NOTICE OF HEARING

Pursuant to §§ 2.2-4020, 2.2-4024(F), and 54.1-2400(11) of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended (“Code”), Ann-Mary Nadeau, R.N., who, prior to its suspension by the Board of Nursing on October 31, 2012, held License No. 0001-142847 to practice professional nursing in Virginia, is hereby given notice that a formal administrative hearing will be held in the presence of a panel of the Board of Nursing. The hearing will be held on July 15, 2013, at 2:00 p.m., at the offices of the Department of Health Professions, Board of Nursing, Perimeter Center, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite 201, Henrico, Virginia 23233, at which time Ms. Nadeau will be afforded the opportunity to be heard in person or by counsel.

At the hearing, Ms. Nadeau has the following rights, among others: the right to representation by counsel; the right to have witnesses subpoenaed and to present witnesses on her behalf; the right to present documentary evidence; and the right to cross-examine adverse witnesses. If Ms. Nadeau desires any witnesses to appear on her behalf, she must notify the Director of Administrative Proceedings, Department of Health Professions, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite 300, Henrico, Virginia 23233, in accordance with the Instructions for Requesting Subpoenas.


The purpose of the hearing is to inquire into evidence that Ann-Mary Nadeau, R.N., may have violated certain terms and conditions imposed on her as set forth in the Consent Order of the Board (“Board Order”) entered on July 20, 2010, as more fully set forth in the Statement of Particulars below.

STATEMENT OF PARTICULARS

The Board alleges that Ann-Mary Nadeau, R.N., may have violated Term No. 6 of the Board Order entered July 20, 2010, that required her to comply with all terms of the Health Practitioners' Monitoring Program ("HPMP") in that, on or about October 19, 2012, Ms. Nadeau was dismissed from the HPMP due to noncompliance. Specifically:

1. A prescription monitoring report conducted on or about May 11, 2012, revealed that Ms. Nadeau failed to submit physician reports for five controlled substances.
2. On or about July 23, 2012, Ms. Nadeau tested positive for morphine, for which she did not have a valid prescription.
3. Ms. Nadeau failed to comply with the recommendation to enter residential treatment.
