NOTICE OF HEARING

Pursuant to §§ 2.2-4020, 2.2-4024(F), and 54.1-2400(11) of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended

("Code"), Robyn L. Saavedra, R.N., who, prior to its suspension by the Board of Nursing on December 13,

2013, held License No. 0001-158045 to practice professional nursing in Virginia, is hereby given notice that

a formal administrative hearing will be held in the presence of a panel of the Board of Nursing. The hearing

will be held on March 17, 2014, at 2:00 p.m., at the offices of the Department of Health Professions, Board

of Nursing, Perimeter Center, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite 201, Henrico, Virginia 23233, at which time Ms.

Saavedra will be afforded the opportunity to be heard in person or by counsel.

At the hearing, Ms. Saavedra has the following rights, among others: the right to representation by

counsel; the right to have witnesses subpoenaed and to present witnesses on her behalf; the right to present

documentary evidence; and the right to cross-examine adverse witnesses. If Ms. Saavedra desires any

witnesses to appear on her behalf, she must notify the Director of Administrative Proceedings, Department of

Health Professions, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite 300, Henrico, Virginia 23233, in accordance with the

Instructions for Requesting Subpoenas.

The purpose of the hearing is to inquire into evidence that Robyn L. Saavedra, R.N., may have

violated certain terms and conditions imposed on her as set forth in the Order of the Board entered on

November 23, 2010, and to inquire into evidence that Ms. Saavedra may have violated certain laws

governing professional nursing practice in Virginia, as more fully set forth in the Statement of Particulars

below.

STATEMENT OF PARTICULARS

The Board alleges that Robyn L. Saavedra, R.N., may have violated Term No. 2 of the Order entered November 23, 2010, which required her to comply with all terms and conditions of the Health Practitioners' Monitoring Program ("HPMP"), and § 54.1-3007(6) of the Code in that, on or about November 18, 2013, Ms. Saavedra was dismissed from the HPMP for failing to comply with the toxicology screening program as evidenced by her failure to call the drug screen test line on nine occasions between September 13, 2011 and September 30, 2013.
