Dear Mr. Bayliss:

This is official notification that an informal conference will be held pursuant to §§ 2.2-4019, 2.2-4021, and 54.1-2400(10) of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended ("Code"), on October 27, 2014 at 10:30 a.m. at the Department of Health Professions, Perimeter Center, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite 201, Henrico, Virginia 23233. You may be represented by an attorney at the conference. This informal conference will be convened as a public meeting pursuant to § 2.2-3700 et seq. of the Code.

The Special Conference Committee ("Committee"), which is comprised of at least two members of the Virginia Board of Nursing ("Board"), will receive and act upon your application for licensure by examination to practice professional nursing in Virginia and will inquire into evidence that grounds may exist to deny your application.

Specifically:

- 1. You may have violated § 54.1-3007(4) of the Code in that on or about May 5, 2011, in the General District Court of the City of Charlottesville, Virginia, you were convicted of petit larceny.
- 2. You may have violated §§ 54.1-3007(3) and 54.1-3008(A)(4) of the Code in that between June 2014 and July 2014, you identified yourself as a "registered nurse" on a social media website when, in fact, you did not hold a license to practice nursing.
- 3. You may have violated § 54.1-3007(2) of the Code and 18 VAC 90-20-300(A)(2)(e) of the Regulations Governing the Practice of Nursing in that on an application for employment with ACAC, dated May 9, 2014, you falsely indicated that your reason for leaving your prior employment with Hearthstone Health and Fitness was "conflicts with school schedule," when, in fact, your employment with Hearthstone had been terminated in January 2014.

The burden rests on you, as the applicant, to demonstrate that you meet the requirements of § 54.1-3017 of the Code.

After the informal conference, the Committee is authorized by \S 54.1-2400(10) of the Code to take any of the following actions:

- The Committee may approve your application for licensure;
- The Committee may approve your application and issue a reprimand, impose a monetary penalty or terms and conditions, or place you on probation; or
 - The Committee may deny your application.

Further, the Committee may refer the case to the Board of Nursing or a panel thereof for a formal hearing.

If you fail to appear at the informal conference, the Committee may proceed to hear the case in your absence and may take any of the actions outlined above. At least ten days prior to the scheduled date of the conference, please inform this office at (804) 367-4502, or in writing at the address listed above, of your telephone number and whether you intend to appear at the informal conference.

To facilitate this proceeding, you should submit five copies of any documents you wish the Committee to consider to the Department of Health Professions, Board of Nursing, Perimeter Center, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite 300, Henrico, Virginia 23233, by October 17, 2014. Your documents may not be submitted by facsimile or email.

You have the right to the information on which the Board will rely in making its decision. Therefore, I have enclosed a copy of the documents that will be distributed to the members of the Committee and will be considered by the Committee when discussing any allegations with you and when deliberating on your case. These documents are enclosed <u>only</u> with the original notice sent by certified mail, which you may be required to claim at the post office. Please bring these documents with you to the informal conference.
