NOTICE OF HEARING

STATEMENT OF PARTICULARS

The Board alleges that Victoria Mann, R.N., may have violated Term No. 5(a) of the Board's Order, which required her to comply with all terms and conditions of the Health Practitioners' Monitoring Program ("HPMP") for the period specified in that on or about December 30, 2013, she was dismissed from the HPMP for noncompliance, including falsifying work site monitor reports, failing to notify HPMP of a prescription for a depressant medication, and failing to comply with treatment recommendations.
