NOTICE OF HEARING

Pursuant to §§ 2.2-4020, 2.2-4024(F), and 54.1-2400(11) of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended ("Code"), Bernard T. Kamgang, who, prior to its mandatory suspension by Order of the Department of Health Professions, on September 26, 2009, held Certificate No. 1401-133505 to practice as a nurse aide in Virginia, is hereby given notice that a formal administrative hearing will be held in the presence of a panel of the Board of Nursing. The hearing will be held on November 18, 2013, at 9:30 a.m., at the offices of the Department of Health Professions, Board of Nursing, Perimeter Center, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite 201, Henrico, Virginia 23233, at which time Mr. Kamgang will be afforded the opportunity to be heard in person or by counsel.

At the hearing, Mr. Kamgang has the following rights, among others: the right to representation by counsel; the right to have witnesses subpoenaed and to present witnesses on his behalf; the right to present documentary evidence; and the right to cross-examine adverse witnesses. If Mr. Kamgang desires any witnesses to appear on his behalf, he must notify the Director of Administrative Proceedings, Department of Health Professions, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite 300, Henrico, Virginia 23233, in accordance with the Instructions for Requesting Subpoenas.

The purpose of the hearing is to receive and act upon Mr. Kamgang's application for reinstatement of his certificate to practice as a nurse aide in Virginia, and to inquire into evidence that Mr. Kamgang may have violated certain laws governing nurse aide practice in Virginia, as more fully set forth in the Statement of Particulars below.

The burden rests upon Mr. Kamgang, as the petitioner to demonstrate that he is capable of resuming the safe and competent practice as a nurse aide in Virginia.

Pursuant to § 54.1-2409 of the Code, reinstatement of Mr. Kamgang's certificate requires the affirmative vote of three-fourths of the members of the Board in attendance at the hearing.

STATEMENT OF PARTICULARS

The Board alleges that Bernard T. Kamgang, C.N.A., may have violated § 54.1-3007(4) of the Code in that on or about June 19, 2012, he was convicted of felony hit and run in the Circuit Court of the County of Chesterfield, Virginia. This conviction formed the basis of the mandatory suspension of his nurse aide certificate.
