and Conclusions of Law of the Agency Subordinate and ADOPTS the Recommended Order in its entirety.

Pursuant to Virginia Code § 54.1-2400.2, the signed original of this Order shall remain in the custody of

the Department of Health Professions as a public record, and shall be made available for public inspection and

copying upon request.

Pursuant to Virginia Code § 54.1-2400.2(K), the Board considered whether to disclose or not disclose

Ms. Sloan's health records or health services.

Since Ms. Sloan failed to appear at the informal conference, this Order shall be considered final. Ms.

Sloan has the right to appeal this Order directly to the appropriate Virginia circuit court. As provided by Rule

2A:2 of the Supreme Court of Virginia, Ms. Sloan has thirty days from the date of service (the date she actually

received this decision or the date it was mailed to her, whichever occurred first) within which to appeal this

decision by filing a Notice of Appeal with Jay Douglas, M.S.M, R.N., C.S.A.C., F.R.E., Executive Director,

Board of Nursing, at Perimeter Center, 9960 Mayland Drive, Suite 300, Richmond, Virginia 23233. In the event

that this decision is served by mail, three days are added to that period.

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REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION OF AGENCY SUBORDINATE

Jurisdiction and Procedural History

Pursuant to Virginia Code §§ 2.2-4019 and 54.1-2400(10), Jane Elliott, R.N., Ph.D., serving as

Agency Subordinate of the Virginia Board of Nursing ("Board"), held an informal conference on June

15, 2017 in Henrico County, Virginia, to inquire into evidence that Carlotta Jane Sloan, R.N., may

have violated certain laws and regulations governing the practice of professional nursing in the

Commonwealth of Virginia.

Ms. Sloan did not appear at this proceeding and was not represented by legal counsel.

Upon consideration of the evidence, the Agency Subordinate makes the following Findings of

Fact and Conclusions of Law and recommends that the Board adopt the following Order.

Notice

By letter dated May 17, 2017, the Board sent a Notice of Informal Conference ("Notice") to

Ms. Sloan notifying her that an informal conference would be held on June 15, 2017. The Notice was

sent by certified and first class mail to the legal address of record on file with the Board. According to

the USPS tracking website, notice of the certified mail package was left at Ms. Sloan's address of

record on May 20, 2017. The maximum hold time expired on June 5, 2017, and the unclaimed

package was returned to the Board office. The Notice sent by first class mail was not returned to the

Board office. Accordingly, the Agency Subordinate concluded that adequate notice was provided to

Ms. Sloan and the informal conference proceeded in her absence.

Recommended Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law

- 1. Carlotta Jane Sloan, R.N., was issued License Number 0001-172997 to practice professional nursing on February 13, 2001, which expired on June 30, 2016. At all times relevant to the findings herein, said license was in full force and effect. Her primary state of residence is Virginia.
- 2. On August 30, 2007, the Board entered an Order taking no action against Ms. Sloan contingent upon her continued compliance with the Health Practitioners' Monitoring Program ("HPMP") after making findings that she had forged a co-worker's initials regarding the witnessing of her alleged wasting of medication and that she had entered into the HPMP.
- 3. On May 20, 2009, the Board entered an Order indefinitely suspending Ms. Sloan's license to practice professional nursing after making a finding that she had been dismissed from the HPMP for noncompliance.
- 4. On May 31, 2013, the Board entered an Order reinstating Ms. Sloan's license contingent upon her continued compliance with the HPMP, which she had re-entered on January 9, 2013. Term No. 1 of this Order required Ms. Sloan to remain in compliance with the HPMP for the period specified by the HPMP.
- 5. Ms. Sloan violated Virginia Code § 54.1-3007(6) and Term No. 1 of the Order of the Board entered May 31, 2013, in that on July 15, 2016, she was dismissed from the HPMP for noncompliance, including failure to comply with the toxicology screening program.
- 6. Ms. Sloan violated Virginia Code § 54.1-3007(6) in that she is unsafe to practice professional nursing due to substance abuse, as evidenced by the following:
- a. Between January 2013 and June 2016, Ms. Sloan received outpatient treatment and counselling at Abingdon Center, Abingdon, Virginia, for diagnoses including opioid dependence and adjustment disorder with mixed anxiety and depressed mood.

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b. On April 29, 2014, April 10, 2015, and April 22, 2016, Ms. Sloan submitted

urine drug screens that were positive for tramadol (C-IV), for which she did not have a valid

prescription. Ms. Sloan admitted to taking her husband's prescribed tramadol before the 2014 and

2015 drug screens.

7. On September 23, 2016, Ms. Sloan told an investigator for the Department of Health

Professions that she did not intend to renew her license to practice professional nursing.

8. Pursuant to Virginia Code § 54.1-2400.2(K), the Board considered whether to disclose

or not disclose Ms. Sloan's health records or health services.

Recommended Order

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the Agency Subordinate

recommends that the Board issue an Order as follows:

1. Carlotta Jane Sloan, R.N., is REPRIMANDED.

2. The right of Carlotta Jane Sloan, R.N., to renew her license to practice professional

nursing in the Commonwealth of Virginia is INDEFINITELY SUSPENDED for a period of not less than

two years from date of entry of this Order.

This suspension applies to any multistate privilege to practice professional nursing.

4. Should Ms. Sloan seek reinstatement of her license, an administrative proceeding shall

be convened to consider such application. At such time, the burden shall be on Ms. Sloan to

demonstrate that she is safe and competent to return to the practice of professional nursing. Ms. Sloan

shall be responsible for any fees that may be required for the reinstatement and/or renewal of the

license prior to issuance of the license to resume practice.
