NOTICE OF HEARING

Pursuant to §§ 2.2-4020, 2.2-4024(F), and 54.1-2400(11) of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended (“Code”), Emily Bracy, C.M.T., who, prior to its suspension by the Board of Nursing on April 8, 2015, held Certificate No. 0019-005476 to practice massage therapy in Virginia, is hereby given notice that a formal administrative hearing will be held in the presence of a panel of the Board of Nursing. The hearing will be held on July 16, 2015, at 10:00 a.m., at the offices of the Department of Health Professions, Board of Nursing, Perimeter Center, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite 201, Henrico, Virginia 23233, at which time Ms. Bracy will be afforded the opportunity to be heard in person or by counsel.


At the hearing, Ms. Bracy has the following rights, among others: the right to representation by counsel; the right to have witnesses subpoenaed and to present witnesses on her behalf; the right to present documentary evidence; and the right to cross-examine adverse witnesses. If Ms. Bracy desires any witnesses to appear on her behalf, she must notify the Director of Administrative Proceedings, Department of Health Professions, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite 300, Henrico, Virginia 23233, in accordance with the Instructions for Requesting Subpoenas.

The purpose of the hearing is to inquire into evidence that Ms. Bracy may have violated certain terms and conditions imposed on her as set forth in the Order of the Board entered on September 16, 2014, and to inquire into evidence that Ms. Bracy may have violated certain laws governing massage therapy practice in Virginia, as more fully set forth in the Statement of Particulars below.

STATEMENT OF PARTICULARS

The Board alleges that Ms. Bracy may have violated § 54.1-3007(6) of the Code and Term 4(a) of the Board's Order entered September 16, 2014, which required her to comply with all terms and conditions of the Health Practitioners' Monitoring Program ("HPMP"), in that on or about March 23, 2015 Ms. Bracy was dismissed from the HPMP for noncompliance with her program contract. Specifically, Ms. Bracy failed to comply with all treatment recommendations including medication therapy.
