NOTICE OF HEARING

Pursuant to §§ 2.2-4020, 2.2-4024(F), and 54.1-2400(11) of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended (“Code”), Amy N. Aliff, R.N., who prior to its suspension by the Board of Nursing on August 23, 2013, held License No. 0001-207150 to practice professional nursing in Virginia, is hereby given notice that a formal administrative hearing will be held in the presence of a panel of the Board of Nursing. The hearing will be held on November 18, 2013, at 2:00 p.m., at the offices of the Department of Health Professions, Board of Nursing, Perimeter Center, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite 201, Henrico, Virginia 23233, at which time Ms. Aliff will be afforded the opportunity to be heard in person or by counsel.


At the hearing, Ms. Aliff has the following rights, among others: the right to representation by counsel; the right to have witnesses subpoenaed and to present witnesses on her behalf; the right to present documentary evidence; and the right to cross-examine adverse witnesses. If Ms. Aliff desires any witnesses to appear on her behalf, she must notify the Director of Administrative Proceedings, Department of Health Professions, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite 300, Henrico, Virginia 23233, in accordance with the Instructions for Requesting Subpoenas.

The purpose of the hearing is to inquire into evidence that Amy N. Aliff, R.N., may have violated certain terms and conditions imposed on her as set forth in the Consent Order of the Board (“Board Order”) entered on May 21, 2013, as more fully set forth in the Statement of Particulars below.

STATEMENT OF PARTICULARS

The Board alleges that Amy N. Aliff, R.N., may have violated Term No. 5 of the Board Order entered May 21, 2013, that required her to comply with all terms of the Health Practitioners' Monitoring Program ("HPMP") in that, on or about July 19, 2013, Ms. Aliff was dismissed from the HPMP for noncompliance due to her continued use of unapproved over-the-counter and prescribed medications, her continued use of alcohol and drugs, and her failure to comply with the urine toxicology screening program.
