NOTICE OF INFORMAL CONFERENCE

Dear Ms. Dent:

This letter is official notification that an informal conference of the Virginia Board of Nursing ("Board") will be held, pursuant to §§ 2.2-4019, 2.2-4021, and 54.1-2400(7) of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended ("Code"), on **June 16, 2014, at 9:00 a.m.**, in the offices of the Department of Health Professions, Perimeter Center, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite 201, Henrico, Virginia 23233. You may be represented by an attorney at the informal conference. The informal conference committee, which is comprised of at least two members of the Board, will consider your application for certification by examination as a massage therapist and will inquire into allegations that you may have violated certain laws governing the practice of massage therapy in Virginia.

Specifically, you may have violated § 54.1-3007(4) of the Code in that:

- 1. On or about August 27, 2007, you were convicted of petit larceny, a misdemeanor, in the District Court of Waynesboro, Virginia.
- 2. On or about November 28, 2007, you were convicted of shoplifting, a misdemeanor, in the General District Court of Rockingham, Virginia.
- 3. On or about June 11, 2008, you were convicted of petit larceny, a misdemeanor, in the General District Court of Rockingham, Virginia.
- 4. On or about September 8, 2009, you were convicted of grand larceny, a felony, in the Circuit Court of Staunton, Virginia.

The burden rests on you, as the applicant, to demonstrate that you meet the requirements of § 54.1-3029 of the Code.

After consideration of all information, the committee may:

- 1. Approve your application for certification by examination; or
- 2. Recommend to the Board that your application be approved with a reprimand, a monetary penalty, or terms and conditions, which may include placing you on probation; or
 - 3. Recommend to the Board that your application be denied; or
 - 4. Refer the matter to a formal hearing of the Board.

The recommendation of the committee will be presented to a quorum of the Board. The Board may accept or modify the recommendation, or reject the recommendation and move the case to a formal hearing. If you do not agree with the decision of the Board, you may request a formal administrative hearing before the Board.

Please advise the Board of your intention to be present at the informal conference. This can be done by calling our offices at (804) 367-4515 or sending us a letter at the address listed above.

You have a right to the information that will be relied on by the committee in making a decision. Therefore, I enclose a copy of the documents that will be distributed to the committee and will be considered when discussing the allegations with you and when deliberating upon your case. These documents are enclosed only with the original notice sent by certified mail and must be claimed at the post office.

To facilitate this proceeding, you should submit five copies of any documents you wish the committee to consider to the Board of Nursing, Perimeter Center, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite 300, Henrico, Virginia 23233, by June 9, 2014. Your documents may not be submitted by facsimile or e-mail.
