ORDER

The Virginia Board of Nursing ("Board") adopts the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law affecting the license of Cornelia Corbett, R.N., to practice as a professional nurse in Virginia.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Cornelia Corbett, R.N., was issued License No. 0001-133715 to practice as a professional nurse by the Virginia Board of Nursing on September 15, 1993. Said license is set to expire on January 31, 2016. Ms. Corbett's primary state of residence is Virginia.
2. By an Order of the Board entered on August 5, 2009 ("Board's Order"), the Board placed Ms. Corbett on indefinite probation with terms and conditions. This action was due to findings that during the course of her employment with Tuckahoe Orthopedics Associates, Ltd., Richmond, Virginia, Ms. Corbett fraudulently called in or wrote prescriptions for various Schedule II-VI medications for family members and a co-worker, using the name of a physician in the practice as the prescriber, and that she also diverted sample medication from the practice for her own personal and unauthorized use and for use by family members.
3. By letter dated June 30, 2012, Ms. Corbett submitted a request for release from indefinite probation.
4. Ms. Corbett has substantially complied with the terms and conditions of the Board's Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. This matter is properly before the Board.
2. Cornelia Corbett, R.N., has demonstrated satisfactory evidence to warrant release from probation.

ORDER

WHEREFORE, it is hereby ORDERED that the petition of Cornelia Corbett, R.N., for release from probation is hereby GRANTED and Ms. Corbett shall be issued an unrestricted license to practice professional nursing.

Ms. Corbett shall maintain a course of conduct in her capacity as a professional nurse commensurate with the requirements of § 54.1-3000 *et seq.* of the Code and the Regulations Governing the Practice of Nursing.

Pursuant to §§ 2.2-4023 and 54.1-2400.2 of the Code, the signed original of this Order shall remain in the custody of the Department of Health Professions as public record and shall be made available for public inspection or copying upon request.
