NOTICE OF HEARING

Pursuant to §§ 2.2-4020, 2.2-4024(F), and 54.1-2400(11) of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended

("Code"), Naomi K. Long, R.N., who holds License No. 0001-138123 to practice professional nursing in

Virginia, which expires on August 31, 2016, is hereby given notice that a formal administrative hearing will

At the hearing, Ms. Long has the following rights, among others: the right to representation by

counsel; the right to have witnesses subpoenaed and to present witnesses on her behalf; the right to present

documentary evidence; and the right to cross-examine adverse witnesses. If Ms. Long desires any witnesses

to appear on her behalf, she must notify the Director of Administrative Proceedings, Department of Health

Professions, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite 300, Henrico, Virginia 23233, in accordance with the Instructions

for Requesting Subpoenas.

The purpose of the hearing is to inquire into evidence that Ms. Long may have violated certain laws

and regulations governing professional nursing practice in Virginia, as more fully set forth in the Statement

of Particulars below.

## STATEMENT OF PARTICULARS

The Board alleges that:

- 1. Naomi K. Long, R.N., may have violated § 54.1-3007(6) of the Code in that she may be unable to safely practice nursing due to mental illness and substance use and dependence, which require medication and treatment, and for which she was hospitalized on or about August 19, 2014.
- 2. Ms. Long may have violated § 54.1-3007(5) and (6) of the Code in that, in or about June 2014, during the course of her employment with Sentara Virginia Beach General Hospital, Virginia Beach, Virginia, Ms. Long wandered away from the facility during her scheduled shift, and was later found outside walking around in a confused state. Ms. Long was subsequently seen in the emergency department at the facility, and was diagnosed with an altered mental state.
