NOTICE OF HEARING

STATEMENT OF PARTICULARS

The Board alleges that Victoria A. Hamshar, R.N., may have violated Term No. 5 of the Board Order entered March 28, 2013, which required her to comply with all terms of the Health Practitioners' Monitoring Program ("HPMP") in that, on or about July 18, 2014, Ms. Hamshar was dismissed from the HPMP for noncompliance due to her failure to maintain contact with HPMP, her failure to comply with the urine toxicology screening program, her failure to participate in treatment, and her failure to submit monthly reports.
