalf; the right to present documentary evidence; and the right to cross-examine adverse witnesses. If Ms. Harden-Luck desires any witnesses to appear on her behalf, she must notify the Director of Administrative Proceedings, Department of Health Professions, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite 300, Henrico, Virginia 23233, in accordance with the Instructions for Requesting Subpoenas.

The purpose of the hearing is to inquire into evidence that Ms. Harden-Luck may have violated certain laws and regulations governing practical nursing practice in Virginia.

STATEMENT OF PARTICULARS

The Board alleges that Kimberly L. Harden-Luck, L.P.N., may have violated § 54.1-3007(2), (5), (6), and (8) of the Code and 18 VAC 90-20-300(A)(2)(c) of the Regulations Governing the Practice of Nursing in that during the course of her employment with Sentara Norfolk General Hospital, Norfolk, Virginia, between about May 2014 and June 2014, by her own admission, she diverted narcotic medications for her personal and unauthorized use. She accomplished this diversion by removing these medications from the Omnicell machine under the names of various patients without documentation of the administration, return or waste of said medications.
