NOTICE OF HEARING

Pursuant to §§ 2.2-4020, 2.2-4024(F), and 54.1-2400(11) of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended (“Code”), Kimberly M. Mawyer, R.N., who prior to its suspension by the Board of Nursing on October 16, 2013, held License No. 0001-144900 to practice professional nursing in Virginia, is hereby given notice that a formal administrative hearing will be held in the presence of a panel of the Board of Nursing. The hearing will be held on January 27, 2014, at 11:00 a.m., at the offices of the Department of Health Professions, Board of Nursing, Perimeter Center, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite 201, Henrico, Virginia 23233, at which time Ms. Mawyer will be afforded the opportunity to be heard in person or by counsel.


At the hearing, Ms. Mawyer has the following rights, among others: the right to representation by counsel; the right to have witnesses subpoenaed and to present witnesses on her behalf; the right to present documentary evidence; and the right to cross-examine adverse witnesses. If Ms. Mawyer desires any witnesses to appear on her behalf, she must notify the Director of Administrative Proceedings, Department of Health Professions, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite 300, Henrico, Virginia 23233, in accordance with the Instructions for Requesting Subpoenas.

The purpose of the hearing is to inquire into evidence that Kimberly M. Mawyer, R.N., may have violated certain terms and conditions imposed on her as set forth in the Order of the Board (“Board Order”) entered on May 5, 2011, and certain laws governing the practice of nursing, as more fully set forth in the Statement of Particulars below.

STATEMENT OF PARTICULARS

The Board alleges that Kimberly M. Mawyer, R.N., may have violated § 54.1-3007(6) of the Code and Term No. 3 of the Board Order entered May 5, 2011, that required her to comply with all terms of the Health Practitioners' Monitoring Program ("HPMP") in that, on or about September 20, 2013, Ms. Mawyer was dismissed from the HPMP for noncompliance due to her continued use of alcohol, her failure to obtain a multi-day evaluation as recommended, and her failure to comply with the toxicology screening program.
