AMENDED NOTICE OF HEARING

of a panel of the Board of Nursing. The hearing will be held on May 19, 2014, at 10:00 a.m., at the offices

of the Department of Health Professions, Board of Nursing, Perimeter Center, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite

201, Henrico, Virginia 23233, at which time Ms. Evans will be afforded the opportunity to be heard in

person or by counsel.

At the hearing, Ms. Evans has the following rights, among others: the right to representation by

counsel; the right to have witnesses subpoenaed and to present witnesses on her behalf; the right to present

documentary evidence; and the right to cross-examine adverse witnesses. If Ms. Evans desires any witnesses

to appear on her behalf, she must notify the Director of Administrative Proceedings, Department of Health

Professions, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite 300, Henrico, Virginia 23233, in accordance with the Instructions

for Requesting Subpoenas.

The purpose of the hearing is to inquire into evidence that Ms. Evans may have violated certain laws

governing professional nursing practice in Virginia, as more fully set forth in the Statement of Particulars

below.

## STATEMENT OF PARTICULARS

The Board alleges that Dorothy M. Evans, R.N., may be in violation of § 54.1-3007(6) of the Code in that she may be unable to safely practice professional nursing due to mental illness, as evidenced by Ms. Evans' involuntary admission to Eastern State Hospital, Williamsburg, Virginia, on or about October 1, 2013, pursuant to a court order on the grounds that Ms. Evans was incompetent to stand trial for criminal charges and her diagnosis of "Bipolar Disorder, Manic, severe with psychotic features."
