NOTICE OF HEARING

Pursuant to §§ 2.2-4020, 2.2-4024(F), and 54.1-2400(11) of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended

("Code"), Susan Reece, R.N., who holds License No. 0001-245812 to practice professional nursing in

Virginia, which expires on January 31, 2015, is hereby given notice that a formal administrative hearing will

At the hearing, Ms. Reece has the following rights, among others: the right to representation by

counsel; the right to have witnesses subpoenaed and to present witnesses on her behalf; the right to present

documentary evidence; and the right to cross-examine adverse witnesses. If Ms. Reece desires any witnesses

to appear on her behalf, she must notify the Director of Administrative Proceedings, Department of Health

Professions, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite 300, Henrico, Virginia 23233, in accordance with the Instructions

for Requesting Subpoenas.

The purpose of the hearing is to inquire into evidence that Ms. Reece may have violated certain laws

governing professional nursing practice in Virginia, as more fully set forth in the Statement of Particulars

below.

## STATEMENT OF PARTICULARS

The Board alleges that:

- Susan Reece, R.N., may have violated § 54.1-3007(7) of the Code in that on or about January 1. 13, 2014, the Indiana State Board of Nursing placed her on indefinite probation after making findings that she had overdosed at work and had enrolled in the Indiana State Nurses' Assistance Program ("ISNAP").
- 2. Ms. Reece may be in violation of § 54.1-3007(6) of the Code in that she may be unable to safely practice nursing due to substance abuse and/or mental and/or physical illness, as evidenced by her drug overdose at work on or about September 27, 2013, and her enrollment in ISNAP.
