documentary evidence; and the right to cross-examine adverse witnesses. If Ms. Smith desires any witnesses

## **STATEMENT OF PARTICULARS**

The Board alleges that Tanya C. Smith, R.N., may have violated § 54.1-3007(2), (5) and (6) of the Code and 18 VAC 90-20-300(A)(2)(c) and (e) of the Regulations Governing the Practice of Nursing in that between or about June 2012, and March 2013, during the course of her employment with Sentara Virginia Beach General Hospital, Virginia Beach, Virginia, Ms. Smith diverted Benadryl from patient supplies and controlled substances that had been wasted, which she self-administered, both while on-duty and off-duty.
