CONSENT ORDER

The Virginia Board of Nursing ("Board") and Michelle Lynne Overton Manwarren, R.M.A., as evidenced by her signature hereto, enter into the following Consent Order affecting Ms. Manwarren's registration to practice as a medication aide in Virginia.

The Board adopts the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Michelle Lynne Overton Manwarren, R.M.A., was issued Registration No. 0031-005247 to practice as a medication aide by the Virginia Board of Nursing on August 15, 2011. Said registration is set to expire on March 31, 2014.
- 2. On March 29, 2013, when Ms. Manwarren renewed her medication aide registration, she failed to attest to the fact that she had completed her required continuing education.
- 3. When contacted by the Board, she stated that she no longer wished to hold a medication aide registration.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Finding of Fact No. 2 constitutes a violation of 18 VAC 90-60-100(B)(1) of the Regulations Governing the Registration of Medication Aides.

CONSENT

Michelle Lynne Overton Manwarren, R.M.A., by affixing her signature hereon, agrees to the following:

- 1. She has been advised to seek advice of counsel prior to signing this document;
- 2. She acknowledges that without her consent, no legal action can be taken against her except pursuant to the Virginia Administrative Process Act, § 2.2-4000(A) et seq. of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended ("Code");
- 3. She acknowledges that she has the following rights, among others: the right to an informal fact finding conference before the Board, the right to reasonable notice of said hearing, the right to representation by counsel, and the right to cross-examine witnesses against her;
 - 4. She waives all such right to an informal conference;
- 5. She admits to the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law contained herein and waives her right to contest such Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law in any subsequent proceeding before the Board;
- 6. She consents to the entry of the following Order affecting her right to practice as a medication aide in Virginia.

ORDER

WHEREFORE, on the basis of the foregoing, the Virginia Board of Nursing, effective upon entry of this Order, and in lieu of further proceedings, hereby ORDERS as follows:

- 1. The Board ACCEPTS the VOLUNTARY SURRENDER for INDEFINITE SUSPENSION of Michelle Lynne Overton Manwarren's registration to practice as a medication aide in the Commonwealth of Virginia.
 - 2. The registration will be recorded as suspended and no longer current.
- 3. At such time as Ms. Manwarren shall petition the Board for reinstatement of her registration, an administrative proceeding will be convened to determine whether she is capable of resuming the safe and competent practice as a medication aide. Ms. Manwarren shall be responsible for any fees that may be

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required for the reinstatement and renewal of the registration prior to issuance of the registration to resume practice.

Pursuant to §§ 2.2-4023 and 54.1-2400.2 of the Code, the signed original of this Order shall remain in the custody of the Department of Health Professions as public record and shall be made available for public inspection or copying upon request.
